## **CRIME NEWSCASTS**

10/6 A second suspect arrested in connection with the mass shooting last month at the Liberty City Club, "The Spot". Police say they used Facebook to link 16 year old Jamiroquai Young to the first suspect, Will Campbell. 15 people were hurt in the violence.

10/10 The principal at Taravella High in Coral Springs says there is a plan in place to deal with any potential threat. It's been a difficult week, fights, fires, false alarms and the threat of violence today.

10/22 Miami Dade cops will no longer investigate fellow officers accused of shooting suspects. The FDLE will now head up those investigations as well as those of people who die in the custody of Miami Dade police. Commissioners approved the new rule yesterday.

10/23 Fort Lauderdale police arrest a suspect who allegedly shot at officers overnight. SWAT team and snipers called out to back up officers at an apartment complex on Harbor Drive near AIA.

10/27 Police are searching for a teacher accused of sexually abusing students at a private Cooper City School; 35 year old Tariq Ahmad.

11/4 15 year old D'Marcus Tucker charged with murdering Nicole Franco. BSO homicide detectives say he admitted breaking into her condo and fatally stabbing her.

11/14 Three suspects arrested for a string of sexual assaults and robberies in Miramar: Frankie Gatlin, Jr. Britton Blackwood and Kinshon Johnkins.

11/19 Twenty one people, mostly current or former Miami Dade College students arrested, accused of cheating running bogus tax returns through their financial aid accounts.

11/20 A gunman shoots and injures three students at Florida State University before he's shot and killed by police.

12/4 The serial carjacking suspect and alleged killer who police say ran amok in Broward County, 35 year old Gregory Moore, will be in front of a federal judge today in Fort Lauderdale.

12/10 BSO detectives are searching for the hit and run driver who struck and critically injured two brothers Monday night in Dania Beach. 14 year old Kelvron Florence and his 8 year old brother, Apollo Brown, Junior were critically injured.

12/11 A hit and run accident in Dania Beach now has deadly consequences. The youngest victim, 8 year old Apollo Brown has been declared brain dead. His older brother remains hospitalized in critical condition. Police are looking for a dark Toyota Tacoma with front end damage.

12/29 Miami police are searching for the suspect who shot and killed a 14 year old boy in Liberty City. Gabriel Figuera murdered by a drive by shooter.

12/29 Hollywood police are looking for the suspect who robbed a CVS store, 45-hundred block of Sheridan. Police say the gunman held the clerk and customers at gunpoint before taking cash from the register.

10/13 This week Miami Beach police expected to announce their officers will no longer be allowed to shoot at moving cars, unless someone in the vehicle shoots first or police can see a gun.

authorities on school lockdown procedures and how the Incident Command System will be used.

11/6 Town Hall Meeting 8PM, Liberty Square Housing Project Congresswoman, Frederica Wilson, Miami Dade Commissioner Audrey Edmonson, Miami Commissioner, Keon Hardemon are scheduled to meet with residents tonight to talk about potential solutions to the violence plaguing the community.

12/1 Miami police are searching for the suspect who shot and killed a teen near Dunbar Elementary, allegedly for his headphones. He was murdered in broad daylight at NW 4<sup>th</sup> Court and 20<sup>th</sup> Street.

## **DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS**

10/24 The ACLU is suing Miami Dade County. They want a federal judge to stop police from enforcing a law that keeps registered sex offenders from living within 2,500 feet of schools. The ACLU says the law leaves many of the offenders with virtually no place in the county to live.

10/27 Jury finds a security guard with a missing arm suffered discrimination. Alberto Tarud Saidh was removed after his first day at work for a community association.

10.30 The NAACP and the Committee Against Discrimination at FIU plan to deliver thousands of petitions to the schools President demanding Dr. Rosenberg rehire, engineering professor, Dr. Sylvan Jolibois. He is suing the University for racial discrimination.

12/1 President Obama is meeting with his cabinet today looking for methods to improve policing. He will also meet with young civil rights leaders, clergy and police from all over the country. Attorney General, Eric Holder will be in Atlanta today for the first stop of what's being called a national, "Building Community Trust Tour"

12/2 Miami Dade Commissioners expected to vote today on a measure that would expand the county's human rights law, making it illegal to discriminate against Transgender men and women.

12/11 For the first time a federal civil rights study has focused on the discrimination girls face when disciplined in public schools. Researchers say Black girls are more likely than those of any other race to get suspended and Black girls with darker skin are punished more harshly than those with light skin.

### **HEALTH/NEWSCASTS**

10/7 Parents are being urged to watch their children for signs of the  
Enterovirus. The first confirmed case in Florida, a 10 year old girl  
hospitalized in Tampa.

10/9 A second case of the Enterovirus has been confirmed in  
Florida, an 8 year old boy in the Panhandle.

10/14 New concerns raised about the need for CPR training in the wake of the weekend drowning death of a 9 year old Jacques Osbourne at a birthday party in Southwest Ranches.

10/15 Florida spending \$7 million dollars to buy more tickets to test for Ebola and more protective gear for workers.

10/15 Frontier Airlines says it has gone above and beyond CDC recommendations to decontaminate a plane with a nurse who cared for an Ebola patient. The plane made a stop in Fort Lauderdale.

10/17 Governor Rick Scott is scheduled to hold a news conference at the Broward Aviation Department to ask the CDC to share information it's learned in Dallas with healthcare providers in Florida.

10/17 A passenger on the Carnival Cruise ship Magic quarantined. It's believed the passenger is lab worker who handled specimens from the Ebola patient who died at a Dallas hospital. Belize is refusing to allow the ship into port.

10/22 The federal government is urging Florida drivers impacted by a recall (defective airbag) to take action immediately. 6 million vehicles are affected. The problem is made worse by heat and humidity. Safecar.gov

10/22 Fort Lauderdale Commissioners have approved a new law that puts restrictions on when and how homeless people can be fed. There are big changes in outdoor feeding programs. Most will be required to be at least 500 feet away from a residence. Restrictions are not as tough on churches who feed the homeless inside.

11/11 Cigna has agreed to put a cap on the cost of HIV and AIDS drugs for people who have coverage through the Affordable Care Act, \$200 dollars a month.

12/3 The CDC is warning Americans this year's flu shot probably won't protect you. Scientists say most cases are being caused by

H3N2 and that the strain has mutated and does not respond to the vaccine.

12/3 Researchers looking into whether yogurt can help lower the risk of Type two diabetes.

12/10 A coalition of school districts, including Miami Dade Schools, announcing tougher standards for chicken. It's one of the most popular items in the cafeteria. The new standards call for, among other things, the chickens be raised humanely, fed a vegetarian diet and no antibiotics.

12/15 This is the last day to sign up for Obamacare if you want coverage that starts by January 1<sup>st</sup>.
