The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in: newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the final quarter of 2017.

CRIME NEWSCASTS

10/4 A subcontractor, Aerotek, cleaning up after Hurricane Irma is facing serious allegations accused of hiring workers at one rate then allegedly short changing them.

10/4 Hollywood police say a menage-a-troix involving three men during Hurricane Irma escalated to a violent robbery and murder. 50 year old Ariel Gonzalez was killed. Travis Watson is in custody. Police say they're looking for the victim's partner.

10/5 The search continues for the suspect who opened fire on a crowd gathered for a candlelight vigil earlier this week at NW 31st Avenue and 65th Street. The crowd was gathered to remember Victoria Tutson. She is the mother of four killed in a drive by shooting last week.

10/6 Miami, Miami Dade police and the FBI pursuing a carjacking suspect who led them on a chase --- he carjacked a second vehicle during the chase. Police originally went looking for him to serve a warrant.

10/9 An investigation is underway after a deadly-police involved shooting. Miami Beach police shot and killed a woman they say struck and injured one of their officers.

October 11th, Pembroke Pines police are searching for a man wanted after customers at a Paanera Bread restaurant say they saw him committing a lude act.

10/12 A Davie couple arrested for drug trafficking charges. Anthony Gomes and Elizabeth Ton's home raided. Police say they were part of an international ring with ties to China, Canada and 10 states.

10/10 The father of a young woman shot and killed by Miami Beach police Sunday night say he has no idea what could have prompted police to kill her. 22 year old Carrie Ann Heethan was a recent college grad. The officer she struck and injured, David Cahooso is out of the hospital and recovering at home.

10/12 A suspect, Anthony Walker, arrested for allegedly committing a lewd act in a Panera Bread restaurant in Pembroke Pines. Police say he was seen by customers and on surveillance video.

10/16 The state of Florida not doing enough to keep people with serious mental issues from getting a gun. That's according to a Sun Sentinel investigation. The report finding a breakdown in enforcing the law.

10/16 A Vero Beach physician, Dr. Johnny Benjamin is now also an accused felon – charged with trafficking the powerful opioid, fentanyl, robbery and grand theft.

10/18 The owner of an Opa Locka business and father of 7, Jose Gonzalez shot and killed overnight at work. Homicide detectives are trying to figure out if he was targeted.

10/19 A custodian at a Coral Springs Middle School, Robert Quincey Grant, arrested, accused of sexually assaulting a 15 year old boy, at the school.

10/20A Lyft driver, Julio Perez arrested for allegedly attacking a passenger, a teenaged boy after giving him a ride home to Davie. Lyft says Perez' status as a driver has been deactivated and they are co-operating with authorities.

10/20 A convicted sex offender is off the streets again, 41 year old James Hodge. Fort Lauderdale police say he raped a woman two weeks ago in the 2600 block of Middle River Drive, then slapped her and laughed as he walked away.

10/25 BSO homicide detectives hoping to get a break in a cold case: the victim, Vincent Holloman murdered a year ago, in broad daylight, in an apartment complex on a dead--end street, Harris Terrace and NW 27th Avenue.

10/25 One student, a 10 year old boy injured, another charged with battery at Citrus Grove Middle School. Police say the 10 year old's injuries were so severe he was rushed to the hospital.

10/26 Broward Health Medical Center operating normally this morning after a huge scare. The SWAT team there for a couple of hours after a patient with a knife barricaded himself inside. He eventually opened the door for negotiators. No one was hurt.

10/27 Bond denied for a Miami man, an Isis wannabe, accused of plotting to blow up the food court at the Dolphin Mall. The FBI says Vincente Solano came up with the idea on his own.

10/28 There are new questions about the Hollywood nursing home that became a death trap, like how the owners ever got a license. For decades, the owner, Jack Michel, has had a history of running facilities with violations in several cities, including one in St. Louis where four women died during a heat wave.

10/30 Three Boynton Beach cops accused of a 2014 beating and coverup on trial today in a federal courtroom. Two of them are no longer on the force. They're accused of violating a victim's constitutional rights.

11/2 We're learning the man shot inside a CVS in Davie yesterday has died. That store at Griffin Road and University Drive.

11/3 12 people in South Florida are accused of food stamp fraud. Federal prosecutors say they illegally traded food stamps for cash.

11/3 Miami Dade police searching for the suspect who shot a pregnant woman overnight in the 1900 block of NW 49th Street. She was rushed to Jackson Memorial Hospital.

