The following is a listing of some of the topics and interviews covered in Newscasts, public service announcements (PSAs) and in our public affairs show during the final quarter of 2013.

## **CRIME NEWSCASTS**

10/3 Plantation police are trying to find out who is responsible for a pipe bomb that exploded under a car parked in front of a Jacaranda townhouse.

10/7 Miami homicide detectives are trying to figure out who shot and killed a man in front of witnesses. It happened in the courtyard of a Liberty City apartment complex at NW 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 68<sup>th</sup> Street.

10/8 Today Florida lawmakers will start taking a second look at the state's "Stand Your Ground" law. The biggest change could be a new rule that would require guidelines for neighborhood watch programs. The other potential change could mean police would be required to conduct a full investigation of shootings when the 'Stand Your Ground' law is invoked.

10/9 BSO is looking for the 14 year old who allegedly robbed a letter carrier last month in Pompano Beach. Investigators say he already had 10 outstanding warrants, mostly for burglary and grand theft.

10/15 An assault suspect is impaled while running from Miami police. It happened at Bayshore Drive between NE 80<sup>th</sup> and 82<sup>nd</sup> Streets.

10/16 A Pompano Beach man is in the Broward County jail accused of killing his brother. Relatives say 23 year old Dieusel Ceremoney shot his younger brother then stabbed Saint-Ange Cerement to death with a kitchen knife.

10/16 Jury selection continues today in Eric Rivera's murder trial. He's the alleged triggerman in NFL star, Sean Taylor's death. Taylor was killed when he surprised a crew of burglars in his Palmetto Bay home six years ago.

10/28 Miami Gardens police searching for the suspect who shot and injured four victims Saturday . They were sitting on the front porch of a house near NW 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 187<sup>th</sup> Street.

10/28 Miami Dolphins center Mikey Pounce and the Dolphins still have no comment about the subpoena Massachusetts State police served Pounce. It's related to former Patriot, Aaron Hernandez' murder case. Authorities may consider him a material witness.

10/30 A Miami Dade police officer is hospitalized in serious condition after he was stabbed during a violent confrontation with a suspect who police say was trying to blow up a NW Miami Dade gas station.

10/31 A suspected member of a violent Central American gang is about to get deported again. The Palm Beach Sheriff's office says they found Dilbert Coreas on Facebook after he posted pictures of himself on Facebook promoting his mother's children's party business.

11/4 Miami Gardens police searching for a suspect or suspects after a 19 year old was murdered overnight at NW 32<sup>nd</sup> Court and 202<sup>nd</sup> Street.

11/5 Two people are recovering after getting shot in their car in the parking lot of the Cedar Gardens Apartments in Mami Gardens: 207<sup>th</sup> Street and NW 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

11/15 Miami police searching for the suspect who shot a 9 year old in the face in a drive by shooting, 800 block of NW 55<sup>th</sup> Terrace.

11/18 Investigators searching for answers after a man crashed through the atrium at the Westin Diplomat in Hollywood. He fell some 23 floors to his death landing in the lobby.

11/18 Two teenagers allegedly involved in a rape, Erica Avery and Dwight Henry will be back in front of a judge today. They're both charged as adults. They allegedly held down the victim while another suspect raped and beat her.

11/26 Miami Gardens police are searching for the suspect who shot and injured a retired Marine while trying to snatch his gold chain. 64 year old Robert Outler is expected to survive.

11/26 George Zimmerman has dropped his public defender and hired a South Florida lawyer and legal commentator, Jayne Weintraub to represent him in the domestic violence case involving his girlfriend.

12/2 Two young women in Liberty City, 18 year old Tiarra Grant and 22 year old Shaulaunda Williams shot and killed minutes into Sunday morning near NW 64<sup>th</sup> Street and 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Two other women were also shot.

12/3 Two robbery suspects are expected in bond court this morning. They're accused of robbing several suspects including Heat guard, Roger Mason, Junior.

12/12 A former FAU employee Seth Thompson, arrested for allegedly secretly videotaping men urinating in campus bathrooms.

12/16 One person shot and injured overnight in Miami Gardens, NW 47<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 185<sup>th</sup> Street. Police have no suspects and no motive.

12/12 Miami Gardens police Chief, Matthew Boyd resigns. His departure comes at a troubling time for the department.

12/24 One of South Florida's most prominent African American attorneys Larry Handfield, copping a guilty plea on criminal charges. Handfield has admitted to filing false tax returns.

12/24 Palm Beach County pawn shop owners Kenneth Klitsch and his partner, Christopher Powell are accused of knowingly buying jewelry stolen from the victims of a double homicide.

