- 1/9 A former member of the Florida A and M University band, Dante Martin is scheduled to be sentenced today on felony hazing and manslaughter charges. Martin could get more than 20 years in prison for the 2011 death of drum major, Robert Champion.
- 1/12 George Zimmerman is free on bond. He was arrested over the weekend, charged with aggravated assault and domestic violence.
- 1/13 Three Florida lawmakers say they will push for a tougher law against texting and driving. Technically it's illegal, but police can't stop drivers unless they're pulled over first for another offense.
- 1/14 Zachary Benjamin, the 22 year old suspect in a deadly hit and run last month in Dania Beach is free on \$150,000 bond.
- 1/14 Miami police have identified a young man found dead a week ago in an alley, 19 year old Kenny Grayer. They're trying to find out who killed him.
- 1/26 A Miami Gardens man, James Hall, shot and killed in his own driveway in front of his girlfriend's 12 and 14 year old sons.
- 1/28 A panel of lawmakers in the Florida Senate moving towards sweeping change in the corrections department. The proposed change coming in the wake of: the suspicious deaths of inmates, cover ups and problems with medical care.
- 1/28 Aventura police say they opened fire on a suspected shoplifter as he sped away from the Target parking lot in Aventura. 29 year old Jimmy Daniels is in custody.
- 2/5 There will be extra security at Hialeah High School after a series of fights broke out yesterday. Some students tweeted the violence was gang related. There were no arrests.

- 2/6 A Southwest Ranches man, 42 year old Yosmany Nuznez sentenced to six years in federal prison. He admitted to helping orchestrate the biggest pharmaceutical heist in U.S. history.
- 2/9 One man is dead, a second co-operating and a Broward Sheriff's Deputy is injured. Police say the man drowned while trying to get away from deputies in Pompano Beach. The officer is expected to be ok.
- 2/11 A North Miami Beach man, Elton Bandoo, accused of trying to kill a police officer says he started shooting because he thought he was being robbed. Officer, Lino Diaz, is recuperating after undergoing surgery.
- 2/16 A Miami Gardens mother is asking for answers after her police shot and killed her son. Katherine Daniels says her son, Lavall Hall suffered with mental illness.
- 2/16 A Boynton Beach woman, 35 year old Jyrece Mcclendon is recovering after police say her ex-boyfriend Somari Walden shot her, then led police on a chase across three counties before killing himself.
- 2/17 Miami Gardens police issuing a statement offering condolences to 25 year old Lavall Hall's family and promising a full investigation. Hall, who was mentally disabled was shot and killed Sunday, February 15th.
- 2/19 "Vanilla Ice", real name, Robert Van Winkle arrested on a grand theft charge.
- 2/19 A 14 year old hit and run victim, Kelvron Flowers is spending his first full day at home since the December accident. His brother 8 year old Apollo Brown Jr. died. The suspect, 22 year old Zachary Benjamin is free on bond.
- 2/20 Tiniko Thompson, the woman accused of killing her boyfriend, Miami police officer, Carl Patrick will use the "Stand

- Your Ground" defense. Thompson will be back in court next month.
- 2/25 Lavall Hall's family and the Dream Defenders say there will be protests at Jazz in the Gardens if police don't release video from the night Hall was killed.
- 2/27 North Lauderdale homicide detectives are investigating a deadly shooting at SW 81st Avenue and 11th Street. Homeowner says he shot and killed a burglar.
- 3/3 Lavall Hall's family filing a \$20 million dollar wrongful death lawsuit against, Miami Gardens, the officers who shot and killed Hall and former Police chief, Stephen Johnson.
- 3 / 4 Miami police have recovered the vehicle carjacked from an Uber driver in Miami: 500 block of NE 23rd Street.
- 3/9 Miami Beach police investigating a double shooting overnight at 7th Street and Ocean Drive.
- 3/10 Miami homicide detectives are working a pre-dawn murder in Overtown. A woman shot in the head at NW 4th Avenue and 8th Street.
- 3/10 The Miami Beach police chief assuring residents and tourists the city is safe after a German tourist was pistol whipped and robbed near her hotel in the 3100 block of Collins Avenue.
- 3/10 The Broward Sheriff's Office is asking for help finding a missing Lauderdale Lakes woman: 71 year old Patricia Owens.
- 3/11 Former and current corrections employees testifying to a senate justice committee there is widespread corruption in Florida's prison system.
- 3/13 Investigators trying to figure out how two police units burned in the parking lot of an apartment complex in NE Miami Dade.

