"This report summarizes a representative sample of programming that provided the most significant treatment of community issues for the period between July 1st, 2020 to September 30th, 2020. As a result of the pandemic and because of the massive surge in cases during this quarter WHQT focused its news and public service announcements almost exclusively on COVID 19.

Description of Regular Programming:

HOT 105 NEWS (PSA's WITHIN NEWSCASTS) Monday – Friday between 6 and 10AM at :35 and :55 after the hour. The 8 broadcasts are produced by HOT 105 News Anchor Traci Cloyd and last a total of 1:45 seconds each. PSA's are included within some newscasts. The PSA's are :30 seconds.

"HOT 105 Cares with Rodney Baltimore" 1:45 seconds Monday-Friday between 6 and 10AM. They air at :45 after the hour. The locally produced public service announcements are broadcast once an hour, Monday through Friday, during morning drive. On average they total 15:30 seconds each week. They are produced and hosted by WHQT Morning Show, Executive Producer and host, Rodney Baltimore.

July 3rd

Some people are taking unusual steps to avoid wearing a mask, carrying a fake card that says they're protected by the Americans With Disabilities Act and are not required to wear a mask. The Justice Department says the cards are not legitimate and people using them could face penalties. Violating the ADA penalty could result in a fine up to \$150,000. **6:35AM and 7:35AM**

Some Palm Beach County residents taking their fight against masks to court. They're suing the county for the right NOT to wear a mask. **9:35AM**

As a result of the Coronavirus we are all using a lot more technology. Parents are encouraged to talk to their children about good cyber security habits --- including using strong wi-fi connections to avoid hacking and unique passwords for every account. **8:35AM**

If you have a child in public school in Miami Dade you should know you have until July 10th, a week from tomorrow, to make a decision on one of four reopening plans JUST approved by the school board. The options include having kids return to school full time, along with some hybrid models. There will be plexiglass for teachers and everybody will be required to wear masks. In some cases social distancing will not be possible. **7:35 and 9:55AM**

Lap dances no longer allowed at strip clubs in Miami Dade County --- officially banned at midnight, by emergency order. Mayor Carlos Gimenez said he just found out rules put in place to help prevent the spread of the virus technically allowed strippers to keep providing the service. **9:35AM**

July 5th

Black and Latino people are at twice as likely as White people to die from the Coronavirus that's according to the New York Times who sued the CDC to get the records with that data. The Times finding Black and Latino people are twice as likely to die from the virus no matter WHERE they live. A popular theory is that minorities are more likely to contract and die from COVID-19 because they have underlying health conditions. Critics of that theory believe minorities are more likely to die because many have limited to no access to quality healthcare --- and when they do seek treatment their illness is already more advanced. **7:35, 8:35AM**

Representative Shervin Jones continues to recover after being diagnosed with the Coronavirus. Jones sharing his story, with updates every day on Facebook. A lot of people don't believe the virus is real – and they're behaving like it's not. Jones hopes sharing his story will help put a face on COVID 19, a face people can relate to --- a young black man with the virus. **7:55, 8:55AM**

Florida experiencing a DRAMATIC increase in cases, more than 11-thousand cases reported Saturday alone --- a one day record on top of several other record days last week with more than 10-thousand cases reported. There are now more than 200-thousand confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the state. 40,000 of them are in Miami Dade County. **6:55, 7:35,9:35AM**

South Florida hospitals are feeling the impact of the pandemic. The number of beds is already starting to become limited because of the increase in Coronavirus cases. Most hospitals have not reached capacity --- but many are decreasing elective surgeries to make sure they have the capacity to treat Coronavirus patients. **7:35, 8:35, 8:55AM**

Florida reaching a grim milestone in the fight against COVID-19. The state reporting more than 200,000 cases. 11, 458 cases reported Saturday alone --- that's on top of several days during the past week when 10,000 cases a day were reported. For the past couple of weeks experts have expressed major concern Florida could become the next epi-center for Coronavirus cases. There are a number of places to get tested. Hard Rock Stadium is one of the largest --- open to every age, with or without symptoms – 9AM to 5PM drive through only, every day. 7:35, 8:35, 9:35AM