11/6 Overnight a young black woman taken into custody at the same Southwest Miami Dade apartment complex where the body of a little black girl was found in a dumpster: SW 137th Avenue and 254th street. It's unclear if the young woman was arrested in connection with the child's death.

11/6 This morning we know the identities of the Hurricanes fan and the Miami Dade officer involved in a violent encounter at Saturday's UM game: 27 year old Bridget Freitus is charged with unruly conduct and battery on a law enforcement officer, Douglas Ross.

11/8 A Miami Beach police officer, Leon Paige, denied custody of his two year old son. His four year old daughter's body was found in a dumpster over the weekend at a Southwest Miami Dade apartment complex.

11/8 The family of a young man killed last week a CVS in Davie holding a news conference. They have a lot of questions about a deadly encounter police describe as a transaction that started on Craigslist and went bad.

11/8 A South Florida physician, Dr. Joaquin Mendez apologizing and sentenced to four years in prison for his role in the deaths of drug addicts at a Margate Treatment Center. The head of the "Reflections Treatment Center", Kenneth Chatman is already serving 27 years in prison for forcing some patients into prostitution and encouraging others to keep using drugs so he could continue billing their insurance companies.

11/13 The search is on for the drive by shooter who left a man critically injured: NW 27th Avenue and NW 175th Street. The victim shot in the chest and airlifted to Aventura hospital.

11/14 The former pastor of a South Florida mega church, Calvary Chapel is accused of molesting a four year old girl from the time she was 4 until she was a teenager. He resigned in 2014. He has not been charged.

11/14 The Mayor of Royal Palm Beach out of jail, Frederick Pinto released on his own recognizance after he was arrested on a domestic battery charge.

11/16 Pembroke Pines police looking for a man who's been trying to lure children into his car. A 17 year old took pictures of him, from the back as he ran to his car: a silver, Toyota Scion SUV.

11/16 A guard at the federal detention center in Miami, Damon Coleman sentenced to eight months in prison. He admitted he raped a woman in custody at the facility.

11/17 A jury awarding a \$49 million dollar verdict to a former South Dade Senior High student who sued the district after she was raped by a teacher. Brenniel Janes Mones plead guilty to several charges. He's now a registered sex offender, released in June.

11/17 Friends and family of the high school basketball star murdered last weekend in Overtown will remember him tonight during a candle light vigil in Gibson Park.

11/29 A custodian at Coral Springs Middle School, Robert Quincey Grant, arrested, accused of sexually assaulting a 15 year old girl at the school.

11/29 A suspected serial killer is off the streets in Tampa: 24 year old Howell Emanuel Donaldson will be charged with four counts of first degree murder.

11/30 Florida lawmakers set to look at a proposal that would reform the prosecution of children as adults. Among other things, the bill calls for changes in the way minors are handled for non-violent offenses.

12/1 BSO has identified the deputy who struck and killed a bicyclist, John Mancini, earlier this week, Sean Reyka. Reyka's father, BSO Sergeant Chris Reyka was ambushed and murdered 10 years ago. His killer has never been caught.

12/1 Bond denied for the former Brownsville Middle School gym teacher accused of raping female students for more than 10 years. Wendell Alfredo Nibbs is scheduled to be in front of a Miami Dade County judge today.

12/1 A South Florida physician, Dr. Joaquin Mendez apologizing and sentenced to four years in prison for his role in the deaths of drug addicts at a Margate treatment center. Mendez admitting he never treated the patients for substance abuse.

12/4 Authorities investigating a shooting in Allapattah, NW 24th Street and 13th Avenue, scene of a massive police presence.

12/6 So many passengers are coming to Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport with guns in their carry on luggage TSA is holding a news conference to explain passengers should pack their weapons in checked luggage, or even better leave them home.

12/6 Florida lawmakers set to look at a proposal that would reform the prosecution of children as adults. Among other things, the bill calls for changes in the way minors are handled for non-violent offenses.

12/6 A Davie man, 19 year old Anthony Dupont, arrested for allegedly exposing himself to Uber Eats drivers, two days in a row. He's in the Broward County jail, being held without bail.

12/11A Miami Dade officer injured in a shootout with a shoplifting suspect last week at Walmart in NW Miami Dade, Officer Manuel Gonzalez is out of the hospital. The suspect, David Facen was killed.

12/11 Actor and comedian, Hannibal Buress arrested over the weekend, charged with disorderly intoxication. Police say he asked an officer to call him an Uber, then got agitated when the officer refused.