- 3/26 Nelson Osceloa is released from the Broward County jail on bond. He's charged with child neglect in the death of his three year old son.
- 3/30 Police are searching for the hit and run driver who struck and critically injured a Canadian tourist near the King of Diamonds, NE 5th avenue and 180th. Police are looking for a Navy 2010 BMW 335i.

2/6 The Mayor of Deerfield Beach, Jean Robb, being called a racist for pushing to move forward with plans to build a townhouse development on the site of a former Black cemetery; Deerfield Beach Memorial Cemetery".

2/6 Black girls are six times more likely than white girls to be suspended from school, that's the finding of a new report from Columbia University law school. It's titled, "Black Girls Matter: Pushed Out, Over Policed and Underprotected".

2/11 Local 355 (public employees) to speak at Miami City Commission meeting this week in favor of jobs for Overtown residents at the proposed Miami World Center.

- 2/19 The Hallandale Beach City Attorney, Lynn Whitfield accusing Commissioner, Keith London of trying to get her fired because she is Black and a woman. The Mayor has called for an investigation.
- 2/25 Comcast, Time Warner, the Reverend Al Sharpton, the NAACP and The Urban League sued for racial discrimination; the lawsuit alleges they discriminated against Black owned media in exchange for money Comcast, Time Warner and Sharpton deny the allegations. - 3/5 Deerfield Beach Mayor, Jean Robb announces she is boycotting the city's Black heritage and Women's History Month, banquet, Saturday, in part because one of the honorees is white.
- 3/9 A protest scheduled today at the University of Oklahoma after members of the fraternity, Sigma Alpha Episilon were seen on video singing a racist chant that included references to lynching.
- 3/9 Bill Duke to direct and executive produce the Mahlia Jackson story featuring 20 of her snogs including her first million seller, "Move on Up a Little Higher". It will be filmed in Chicago.
- 3/20 Residents at Liberty City apartment building no longer have to worry about their power being cut off. The city ordered the landlord to make necessary repairs and they are underway.
- 3/16 When Serena Williams takes the court at Indian Wells tonight it will be the first time in 14 years. Neither she nor her sister Venus have played since the crowd booed Serena after Venus pulled out of a match.

HEALTH/NEWSCASTS

1/12 There is a troubling stat to report about Florida hospitals. According to the CDC almost half are not doing what they need to control infections.

1/14 Swimmers warned to stay out of the water near Oleta River State Park. The Florida Department of Health issuing the advisory after almost a million and a half gallons of partially treated wastewater overflowed into the area.

1/15 The FDA approves a weight loss device. It's called the Maestro, tricks the brain into thinking a person is full. It must be surgically implanted.

- 1/16 The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says the flu has reached epidemic levels. Experts are urging people to take extra precautions to protect themselves because this year's flu vaccine is only 23 percent effective.
- 1/26 Eight South Florida hospitals are in trouble with the federal government. They'll be fined for what investigators say are the hospitals high rates of preventable injuries: everything from falls and infections to bed sores. The hospitals include: in Miami Dade: Kendall Regional, Baptist, Jackson Health System, North Shore Medical and Palmetto General. In Broward: North Broward, Broward Health in fort Lauderdale, and Coral Springs.
- 2/2 The Florida Department of Health is urging all Floridians to get vaccinations for the measles after four cases were reported in the state.
- 2/4 As early as next year the first baby with the genes of three parents could be born. Scientists believe the process will help prevent hereditary diseases.
- 2/9 Researchers say they've created a mobile test for HIV and syphilis. The device, called a 'dongle' is plugged into a cell phone and scientists say it delivers accurate results in 15 minutes.
- 2/16 Researchers believe it's more important than ever for diabetics to control hypertension. They say diabetics who lower their blood pressure also decrease the risk of a variety of complications from the disease.
- 2/25 Researchers now believe feeding peanut butter to infants less than a year old may actually keep them from becoming allergic. They say as a precaution it should be done first in a doctor's presence.
- 3/11 The Florida Department of Health confirming 5 cases of whooping cough in Broward County. It is a contagious bacterial infection; preventable with a vaccine and treatable with antibiotics.

3/16 Sunday is the first day of a special enrollment period for Obama care. It runs through April 30th. The special enrollment period the last opportunity to make sure you'll get a tax break next year.

3/18 Kraft is recalling six and a half million boxes of its Macaroni and Cheese. Metal has been found in some of the 7.25 ounce boxes. The box is marked with C2 on the side.

3/30 GNC is announcing tougher testing procedures. It's the biggest retailer of herbal supplements in the country. GNC and three others are accused of selling supplements that are bogus or contaminated.