### **DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS**

10/10 Miami Commissioners meet at 9 o’clock this morning to talk about hiring practices that have become controversial in the wake of revelations the Assistant City manager’s relatives were fast tracked for jobs in the Parks Department, ahead of others.

10/23 The NAACP has selected a woman to serve as the interim President of the NAACP. Lorraine Miller has been on the national Board of Directors since 2008.

11/4 Allegations a Miami Dolphins player, Jonathan Martin was being bullied have taken an ugly turn. There are now also accusations of racism and speculation the behavior could rise to the level of a hate crime. The Dolphins have suspended second year lineman, Richie Incognito.

11/5 New allegations surface Miami Dolphins lineman, Richie Incognito called Jonathan Martin a ‘half-N’.

11/13 The U.S. Department of Transportation investigating whether Miami Dade County, the City of Miami and Coral Gables violated the landmark 1964 Civil Rights Act when they failed to hold public meetings before allowing a garage for Coral Gables’ trolleys to be built in a historic Black section of Coconut Grove.

12/3 The Miami Gardens Police Department slapped with a Federal civil rights lawsuit, accused of racial profiling. The lawsuit alleges customers and some

employees at a convenience store were targeted, harassed and arrested because of their race.

12/18 Research shows Black are targeted more often by collection agencies.

## ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS

10/8 Cafeteria workers at the University of Miami finally have a contract they can live with. It includes a raise and healthcare.

10/8 New research finds although Florida's housing market is rebounding it has the highest rate of foreclosure in the country.

10/11 North Miami City Manager, Stephen Johnson is cutting senior level jobs, reportedly getting rid of 10 Director and Assistant Directors' positions. Johnson says he's saved 10 million dollars.

10/15 A group of activists and researchers will hold a news conference in front of the McDonald's at Jackson Memorial Hospital. They say research coming out of the University of Berkley shows fast food restaurants that pay low salaries and provide no benefits wind up costing taxpayers because even though they work full time they still need and qualify for public assistance.

1-/23 In about two weeks more than 3.5 million Floridians who get food stamps can expect to have their benefits cut, an average of about \$36 dollars a month.

10/28 Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup> cuts in Florida' food stamp program kick in. The program, known as SNAP, will no longer get extra federal stimulus money.

10/30 Miami Dade teachers will vote on a tentative contract agreement. Among other things, it includes a 2.3 percent pay increase and changes to the health plan.

10/30 Florida's unemployed experiencing major difficulties getting through on the band new \$63 million dollar computer system that was supposed to make the process easier. Florida's Department of Economic Opportunity says 562 employees are working overtime to deal with the problems.

11/7 Miami Dade teachers should soon start getting their raises. The board has approved the increase. Under the deal \$50 million from the state will go toward covering the cost.

11/26 Hollywood is a step closer to getting a Walmart. The city has approved plans to build it at the site of the old Millennium Mall; State Road 7 and Hollywood Boulevard. Construction is scheduled to start next year. It's expected to open in the summer of 2015.

12/2 Plans are moving forward to build a \$110 million dollar water park in Fort Lauderdale, half a mile west of I-95 and Commercial. There have been serious

delays, because the FAA originally agreed to lease the land only for an aviation project.

12/5 Researchers say low bank wages are costing the public millions, that a third of tellers make so little they qualify for food stamps and other government assistance. As a result they say Americans wind up subsidizing the cost of bank employees low salaries.

12/9 More than half a million Floridians are on the verge of losing their long term Federal unemployment benefits, unless Congress does something before the end of the year.

12/18 Miami Dade County employees will have to continue paying 5 percent of their salaries toward health care costs.

## **HEALTH/NEWSCASTS**

10/2 The price of transferring medical records could be about to go up. The State Board of Medicine is expected to vote in the coming days on a significant increase.

10/11 The salmonella outbreak that's been making people sick all over the country is here. Four people are sick in Florida, three of them in Miami Dade County. The cases are all linked to Foster Farms Chicken based in California.

10/8 A team of Chinese scientists say Sprite is the best remedy for a hangover. They say it helps our bodies deal with an enzyme that makes us feel badly after too much alcohol.

11/5 New research shows girls who are overweight may develop breasts as early as second grade. Scientists say being overweight puts girls at risk of diabetes, high blood pressure and stroke. They say excess weight affects hormonal balance, mood and overall health.

11/5 The FDA is ordering the company, "23 and Me" to stop selling its genetic testing kit. The FDA says there's no proof it works – and there is concern results could lead some users to seek unnecessary medical treatment.

12/24 Researchers say so called “Man Flu” is real. They say a man’s immune system is not as effective as fighting off a virus. They believe testosterone plays a factor.