An 11 year old Miami Dade boy has lost his fight with the Coronavirus, making him the youngest confirmed death in the state. The child identified by his family as Daequan Wimberly. More than 7,000 children, in Florida, under 18 are infected with the virus. **6:35, 8:35AM**

Florida is making national news – and it's not good --- the state ONCE again setting a one day record for Coronavirus cases, more than 11,000 cases reported in a single day. There are now more than 200,000 cases in the state. **8:35, 8:55AM**

If the number of Coronavirus cases keeps surging we may be left with no choice but another shut down. That's the word from Miami Dade County Mayor, Carlos Gimenez. He says not only should masks be seen as a quote, "symbol of respect", but also the key to preventing another shutdown. Masks are required in Miami Dade and Broward Counties. **7:35,8:35**,**8:55AM**

The curfew in Miami Dade County is back. It starts at 10 o'clock tonight. 10AM to 6PM, in effect until further notice: only essential workers approved to be on the streets during those hours. Casinos, bowling alleys, movie theatres and strip clubs will have to close again in Miami Dade County until further notice --- the shut down ordered by the mayor to help stem the massive surge in cases. A reminder beaches are closed for the holiday weekend, all part of the effort to deal with a dramatic increase in cases. **7:35AM**

Despite the fact a lot of us know people who have the virus, some of us even know people who've died from COVID-19, some people still don't think it's real --- they're having house parties and going on about their daily affairs as if we are not in the middle of a pandemic. Experts are all but begging you to take all the necessary precautions --- pretty simple - and right now that's all we have; washing your hands frequently, staying at least six feet away from other people and wearing a mask. 7:35, 8:55AM

Miami cracking down on businesses that don't follow the rules put in place to slow the spread of the Coronavirus. Violating any one of the rules can get a business shut down for 10 to 30 days --- business owners who don't shut down could be arrested. **7:35,8:35,8:55AM**

A spike in Coronavirus cases leading some local hospitals to cut back on elective surgeries. The surge in cases continues in Florida, more than 6,500 cases reported yesterday, on top of other record spikes in the past week. Florida's Education Commissioner ordering all public schools to open next month, five days a week, but if local health departments don't think it's safe they will make the final decision. **7:35,8:35AM**

Last week the Miami Dade School Board announced a fairly complicated plan that provided a number of choices. HOT 105 will make sure you know exactly how both districts are proceeding in the wake of this order from the state's Education Commissioner. **7:35, 8:55AM**

Florida is making national news for a major increase in Coronavirus cases. It took four months to register 100,000 cases, in the last two weeks that number doubled to 200,000. **7:35AM**, **8:35AM**

Later today we're expected to learn if Broward County will close some businesses again in the wake of the recent surge in Coronavirus cases. Miami Dade already announced it's going to close restaurants, except for takeout. Gyms, banquet facilities and party venues also ordered to close. Florida is making national news for the state's massive surge in Coronavirus cases. Management at competing hospitals now working together to deal with a potential shortage of hospital beds. Thursday July 9th,

As if the Coronavirus is not enough to deal with, we want to let you know about another confirmed case of Dengue Fever, the 11th in the Keys. One case confirmed in Miami Dade. It's believed all the cases were locally acquired. Dengue fever is spread by mosquitoes. Some of the symptoms are similar to the Coronavirus --- a fever, along with muscle aches and pain. You can help slow the spread by getting rid of any standing water where mosquitoes can breed. **7:35,8:55, 9:35AM**

Today so called surge teams in Miami Dade County will be in Liberty City handing out hand sanitizer, masks and information about COVID-19. **7:35,8:55**, **9:55AM**

Broward County has hundreds of workers performing so called contact tracing", 340 workers identifying and reaching out to people who've been in touch with those infected with COVID-19. Experts say "340" is a fraction of the more than 1,500 contact tracers the county needs to properly track the virus.