12/12 Authorities say there is no truth to posts on social media that a sniper is killing people in Miami Gardens. Posts started showing

up on social media over the weekend after a mother of three, Alicia Roundtree was shot and killed. The rumor spawned after a woman was fatally wounded by a stray bullet on NW 183 Street, between 24th and 27th Avenues.

12/14 A 15 year old girl recovering after getting shot twice and police are trying to figure out who did it.

12/18 Homicide detectives in Miami Gardens are looking for the shooter who killed one person and injured another Saturday night in the 2900 block of NW 157th Terrace. Joshua Gonzalez died at the scene. 24 year old Jamila Young was rushed to the hospital.

12/27 Police have identified the suspect they say slammed a stolen jeep into a Pompano Beach home; 20 year old Derrick Eddings. He's facing a string of charges including arson, grand theft and reckless driving.

12/27 A father arrested for allegedly leaving his kids in a hot car. Alan Luna says he was only gone for about 15 minutes. Davie police say it was more like an hour and a half.

12/28 A third suspect, Jeffery Herell arrested for his alleged role in a grisly murder case will be in front of a judge today. The victim, Darren Butler's body was found in the trunk of a burning vehicle last month in North Lauderdale.

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

10/9 The Dove brand apologizing for a racist ad, a group of pictures that appear to show you can make yourself white by using Dove body wash. Dove apologizing for the ad.

10/10 Miami Mayor, Thomas Regalado says Overtown is the best place for Amazon’s second headquarters. Activists say Overtown residents have been repeatedly cut out of deals that are supposed to provide jobs. Cities all over the country are competing. Proposals are due October 19th.

10/11 A statue of Broward’s namesake, Napoleon Broward will soon be moved out of the county courthouse. He was a segregationist, wanted Blacks rounded up and moved to one location in this country. The T.J. Reddick Black Bar Association led the effort to have Broward’s statue removed.

10/11 The Haitian government formally requesting an 18 month extension of Temporary Protected Status for approximately 60,000 Haitian nationals living in the U.S.

10/12 A memorial to slaves in Tallahassee is a step closer to reality. The House of Representatives has approved a bill to develop a plan to move forward. It will also get recommendations from the Florida Historical Commission.

10/13 The NAACP alerting us to what its calling a new threat, Black Identity Extremists, or BIE. According to the agency Black people’s perception of police brutality has led to deadly violence against law enforcement.

10/13 BSO urging people to lock their doors and windows. They're looking for the suspect who tried to rape 2 women in Deerfield Beach.

10/13 Facebook is promising to put a Black person on its board of directors. Facebook making the commitment after members of the Congressional Black Caucus put the full court press on Facebook COO, Sheryl Sandberg.

10/13 African American Research Library and Cultural Center celebrating 15th anniversary

Featuring, "Floridians and the Harlem Renaissance, celebrating Floridians who've contributed to music, art and literature of the Harlem Renaissance.

10/17 Florida Governor Rick Scott declaring a state of emergency ahead of white supremacist Richard Spencer's speech Thursday at the University of Florida. Scott also activating the National Guard. UF says it expects to spend half a million dollars on security. One person was killed after Spencer's "Unite the Right" rally in Charlottesville in August.

10/18 The Miami Heat is moving its golf tournament from Donald Trump's course in Doral. It's been there the past four years.

10/19 Hollywood Commissioners proposing a new list of names for streets currently named for confederate generals: Liberty, Hope and Freedom. A number of activists want the streets named to honor, Eula Johnson, who fought to desegregate Broward beaches and abolitionists, Harriet Tubman and Sojourner Truth. Commissioners could make a final decision in November.

10/19 President Obama is back on the campaign trail. He's working to activate Blacks to vote in upcoming gubernatorial races.

10/19 Russia using social media both before and after the Presidential election to trick black people and scare whites. Russians set up phony Facebook accounts under the names, "Black

Fist” and “Black Matters US”, a deliberate attempt to sound like Black lives matter. Experts say the Russians wanted to make white people think there is a growing number of Black militants ready to take to the streets.

10/19 The University of Florida is bracing for potential violence. White supremacist, Richard Spencer is scheduled to speak today. Hundreds of law enforcement officers are reporting to campus ahead of this afternoon’s speech.

10/20 Some Miami Dade officers are threatening not to provide security for the Dolphins game against the New York Jets, Sunday 1 o’clock. The head of the police union, John Rivera, says officers feel as if the protest are solely against the police.

