The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in: newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the 1st quarter of 2016.

CRIME NEWSCASTS

1/7 A suspended BSO Deputy, Peter Parazo maintains he is not guilty of manslaughter for the 2013 shooting death of Jermaine McBean in Oakland Park.

1/11 The FBI arrested, Jose Agupo, the Miami man who allegedly pulled off a Brinks robbery in Miami, New Year's Day. \$3.2 million dollars was stolen. Agupo, was taken into custody in San Diego.

1/12 28 year old Orlando Henderson arrested for allegedly trying to rape a woman in Northwest Fort Lauderdale.

1/12 A teenager shot and critically injured in Homestead over the Christmas break, Eric Watson, Jr. will be released from the hospital today. Police are still looking for the shooter.

1/13 Residents in a Pembroke Pines neighborhood can breathe a sigh of relief: NW 14th Street and 77th Way. A pre-dawn manhunt is over. Police have a suspect in custody.

1/15 Miami police now describing 15 year old Alder Hill's murder as an assassination. The teen was dragged off his bike into an empty lot at NW 10th Avenue and 69th Street and repeatedly shot, Saturday, Jan 9th.

1/15 The man and woman accused of robbing several Denny's restaurants by setting employees on fire have been arrested. According to police, the two say they did it to get money to support a drug habit.

1/19 A Miami Dade public service aide is one of the latest victims of a hit and run driver, struck and injured while investigating a traffic accident at SW 127th Avenue and 244th Street.

1/19 A rider in the “Bikes Up, Guns Down” ride through the streets of South Florida, 19 year old Karmari Gardner arrested

1/19 Palm Beach Commissioner, Priscilla Taylor is calling for a Citizens Review Board after a Palm Beach Sheriff’s Deputy shot and killed 19 year old Henry Bennet during what was supposed to be a routine traffic stop Saturday night.

1/20 A pair of brothers, Oscar and Jose Torres, arrested in an overnight raid in NW Miami Dade. They are accused of dealing drugs and running a fraudulent credit card operation.

1/25 The man police say ambushed a Miami Gardens police officer, David Mejir, defiant in bond court; accusing police of being dirty and accusing his public defender of working for the Ku Klux Klan.

2/1 Miami police are looking for the man they say murdered 33 year old Jackson Solis over a parking spot outside a Miami nightclub.

2/1 The FBI investigating Opa Locka Mayor, Myra Taylor and her husband, Bishop John Taylor for alleged corruption. They allegedly took 150-thousand dollars from the city’s sewer department to prop up a family business. The Mayor denies the allegation.

2/2 Jessica David, the defense attorney accused of having sex with her client at the main Broward County jail, no longer banned from the facility. She will be allowed to meet with Ysrael Granada, but only behind glass.

2/5 No criminal charges will be filed against the Miami Gardens officer who shot and killed a mentally ill man, Lavall Hall, last year.

2/10 A Jackson employee, Evelina Reid, is accused of stealing the personal information of almost 25,000 patients over the past 5 years. Jackson says it plans to put tougher security measures in place.

2/11 Police are looking for 19 year old Stanley Ragin, considered armed and dangerous. He allegedly opened fire on a rival in front of Carol City High School.

2/22 Miami Dade police are looking for the two shooters and the get-a-way driver wanted for killing 6 year old King Carter Saturday. (1/20)

2/24 Suspects are in custody for the murder of 6 year old King Carter. He was shot and killed in broad daylight last Saturday while he played outside his family's apartment in NW Miami Dade.

2/26 A 3rd suspect arrested for 6 year old King Carter's murder.

3/1 Bond denied for Stephanie Agustin. She and a relative are accused of kidnapping a cousin's 2 month old baby. The baby has been safely reunited with her mother.

3/2 Malachi Love Robinson, the West Palm Beach teen accused of posing as a doctor arrested again, charged with larceny and grand theft.

3/7 An NFL player with South Florida roots, Tre' Mason, arrested in Hollywood. He's charged with resisting arrest, possession of marijuana and reckless driving.

3/8 A major change to report in Florida's death penalty. Governor Scott has signed a new law into effect. It keeps judges from imposing the death penalty if the jury does not recommend it.

3/8 29 year old Lamont Mayweather is in the Broward County jail. He's accused of raping a 5 year old girl in a laundry room at a Pompano Beach apartment complex.

3/14 Miami Beach police are looking for the suspect who shot and killed 20 year old Antoinne Dodson. It happened about 1AM yesterday near the Clevelander Hotel at Ocean Drive and 11th.

3/16 Later today prosecutors are expected to formally arraign the two teenage suspects accused of killing 6 year old King Carter last

month. 18 year old Leonard Adams and 17 year old Irwen Pressely will be charged with second degree murder.

3/21 15 year old Tamar Teems will be arraigned today for 6 year old King Carter's murder.

3/22 Miami International Airport announcing authorities here are stepping up security as a result of the terrorist attacks this morning in Brussels.

3/23 A North Florida mother, a pro-gun activist could face criminal charges. Jamie Gilt's 4 year old son accidentally shot her in the back with a gun he found in the back seat of their car.

3/22 We now know the identity of the man killed in what BSO says started as a case of road rage: 27 year old William Alvarez.

3/28 One person is dead, another rushed to the hospital after a double shooting in North Lauderdale at the Lake View Cove apartments. The motive is unclear.

3/29 BSO working an active crime scene in Pembroke Park. A mother and her four young children were asleep when somebody shot up their apartment. They were not hurt.

3/29 Bond denied for Tamika Thompson, the Miami mother accused of hiding evidence in 6 year old King Carter's murder last month. She allegedly paid a man \$50 dollars to dispose of the get a way car used in the deadly shooting.