Dr. Anthony Fauci ringing the alarm bell, warning Americans if we don't do everything we can to slow the spread of the virus the number of cases could spike to as many as 100,000 a day. Floridians continue to test positive for the Coronavirus by the thousands every day. Just over six thousand new infections reported yesterday, the fourth highest total since the pandemic started. Florida set a record last Saturday reporting more than 9,000 cases in a single day. **8:55,9:55AM**

When school starts next year students in Broward will have to bring their own masks and wear them to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. As the Sun Sentinel is reporting the district will provide masks for teachers. **7:35,8:35AM**

If you're trying to sanitize surfaces with Lysol or Clorox wipes as you know they're hard to come by and that's expected to be an issue until next year. That's according to the folks in charge of the nation's supply chain. There is a cheaper way to disinfect surfaces: a third of a cup of bleach to a gallon of water. If you're bound and determined to spend more the Environmental Protection Agency does have a list of approved products to fight the virus. July 10th

Anybody planning to interact with President Trump today at a fundraiser in Hillsborough Beach will have to be tested for COVID-19. **6:35AM**

Another grim number to report in the fight against the Coronavirus in Florida, 120 deaths in a single day. **7:35,8:55AM**

An 11 year old Broward girl with COVID-19 has died from complications. According to the Medical Examiner, Yansi Ayala had several underlying conditions including, epilepsy, cerebral palsy and asthma. Ayala is the second 11 year old in South Florida to die from COVID-19. Last week an 11-year-old boy from Miami Dade county, Daequan Wimberly made headlines as the youngest person in Florida to die from the virus. He also had several underlying health conditions. **7:35AM**

A reminder about dozens of brands of hand sanitizers being recalled because they may be poisonous ---- they contain methanol, better known as wood alcohol and some of affected brands were sold at Walmart and Target. The hand sanitizers especially dangerous if they're consumed, accidentally or on purpose, but can still cause some serious health issues when they're absorbed through the skin. August 3rd

Florida not so fortunate with respect to the Coronavirus. More than 7,000 people in this state, dead from the virus and we're on the verge of half a million cases. **7:35,8:55AM**

August 11th

South Florida Funeral Home Directors say the pandemic say has created what they believe WILL be the new normal. They say they're not getting much direction from the CDC when it comes to handling remains so they're largely left on their own to determine safety guidelines. Many families are opting for virtual services. Funeral directors say they are limiting the in person viewings. No more than 10 people at a time. **7:35,8:55AM**

Broward County stepping up testing for COVID 19. Broward Mayor, Dale Holness says there are some emerging hot zones: 33311 and 33133. If you have symptoms, questions or want to find the closest testing site there is a Broward Hotline: (954) 357—9500 **7:35, 8:35,8:55AM**

August 12th

The rate of COVID 19 infections will be the key factor in whether to reopen school. There has been a drop in new cases over the past few days --- the latest one day total, just over 4,100. It's one of the lowest numbers in Florida since the start of the pandemic. **8:35,8:55AM**

August 18th

The 2020 Winterfest Boat Parade has been cancelled because of the Coronavirus. It was set to take place December 12th. Organizers say they'll focus on next year, which will be the 50th anniversary. **8:35AM**

The nation's top group of doctors out with new guidance about face masks for children. They say even if kids are doing e-learning it's still a good time to start preparing them to wear face masks all day. Doctors say masks can be worn safely by kids two years and older, even those with underlying issues. Experts are urging parents to teach kids to wear masks over the mouth and the NOSE – and the safest way to remove the mask --- by the ear straps. **7:35,8:35AM**

The Broward Sheriff's Office is mourning the death of a fourth employee from COVID 19. L He was with BSO more than 20 years. He is the second BSO employee to die from COVID 19 this month. **7:35,9:55AM**