10/25 The NAACP issuing an extraordinary warning for Black people to be careful when flying American Airlines. According to the civil rights organization a quote, pattern of disturbing incidents specific to American Airlines has been reported by Black passengers – that booking and boarding flights on the carrier could leave Blacks subjected to disrespectful or unsafe conditions. A spokesperson for American says the company is disappointed to hear about the advisory and is committed to providing a positive, safe travel experience for everyone.

10/26 Congresswoman Fredericka Wilson staying out of Washington as a result of ongoing threats, including one calling for her to be lynched. Democrats in Congress honored her yesterday by wearing stickers with a red cowboy hat and posing for a group picture on the steps of the capitol.

10/26 Kellogg's is apologizing after getting called out for a drawing on the back of its boxes of Corn Pops --- one brown Corn Pop, depicted as a janitor. Within five hours of getting called out via Twitter, Kellogg's responded, it is committed to diversity and inclusion, the artwork has been updated and will be in stores soon.

11/2 Congresswoman, Fredericka Wilson is back at work in D.C. for the first time since she received death threats after she called out President Trump for insensitive remarks he made during a condolence call to a South Florida Gold Star, widow.

11/2 Tomorrow Miami Mayor, Thomas Regalado and the Fire Chief scheduled to hold a news conference to talk about 6 firefighters who targeted a Black co-worker with a noose and an obscene drawing on his wife's picture.

11/2 Congresswoman, Fredericka Wilson is back at work in D.C. for the first time since she started receiving death threats. Those threats coming after President Trump and his Chief of Staff, John Kelly tried to assassinate her character after she called the President out for making insensitive remarks about a gold star widow.

11/3 Later this morning Miami Mayor, Thomas Regalado is scheduled to hold a news conference at City Hall. He's expected to reveal more information about the 6 firefighters fired after they targeted a co-worker, a Black Lieutenant at Fire Station 12.

11/4 One of the six firefighters fired for hanging a noose on a the family of a Black co-worker and drawing obscene images on is wife's picture looks black himself. He's Hispanic, Harold Santana. Captain William Bryson is getting the most headlines. His father, William Bryson is a former Miami and Miami Dade police chief. During his time as President of the firefighters union he kicked 62 Black firemen out of the union after they complained about discrimination.

11/6 Vincente Solano, the Isis wannabe accused of plotting to blow up the food court in the Dolphin Mall Thanksgiving Day is scheduled to be arraigned today.

11/6 As early as today the State Department is expected to make an announcement that will impact the future of tens of thousands of immigrants in this country under Temporary Protected Status, including some 50,000 Haitians.

11/8 The Reverend Al Sharpton is the key speaker at a prayer service: "We Stand With Frdericka"
4PM November 11th
The Historic Saint Agnes Episcopal Church.

11/10 The U.S. Labor Department giving management at Donald Trump's Mar-a-Lago resort in Palm Beach the okay to hire extra help for the upcoming winter season, 70 foreign waiters, housekeepers and cooks. Trumps managers say they need the foreigners because there just aren't enough qualified Americans to do the work.

11/13 Three members of Congress are working on a new bill that would allow tens of thousands of Haitians and Salvadorans in the United States under TPS to apply for permanent residency. The bill would give them the opportunity to go before a judge and prove they would experience extreme hardship if forced to go home.

11/16 Legendary journalist, Gwen Ifill's alma mater, Simmon College in Boston paying tribute to her, naming a school in her honor: The Gwen Ifill College of Media, Arts and Humanities. Ifill died last year of cancer. She was 61.

11/16 Hollywood Commissioners voting to change the names of three streets named for confederate generals from Lee, Hood and Forrest to Hope, Freedom and Liberty.

11/29 Congresswoman Fredericka Wilson says she's asked Capitol police for security after receiving death threats. She says those threats are coming after going public with President Trump's insensitive remarks to the widow of LaDavid Johnson.

11/30 Actress Phylicia Rashad is the new face of a \$25 million dollar initiative to help ensure African American history is

preserved and gets it rightful place. The multi-year program paid for, in part, with grants from the Ford Foundation.

12/4 American Airlines responding to an NAACP travel advisory, warning passengers 'Flying While Black' could be a problem on the carrier. American now says its developing a new diversity training course and employees will be required to undergo the additional training both online and in person. American says it's also hiring an independent firm to review its hiring practices and has pledged to make massive changes to the way it handles discrimination complaints.

12/12 The Miami firefighters fired for putting a noose on a Black firefighters desk and drawing sexually explicit pictures are fighting to get their jobs back. Today union leadership will take another look and decide on a case by case basis if the firing was excessive or justified.

