Daily: 6 Locally Produced Newscasts; a minimum of one minute, forty five seconds

Each day WHQT airs 6 locally produced newscasts. They are a minimum of one minute and forty five seconds in duration. The newscasts often include community events and public service announcements. These newscasts air Monday through Friday between 6 and 10AM. In addition to news, weather and traffic information are provided every half hour and more often when conditions warrant.

Daily: Locally Produced PSAs are one minute and forty five seconds. In addition to our newscasts, WHQT also provides extensive community service through locally produced PSAs. A minimum of 3 air each day during AM drive. These local public service interviews are dedicated to continuously keeping the community aware of the various programs, services and free events available in the Miami/Fort Lauderdale market.

Weekly: Locally Produced Public Affairs Program, "What's Hot?" 2 Hours WHQT produces a local two hour public affairs broadcast: "Hot Talk with Chief Jimmie Brown." It airs Sundays at 11PM.

CRIME/NEWSCASTS

- 1/8 Miami police are trying to figure out who shot and killed a pregnant woman, right in front of her house 1200 block of NW 53rd Street.
- 1/10 Police are trying to find the hit and run driver who struck and killed a six year old boy at Miramar Parkway and 62nd Avenue.
- 1/11/ Hallandale Beach police are investigating a double murder suicide. An elderly couple found murdered in their town home in the Three Islands neighborhood.
- 1/11 New Broward Sheriff, Scott Israel suspends two members of the force currently under criminal investigation.
- 1/14 Calvin Melvin and Brittney Sierra remain locked up on child neglect charges while authorities try to figure out if the two played a role in the murder of their son. No one has seen the two old in a year and a half.
- 2/4 Police are looking for a suspect and a motive after an overnight shooting in Brownsville, 4100 block of NW 42nd Court.
- 2/4 Miami Gardens police are trying to find out who is responsible for a deadly drive by shooting in Miami Gardens; 204th Street and 23rd Court. Brandon Bryant was killed. His father and older brother injured.
- 2/4 Former Broward Sheriff Maudy Hernandez arrested on domestic violence charges. He is accused of trying to strangle his wife.
- 2/5 A hearing is scheduled today for George Zimmerman. His attorneys are trying to get the trial delayed. They argue they can not get ready in time for the scheduled start date, June 10th.
- 2/5 North Miami police are searching for two young brothers after their mother says they were kidnapped by a family friend.
- 2/26 One person is hospitalized, one person in custody after a shooting at 5AM this morning in Deerfield Beach 100 block of SE 3rd Court.
- 3/5 Police are looking for 29 year old Joseph Swift. They say he's responsible for a bloodbath Sunday night in Miami. He's accused of killing his ex-girlfriend's mother and brother.

- 3/11 A Miami man, Joel Domingez, is accused of killing his 17 year old girlfriend, Genesis Foseca.
- 3/12 Two suspects are in custody after one of them started shooting inside a neighborhood bar in Miami Beach, Finnegan's on Lincoln road.
- 3/12 One of the suspects in the FAMU hazing case is expected to plead guilty as early as next month. Prosecutors have not promised Caleb Jackson a deal, but his lawyer is hoping they'll be lenient when it's time for sentencing.
- 3/13 Investigators looking into a deadly police involved shooting at SW 162nd Avenue between 72nd and 80th Streets. Police say they were forced to shoot a man after he jumped into their cruiser and tried to run them over.
- 3/15 Bond denied for Paul Day, charged with murder after the death of his son. Prosecutors allege he shook his young son 3 years ago, and the child never regained consciousness. The baby died this past December.
- 3/20 Two burglary suspects arrested in Miami Gardens, the search is on for a third after leading police on a high speed chase through two counties.
- 3/21 Residents in a section of Miami Beach are waking up to a major police presence after shots were fired. A suspect is barricaded inside a house in an area known as Normandy Beach, near North Bay Drive.
- 3/22 Former Miami Dolphin Mark Duper is out of jail. Jacksonville police say he attacked his 17 year old son.
- 3/22 The 19 year old woman who drove her SUV into a crowd in Pompano Beach earlier this week is now charged with attempted murder. BSO Deputies say Sharoya Rucker was trying to kill a woman she'd been arguing with.
- 3/26 Three murder and robbery suspects who've been on the run since January are now in jail: Adalberto Montalvo, Quinton Sylvestrie and Samuel Walker. They allegedly killed a bartender during the robbery of Josephine's restaurant in Boca Raton.
- 3/26 Former Miami police Sergeant Raul Iglesisas sentenced to four years in federal prison. He was convicted of stealing drugs from dealers, planting cocaine on suspects and lying to federal agents.
- 3/27 Miami Dade police are trying to find the suspect or suspects who shot and killed a man overnight, right in front of his house: 500 block of NW 96th Street.

3/27 The Broward Sheriff's Office is trying to identify and find out more about human remains, including a skull, found in Oakland Park near the railroad tracks at NE 56th Street and Dixie Highway.

3/28 A homeowner allegedly shot and killed a burglar overnight in NW Miami Dade, 121st Street, just west of 18th Avenue.
