CRIME NEWSCASTS

4/2 Florida lawmakers are cracking down even more on sexual predators who take advantage of kids. Four bills have just been signed into law that call for a minimum of 50 years in some cases, and no time off sentences for good behavior.

4/2 Miami police are actively investigating a double shooting. One man killed, a woman hospitalized in critical condition. Police are calling the violence a drive by shooting.

4/3 Eric Beasley, a biology teacher at a private Deerfield Beach school, Zion Lutheran Christian, accused of having sex with a 14 year old student in the back seat of a car.

4//3 The trial continues today for the former Broward youth pastor at least 10 men say sexually abused them when they were kids. Jeffrey London's ex wife testified yesterday, telling the court she once walked in on her husband in bed with a 16 year old boy.

4/8 A Miami firefighter, Alexander Russo, accused of downloading kiddie porn on his laptop. Authorities say they found more than 200 illegal files on his laptop.

4/8 Miami Dade p0olice say they found a burned body in the street at SW 57th Avenue and Coral Way.

4/8 Kayla Mendoza, the young woman accused of killing 2 women in a November wrong way accident on the Sawgrass Expressway will go before a Broward judge today. She was just moved from the hospital to a Broward jail. Police say her blood alcohol level was twice the legal limit.

4/16 Miami police have identified the woman killed in a triple shooting, 62 year old Linda Ann Grant. Two men were also injured. Police are looking for the shooter.

4/17 A civilian panel has cleared 5 Miami police officers of any wrongdoing in the 2010 shooting death of Gibson Bellizaire in a 2010 gunfight in Little Haiti.

- 4/28 Fort Lauderdale homicide traffic detectives are investigating the death of a person struck and killed overnight: 53rd Street and North Federal Highway.
- 4/30 Davie police are searching for the suspect who shot and killed a man in the doorway of his apartment. Friends say the victim opened the door to someone who said he was a pizza deliveryman man, but instead shot the victim in the chest.
- 5/5 Miami police are investigating a robbery overnight at the Shell gas station NW 20th Street and 17th Avenue. A couple on a scooter was targeted, the man shot in the leg.
- 5/6 Two people arrested overnight, accused of running a marijuana lab in SW Miami Dade. Police say the lab was fully operational, built in a hole the size of a swimming pool in the backyard.
- 5/7 For the third time in 24 hours police bust a marijuana grow house, the latest in Hialeah.
- 5/12 Tinika Thompson says she and her boyfriend, Miami officer Carl Patrick were fighting over his gun when he shot and killed himself.
- 5/23 A law enforcement officer at the Miami V A hospital is accusing supervisors of ignoring crimes happening inside the hospital, including patients dealing drugs to other patients.
- 5/23 Bond denied for Jayyvon Leath, the 30 year old Plantation man accused of trying to kill his ex-girlfriend, her new boyfriend and a friend. Police say he was upset about their recent break up.
- 5/29 Tiniko Thompson, the woman accused of killing her boyfriend, a veteran Miami police officer, will be in bond court. She's charged with second degree murder for allegedly shooting and killing Officer Carl Patrick almost three weeks ago.
- 6/19 Marlon Hyde and Tarike Clarke are accused of cheating the Veteran's Administration out of thousands of dollars, allegedly overbilling the VA for courses at the Miramar training center. The two are charged with fraud, grand theft and conspiracy.

- 6/4 A second teenaged girl found dead in Oakland Park. Homicide detectives say the cases are not related.
- 6/24 Deadly mass shooting in Liberty City, two killed, 7 injured.
- 6/26 The youngest victim in the mass shooting, 16 year old Jessica Martin is expected to get out of the hospital in a couple of days. Police are still looking for the suspects.

- 5/12 Florida Memorial University organization, "Lions for Justice", along with the Miami Dream Defenders stage a rally at Stephen. P. Clark Center to protest the kidnapping of hundreds of Nigerian girls.
- 5/22 "Citizen's Right to Record Police Stops", know your rights, sponsored by the Fort Lauderdale/Broward NAACP.
- 5/23 Miami Beach police close Ocean Drive and restrict traffic to one way on Collins and Washington Avenues in advance of Urban Beach weekend activities.
- 6/4 Police arrest a suspect in an overnight hit and run accident in West Miami Dade: SW 8th Street and 57th Avenue.
- 6/4 The Broward Sheriff's Office investigating a suspicious death in Oakland Park, a woman's body found in a unit at the Bridgewater Place Apartments.
- 6/6 Broward Sheriff's Deputies shoot and kill an armed robbery suspect in Lauderhill. The search is on for a second suspect.
- 6/10 Authorities and under cover officers will be in force outside the American Airlines Arena tonight before Game 3 looking for people selling bogus tickets and unauthorized NBA gear.
- 6/16 Opening arguments could get underway today in Andrew James Rolle's murder trial. He is accused of killing Miami police Detective, James Walker in 2008.

6/26 The Trayvon Martin Foundation officially opens headquarters at Florida Memorial University

6/27Miami Gardens gun Buy Back Antioch Missionary Baptist Church 9AM – 1PM 21311 NW 34th Avenue Police offering up to \$200 cash for weapons

6/27 Opa Locka Gun Buy Back Mount Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church NW 27th Avenue and 150th Street Police are offering up to \$200 cash for weapons

4/7 Academy Award winning actress, Lupita Nyong'o has inked a deal to become the new face of Lancome. It's the first time a Black woman has represented the brand.

5/1 An NBA committee meets for the first time to officially discuss removing Clippers owner, Donald Sterling.

5/28 Elite River View apartments at NW 17th Avenue and 17th street in Miami slapped with a federal discrimination lawsuit. The fair housing organization, HOPE says testing on three separate occasions found Blacks were told no units were available, but an hour or so later when white or Hispanic applicants were shown apartments.