1/7 For the first time the Miami Dolphins have an African American General Manager. Chris Grier officially named to the job this week. He joined the Dolphins in 2000 and has served in various roles with the organization for the past 16 years.

1/25 The Little Haiti Cultural Complex is celebrating Black History Month with the opening of the exhibition, "Symbols of Freedom". It features symbols that helped inspire African slaves to liberate themselves.

2/17 Three Fort Lauderdale police officers, Jason Holding, James Wells and Christopher Sousa will be at City Hall this morning for an arbitration hearing trying to get the jobs back. They were fired last year for sending a series of racist texts: including ones that threatened to get drunk and kill N___s and one of President Barack Obama with gold teeth.

2/22 It'll be 30 days before a Fort Lauderdale police officer fired for sending racist text messages will find out if he'll get his job back. During an arbitration hearing Friday, Jason Wells testified the text messages were taken out of context.

2/22 Miami police Major, Delrish Moss says there will be enough police officers to provide security for Beyonce's upcoming concert at Marlins Park. Black officers are criticizing the head of the union, all but calling him a racist for threatening to have officers boycott Beyonce's performance.

3/21 The head of the Indian Wells tournament apologizing after making offensive comments. Raymond Moore said female tennis players are lucky, that they ride on the coat-tails of male players

and that if he was a lady player, he'd go down every night on his knees and thank God that Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal were born.

3/23 Legendary Black music is going into the Library of Congress, including Gloria Gaynor's "I Will Survive" and John Coltrane's "A Love Supreme".

3/25 It's been almost six months since Corey Jones was shot and killed by a plain clothes Palm Beach Gardens cop, Nouman Raja. Jones' family holding a news conference in front of the Palm Beach State Attorney's Office calling for the D.A. to file charges.

ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS

1/7 Miami Dade Mayor Carlos Gimenez is pushing a controversial plan to start a ferry service from Port Miami to Cuba.

1/11 At noon thousands of Florida teachers are scheduled to demonstrate on the steps of the capitol in Tallahassee. They will include two buses of Miami Dade teachers. Teachers say they are fed up with being overloaded with work and short changed on pay.

1/12 The home developer Lennar spending \$74 million dollars for 142 acres in Miami Lakes. The Commission has approved a development for 505 homes that would be called 'Royal Gardens Estate'.

2/2 Governor Rick Scott and the Seminole Tribe of Florida showing off a proposed 1.8 billion dollar expansion plan for its casinos in Hollywood and Tampa, part of a push to get state lawmakers to approve a new gaming deal with the state.

2/11 The Miami International Boat Show starts today, in a temporary facility built just for the show, a marina on Virginia Key. More than 100 thousand people are expected to attend.

2/24 A Delray Beach Mazda dealership is suing 16 year old Malachai Love-Robinson, the teen accused of posing as a doctor. They say he wrote a bogus check for a down payment on a Mazda 6 and that it bounced after he took possession of the car.

3/7 Florida lawmakers have until tomorrow to create a state budget. Over the weekend they agreed to spend \$700 million dollars to build facilities at state schools: including two projects at FIU, a student affairs building at Florida Memorial University and a Black student union building at Florida State.

3/9 Florida lawmakers are waiting on Governor Rick Scott to approve a bill that calls for spending a million and a half dollars to properly bury bodies on the grounds of the notorious Dozier School for Boys. It shut down in 2011.

3/9 Miami Dade Commissioners have approved spending a million dollars a year for up to 1,500 body cameras. The first wave is expected to be in use by September.

3/22 Carnival cruise lines will start sailing from Miami to Cuba in May.

3/25 Major League Soccer a step closer to reality in Miami. David Beckham's investment group has purchased land for a stadium. Miami Dade Commissioners will have the final say. There are concerns about a lack of parking and the potential impact on Overtown residents.

2/26 Florida’s presidential primary is March 15th. Early voting begins Monday in Miami Dade County. It starts March 5th in Broward.

3/2 Clinton, Rubio and Trump waking up in South Florida. They are now campaigning here in earnest. Florida's primary is Tuesday, March 15th.

3/16 Marco Rubio suspends his campaign after losing his home state.

3/16 Hillary Clinton wins Florida.

3/23 Former Florida Governor, Jeb Bush is endorsing Ted Cruz and calling on the Republican party to "overcome the divisiveness and vulgarity of Trump.

1/12 Children's liquid cold medicine recalled because of concerns about a potential risk of overdose. They are sold under 9 store brand names, including Dollar General and CVS.

1/20 The Florida Department of Health confirming 3 cases of the dangerous mosquito borne Zika virus, including two in Miami Dade. The CDC is warning pregnant women and those who want to get pregnant to avoid travel to South America and parts of the Caribbean.

2/4 Governor Rick Scott is trying to be pro-active in stopping the spread of the mosquito born Zika virus. He's declared it a public health emergency in Miami Dade and 3 other Florida counties: Lee, Hillsborough and Santa Rosa. 9 cases have been confirmed in Florida. Those patients travelled to countries already affected by the outbreak. Zika has been linked to birth defects in children and paralysis in adults.

2/16 Another case of the Zika virus confirmed in Broward. That brings the total number of cases in Florida to 21, 7 of those are in Miami. They're all travel related.

3/22 BumbleBee issuing another recall of chunk light tuna because of concerns about the sterilization process.

3/22 Researchers finding a new way to help kick a junk food habit. Scientists say when it's quiet you are more aware of your chewing and swallowing sounds making you more likely to eat less. It's called the "Crunch Effect".