Coronavirus cases are surging in nursing homes all over the country, including Florida. A task force is meeting tomorrow to look at ways people can visit loved ones at nursing homes and assisted living facilities. That task force made up of some members of Governor Ron DeSantis' administration as well as health care professionals. **8:35,9:35AM**

Children's hospitals in South Florida say they are treating more children for a rare and dangerous illness linked to COVID-19. The official name is: "Multi Inflammatory Syndrome in Children", MIS-C for short. HOT 105 first told you about it earlier this year. The disease appears to affect young children and teens. Doctors say it tends to come on quickly -- and teens and kids get really sick, right

Is it safe to have high school football this year? The Florida High School Athletic Association is expected to decide today if, when and what football and other high school sports will look like this year. According to the Florida Department of Health the lab just reported the results of more than 4,000 test with results dating back almost four weeks.

The number of new Coronavirus cases in South Florida continues to stay on a downward track --- just over 2,200 cases reported yesterday. One of the lowest single day totals in two months. The first confirmed case of someone being re-infected with the virus confirmed in Hong Kong. Researchers ay a young and healthy patient developed COVID 19 more than four months after the first case. Florida hospitals say they've lost billions in the past four months because of the Coronavirus. August 21st

Governor Ron DeSantis revealing a new ONLINE tool to help residents figure out if they're at risk for getting COVID 19. It's called "The Florida Safe Survey" is geared toward the elderly to help them determine if they're at risk. The survey also provides info about the spread of the virus. 7:35,8:35AM

August 24th

At Florida A and M University a curfew is NOW in effect: 10PM to 6AM during the week and midnight to 6AM on the weekends. The curfew put in place because of concern about parties on campus and the potential spread of COVID 19. Students who break the curfew could face some tough penalties including getting kicked out 6:35, 7:35AM

August 27th

A six year old girl is now the youngest person in Florida to die from complications related to the Coronavirus. She is from Hillsborough County --- the eighth child in the state to die from COVID 19 complications. 7:35,8:35AM

Since the start of the pandemic more than 600,000 cases of COVID 19 have been confirmed in Florida and more than 10,000 deaths. The weekend saw a continued trend --- a decrease in the daily number of new cases: just under 3,000.

Miami Dade Superintendent Carvhalo holding a news conference once again announcing schools may open earlier than expected if the Coronavirus infection rate continues to decline. The rate has been on a downward trend, down to about 10 percent. Most experts recommend an infection rate of 3 to 5 percent for two straight weeks before schools are reopened. Teachers are upset --- about the online learning that's set to start Monday. Broward County has \$25 million dollars available to help renters who're suffering financially because of the COVID 19 pandemic. The money is only available to Broward residents. Your landlord must agree to take part in the program. Between March and July almost 600 employees with Miami Dade County Schools tested positive for COVID 19. That's a significant jump from the information the district reported last month when a spokesperson said just 100 employees tested positive. Florida reporting the lowest rate of COVID 19 infection in two months. Public health experts say there is also a continuous decline in the number of people showing up at hospital emergency rooms with symptoms. September 2nd

Florida is no longer doing business with Quest Diagnostics. The state has cut ties accusing the lab of just reporting the results of 75,000 COVID 19 tests from as far back as April. Quest has posted an apology on social media and blamed a technical issue for the delay. **7:35, 8:35AM**

September 8th

An emergency order to help slow the spread of Coronavirus in Miami Dade County will now go into effect tomorrow instead of today.