12/13 The Miami Firefighters Union deciding in favor of giving firefighters fired for targeting a Black co-worker with a noose. The union deciding those firefighters should be afforded due process. Their future will eventually be decided by an arbitrator.

12/13 A North Miami cop is suing the department alleging he's the victim of discrimination because he's white. Sgt. Patrick McNally claims the North Miami Police Department is intentionally holding white people back in favor of Black and Haitian Americans.

12/14 Tavis Smiley is fighting back against allegations he was involved in inappropriate sexual behavior. He says during his 30 year career he has never groped, inappropriately touched anyone or coerced a colleague into a sexual relationship.

12/18 Travyon Martin's killer, George Zimmerman is threatening to hurt Jay Z for producing a documentary about Trayvon's death.

10/10 Miami Mayor, Thomas Regalado says Overtown is the best
place for Amazon’s ‘s new second headquarters. Regalado says the
facility needs to be in an urban setting and in Miami Overtown is
the only place.

11/1 Broward Commissioners once again considering asking voters to approve a penny sales tax to pay for transportation projects. The issue could be on the ballot next November.

11/1 The Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show starts Today at Port Everglades. Between now and Sunday more than \$100,000 people are expected to attend. More than a thousand exhibitors from more than 40 countries are showing off \$4 billion dollars worth of boats, yachts, superyachts, electronics and marine accessories.

11/1 Miami voters approving the \$400 million dollar general obligation bond called, "Miami Forever" \$200 million for storm drains and to fight sea level rise – the other \$200 million for affordable housing. The money will be repaid through an increase in property taxes.

11/9 Miami considered one of the worst places in the country to rent. Researchers say although rent is more expensive in cities like New York and San Francisco, in many cases in Miami people are spending as much as half of their pay on rent. The average cost of a one bedroom in South Florida is almost two thousand dollars a month.

11/16 A new entertainment venue is opening in Miami Gardens, "Top Golf". It features a driving range, restaurants and entertainment.

11/30 North Miami to launch new emergency utility assistance pilot program for needy residents, up to \$300 dollars to pay water bills, first come, first served.

12/8 Miramar Commissioners approving a 99 year lease for the American Tennis Association to build a major facility; a tennis center, a hotel and the Black Tennis Hall of Fame. The project is expected to cost more than \$25 million dollars. Venus and Serena Williams have pledged a million dollars for the Black Tennis Hall of Fame.

10/5 Researchers at the University of Miami say a cocktail of drugs appears to be effective at preventing the Zika virus. So far testing has only been done on animals.

10/10 A sewage spill leading to a no swimming advisory in three bodies of water near North Miami Beach: Maule Lake, Little Maule Lake and the entrance to the Oleta River State Park. The no swimming advisory issued after a sewer main break.

10/13 The Sun Sentinel and the Miami Herald are suing the city of Hollywood for information that would generally be handed over: 911 calls and police reports from a nursing home in Hollywood Hills. The facility lost power during Hurricane Irma. It led to 14 deaths.

10/17 The Center for Auto Safety is urging Ford to recall more than a million Explorers because of concerns about carbon monoxide poisoning; model years 2011 to 2017. Ford says the SUVs are safe, but offering it will offer free inspections and repairs.

10/26 An autopsy has confirmed a 10 year old boy, Alton Banks died of an opioid overdose over the summer. His family says he has no idea how he came in contact with the deadly drug.

10/30 New research confirming the long term use of acetaminophen to ADHD. Long term is defined as 29 days or more. Acetaminophen is the active ingredient in Tylenol and hundreds of over the counter prescription medications.

11/1 This is the first day to sign up for Obamacare for the coming year. There is a lot of confusion this year because of President Trump's efforts to get rid of Affordable Care. There is a shorter enrollment period, just 45 days. Subsidies are still available.

11/9 Consumer advocates say two kinds of fidget spinners sold at Target are dangers. They contain lead. Activists say as much as 330 times the legal limit for kids' products and could be dangerous. There are no reported cases of lead poisoning linked to the products: The Fidget Wild Premium Spinner Brass and the Fidget Wild Premium Spinner Metal.

11/3 DCF and the federal government slapped with a lawsuit, accused of failing to make accommodations for disabled people, Hurricane Irma victims, who waited in long lines for DSNAP benefits.

11/7 Starting January 1st, the largest health insurer in Florida, "Florida Blue" will no longer provide coverage for Oxycontin. The carrier says its' s an effort to reduce the amount of people abusing the painkiller.