- 4/4 The Martin Luther King Economic Development Corporation marks the 46th anniversary of Dr. King's death with a candle light memorial and gospel concert.
- 4/21 At least one Republican leader calling a plan by a Florida lawmaker to split the joint FAMU/FSU Engineering school a 'slap in the face to the Black community'.
- 4/21 16 female members of the Congressional Black Caucus are asking Defense Secretary, Chuck Hagel to get rid of a brand new Army regulation that bans women from wearing their hair in natural styles that include twists, dreadlocks and cornrows.
- 4/29 The NBA releasing a 30 second spot affirming the league's commitment to diversity. It's called, "We Are One" and was released shortly after Commissioner Adam Silver banned embattled Clippers owner for life.
- 5/12 Miami Dolphins defensive back, Don Jones, suspended and fined for making critical remarks about Michael Sam the first openly gay player drafted by the NFL.
- 5/12 Embattled Los Angeles Clippers owner says successful black people don't support each other the same way Jews do.
- 6/18 MaryDell Guevara is the first Hispanic woman to lead the Miami Dade Corrections Department. She'll oversee six facilities and more than 5-thousand inmates.
- 6/18 A Black woman is making history in Miami Beach, Lauretta Hill appointed Deputy Chief of Police. She starts in August.
- 6/18 The U.S. has its first openly gay Black federal judge and he's from South Florida. Senators unanimously approved Darrin P. Gayles. He's currently a Miami Dade circuit judge.
- 6/18 Fort Lauderdale Commisssioners have passed a same sex marriage resolution in favor of gay marriage. It's symbolic. Florida has a constitutional amendment banning gay marriage.

ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS

4/14 Leaders at Florida A and M University are pushing back against a move by Republicans in the Florida Senate to split the joint FAMU, Florida State University School of Engineering. FAMU says the move will cost the state at least \$100 million dollars.

4/17 Amazon.com is about to start collecting sales tax in Florida, effective May 1st. It's a requirement now that Amazon is about to open a bricks and mortar facility in Florida. It'll be in Ruskin, Florida near Tampa, expected to be open in time for the holidays.

5/1 Amazon officially begins collecting sales tax in Florida.

5/5 Florida has one of the highest numbers of mothers struggling to make it financially. That is according to data from the National Women's Law Center.

5/28 Adjunct professors at Broward College have formed a new group, "The South Florida part Time Faculty Professional Association. They say some adjunct professors make so little money they qualify for food stamps.

6/4 Miami Dade Commissioners approve a new five year deal with the Heat to run the American Airlines Arena. It includes an increase to eight and a half million dollars a year to manage the facility. In exchange for the tax subsidy, the Heat will donate a million dollars a year to Miami Dade parks.

6/5 The Seminole Indians are looking to buy a bank. They would be the first tribe in Florida to own and run their own bank.

6/5 Sprint and AT&T are on the verge of a merger. Critics say the newly merged company would dominate the market and leave consumers with fewer choices. The potential deal is expected to face tough scrutiny from regulators.

6/9 Even though the nation's housing market is in recovery new research shows Florida still has the highest foreclosure rate in the country; Miami Fort Lauderdale and Pompano Beach are in the top 10.

6/18 The Miami Dolphins and Miami Dade Commissioners have finally cut a deal to renovate Sun Life Stadium. Owner Stephen Ross will pay \$350 million dollars to renovate the stadium. In exchange the county will pay the Dolphins for hosting sporting events commissioners believe will have a positive financial impact on the county.

6/19 The Miami Dade school board wants extra money from the federal government to deal with a spike in the number of migrant children coming to Miami across the U.S. Mexican border.

6/34 Starting July first it'll be easier for unemployed Floridians to get benefits. They will no longer be required to take skills test and no longer have to file for benefits exclusively online.

5/6 Bill Clinton expected to be in South Florida today for a fundraiser on behalf of gubernatorial hopeful, Charlie Crist.

5/29 Florida's Election Board ruling the Reverend Richard Dunn will not have to pay a \$5,500 dollar fine for turning in a campaign finance report late.

6/10 November 4th Broward voters will decide if they want to approve an \$800 million dollar bond to fix up the county's schools. School board members voted yesterday to put the issue on the ballot this fall.

6/25 North Miami voters will have three choices to replace suspended mayor, Lucie Tondreau. Former mayor, Kevin Burns, former mayoral candidate, Smith Joseph and former councilman, Jean Marcellus. The special election is scheduled for August 26th.

SEVERE WEATHER/NEWSCASTS

4/24 The 'People's Trust Insurance Company' has dropped thousands of South Florida customers, two months before the start of the hurricane season. A spokesperson calls the move, 'prudent exposure management'.

4/28 A second insurance company, "Heritage" has stopped taking new customers in several zip codes in Broward and Palm Beach counties. Executives are reducing their risk, a little over a month before the start of the hurricane season.

5/12 The National Weather Service has issued a rip current advisory. More than a dozen people were rescued yesterday at South Florida beaches.

5/23 Forecasters are predicting near normal or below normal activity this hurricane season, with eight to thirteen named storms, three to six hurricanes, possibly one or two major hurricanes.

6/9 Lightning strikes blamed for brush fire that has so far destroyed 2,500 acres of land in western Broward County. Lighting forced the closure of Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport yesterday for about an hour. Officials say it also bored a hole in one of the runways.

6/10 A massive brush fire in the western part of Broward County is now ten times as big as it was yesterday; now burning some 20-thousand acres. Because of a shift in the wind we will not experience the kind of smoke and haze we did yesterday.