September 10th

For the second day in a row Florida reporting a one day total of LESS than 2,000 COVID cases, the lowest one day total in three months. Since the start of the pandemic more than 650,000 people in Florida have tested positive. Public health experts are hoping people were cautious over the long Labor Day weekend and that we won't see a spike in cases. 7:35,8:35,8:55AM

The number of Coronavirus cases continues to trend in the right direction --- under 2,000 new cases two days in a row. That hasn't happened since June. **7:35,7:55**, **8:35, 8:55AM**

Another Miami Dade transit driver has died from COVID 19. Shadel Hamilton passed away over the holiday weekend. His daughter says he worked for Miami

Dade Transit 31 years. Hamilton's daughter says he worked his last shift, July 31st and tested positive in early August. Two other Miami Dade transit employees have lost their lives to the virus. Miami Dade Transit says it has increased cleaning and safety procedures and issues masks and face shields to all drivers. **7:35**, **8:35**, **8:55AM**

September 14th

The number of new Coronavirus cases in the state continues to trend downward--- the latest one day total, just under 2,500 cases. **7:35, 8:55AM**

Miami Dade and Broward are officially in Phase Two of reopening, starting today. The decision coming in the wake of a steady decline in the Covid infection rate. Despite the official move to Phase Two you won't see a dramatic change overnight. Broward and Miami Dade Schools expected to meet next week to talk about when and how schools should reopen. **6:55,7:55,8:35,9:55AM**

September 15th

One of the companies racing to make a vaccine for the Coronavirus says if it requires two doses they won't be able to make enough to vaccine everyone in the world until 2024. There is also concern a vaccine may needed every year like a flu shot. **6:35**, **8:35AM**

September 16th

The latest one-day number of Coronavirus cases, just a little over 1,700, the lowest one-day total since June. Since the start of the pandemic almost 670,000 cases have been confirmed in Florida --- and it's responsible for the deaths of almost 13,000 Floridians. **7:35, 8:35AM**

Researchers now looking at a link between blood type and the Coronavirus. The genealogy website, "23 and Me" studying how a person's genes factor into whether or not they get the virus and if so, how badly they're impacted. "23 and Me" researchers say people with Type O blood appear to be least at risk. Right now there is nothing doctors can do with the information and it won't affect treatment. It's just an early finding as researchers and scientists study the disease.

Teachers unions in Miami Dade and Broward Counties say they want to know exactly what kind of safety protocols will be place when schools reopen – and they don't think face to face learning should be rushed. The target date for Broward Schools is October 5th. No word yet on a date for Miami Dade Schools. **6:35**, **7:55**, **8:35AM**

Sept. 21st

The latest number of Covid 19 cases continues to trend in the right direction – the latest one day total in Florida just over 1,600 cases, the lowest one day total since June. **6:55,7:35,8:55AM**

Harvard researchers say children with no symptoms appear to be more contagious than adults, so called super spreaders. Researchers also say children can spread the virus to grown-ups. A lot of experts are extremely worried kids could trigger another wave of Covid infections --- if schools don't require masks and social distancing. **6:35,7:35,8:35AM**

Sept. 22nd

The number of Covid 19 cases continues to trend in the right direction – the latest one-day total just over 1,600 the lowest one-day total since June. **7:55,8:55AM**

Sept. 25

Florida reporting 2,400 new cases of COVID 19. The positivity rate statewide is near six percent. **6:55**, **8:55AM**

The Broward School Board is holding an emergency meeting tomorrow. They could decide to move up the date schools open for in person learning to this coming Monday, October 5th. The Education Commissioner is forcing them to do so --- with a threat open by Monday OR lose millions in funding 7:55, 8:55, 9:55AM

Why the rush to get teachers and kids back in school? A former advisor to Vice President Mike Pence, says the White House put pressure on the Centers for Disease Control to downplay the risk of sending children back to school – a

political move to help parents get back to work, reboot the economy and get Donald Trump re-elected. **6:55,7:55AM**

The return to in person learning in Miami Dade is happening this coming Monday, October 5th. The Broward School Board facing the same threat. Open schools for in person learning the first week of October of lose millions in funding. **6:35,7:35AM**

Fall has officially arrived a tough time for some people who suffer with allergies. This year is even more complicated because some of the symptoms are similar to COVID 19. How do you know the difference? Doctors say it is extremely rare, if ever for allergies to cause a fever. The number of school aged children diagnosed with COVID 19 is growing as schools across the country reopen.