11/13 The first medical marijuana store in Palm Beach County opens tomorrow, "Knox Medical" in a former bank on Dixie Highway across the street from Lake Worth City Hall.

11/14 Disturbing concerns about the safety of the high speed blender, Nutri-Bullet. At least 22 people are suing, alleging the device malfunctioned, caused serious burns and other injuries. The makers of Nutri Bullet say those incidents are rare, the product is safe and there are hundreds of millions of satisfied users.

12/1 This is World Aids Day, although there has been a dramatic decrease in the number of deaths, there are still 36 million people worldwide living with the disease.

12/12 Former President Obama and former First Lady, Michelle Obama are urging people to sign up for insurance through the Affordable Care Act. Friday is the last day. Under President Obama Open Enrollment lasted 90 days – President Trump cut it in half to 45 days.

12/13 An investigation is underway after the deaths of two toddlers within a week at the Glassman Center at the Clark Center. It's shut down until further notice. The health department confirming one of the toddlers had meningitis.

12/15 Kroger is recalling bottled water for babies after complaints about mold. The product is, "Comforts for Baby Purified Water with fluoride.

12/15 The Food and Drug Administration says silver sprinkles are not safe and when consumed could lead to serious health issues. Americans are urged to remove them. Even though they're dangerous they're widely available – only banned in California after a lawsuit.

10/3 Advisories are in effect this morning for rip currents and flooding because of King Tides.

10/5 The system we've been watching now officially has a name, Tropical Storm Nate. It could become a Category One hurricane and come ashore in the panhandle over the weekend.

10/13 South Florida expected to continue to get heavy rain as a result of a tropical wave. It's expected to stick around through the weekend.

10/18 Senator Bill Nelson is asking the federal government to help the state of Florida do a better job of getting food vouchers to those in need after Hurricane Irma. Over the weekend tens of thousands of people spent hours in long lines. BSO shut down centers in Broward because of concerns about public safety.

10/26 First cool weather this year --- morning temperatures in the mid 50's.

10/27 FPL wants more money, \$800 million dollars more from its customers to help cover the cost of recovering after Hurricane Irma. Florida's Public Service Commission will have the final say.

10/30 Cool breezy conditions today, starting in the mid-fifties.

10/30 Residents in Southwest Miami Dade cleaning up in the wake of tropical Storm Phillipe. Several hundred people in Broward and Miami Dade have no power. A lot of residents are cleaning up after the storm, many reporting a violent tornado touching down, near Brid Road and SW 97th Avenue.

10/30 FEMA is giving Hurricane Irma victims more time to get help from the federal government, the deadline to apply for individual assistance now extended to November 24th. There is still no word on an exact date when DCF will reschedule events to make

up for the ones cancelled after tens of thousands of storm victims turned out and waited hours in long lines to receive food stamps.

11/1 For the second day in a row, Hurricane Irma victims are lining up by the thousands at the BB&T Center and Hard Rock Stadium for the special food stamp benefits for storm victims.

11/3 Advisories are in effect for rip currents and flooding because of King Tides.

11/9 For the second day in a row, Hurricane Irma victims are lining up to receive special food stamp benefits. Broward residents can apply at the BB&T Center and in Miami Dade, Hard Rock Stadium.

11/9 This is the final day for Hurricane Irma victims to receive special food stamps. People whose last names begin with the letters Q through Z will be seen today. 7AM to 6PM.

11/13 FEMA opening two Hurricane Recovery Centers in Miami Dade County: Betty T. Ferguson Center in Miami Gardens and Shenandoah Park in Miami.

11/27 Three days until the end of hurricane season. This year's season broke records the first time three Category 4 storms have made landfall in the U.S. in a single season: Harvey, Irma and Maria. Irma was a monster storm, impacting the entire state, but it was ultimately downgraded before hitting South Florida.

11/30 This is the last day of the Atlantic Hurricane season. 17 named storms. It has been the busiest storm season since 2005.

12/1 Experts from FEMA and NOAA will meet today to talk about the lessons learned from this hurricane season and how to better prepare for next year. 2017 is one of the worst seasons on record, still nowhere near as bad as 2005 when there were so many storms, the Hurricane Center ran out of names and had to start using the Greek alphabet.

12/5 Florida lawmakers are considering some changes in the wake of hurricane Irma. Among other things they're looking at;

extending a toll road into Georgia to help with the evacuation process, creating so called fuel farms to make it easier for people to get gas and leasing a cruise ship to help residents get out of the Keys.
