CRIME NEWSCASTS

4/4 Police are looking for suspects and answers after two people with gunshot wounds drove to a NW Miami Dade fire station for help: NW 27th Avenue and 65th Street.

4/6 A former Broward youth pastor and convicted sexual predator, Jeffrey London has died in prison. His lawyer wants an investigation.

4/6 Police are investigating two deadly shootings: 27 year old Roderick Sweeting shot and killed in Miami Gardens: NW 25th Avenue near 176th Terrace.

An unnamed teen killed in Miami: NW 10th Avenue and First Street.

4/8 Prosecutors file formal charges again Tameka Thompson, the mother of one of the three teens charged with 6 year old King Carter's murder.

4/13 A Coconut Creek police officer, Daniel Rush charged with sexually abusing two boys. Investigators fear there may be more victims.

4/18 A 76 year old Hialeah landlord accused of killing a tenant during a rent dispute.

4/18 An Amber Alert issued and the search is on for a missing five year old; 5 year old Julian Kylie. Coconut Creek police believe his mother took him. She lost custody of the boy earlier this month.

4/28 Miami police chief holding a news conference overnight after an officer shot and killed a man in Little Havana. Police say the suspect was stabbing a woman.

4/28 Recalled Miami Dade Mayor and former police director, Carlos Alvarez will be in front of a Miami Dade judge this

morning. He's charged with battery for allegedly hitting and spitting on his girlfriend.

4/28 A suspect arrested for the murder of a Miami Dade corrections officer, Daveon Hall. Police say 29 year old Brian Fairweather shot and killed Hall in a fit of rage and jealousy. Hall was dating Fairweather's estranged wife.

5/2 Miami Dade Commissioner, Jose "Pepe" Diaz' DUI trial could wrap up today. He was busted last year in the Keys. The arresting officer says he could barely walk straight and dropped the Sheriff's name in an effort to avoid arrest.

5/5 Jordan Parsons the 25 year old MMA fighter struck by a hit and run driver in Delray Beach has died. Police are looking for a silver Range rover Sport with a missing mirror on the driver's side and headlight damage.

5/5 Florida's Supreme Court hearing arguments to end the death penalty. The court hearing the case after the U.S. Supreme Court ruled Florida's death penalty was unconstitutional because it allows judges, not juries to make the life or death decision.

5/6 One person is dead, three injured after a shooting in Allapattah: NW 19th Terrace and 21st Avenue. Police suspect the violence may have been in retaliation for a recent homicide.

5/11 The search continues for the suspect who shot a college football player, Gregory Bryant, on I-95 Saturday night. He's been declared brain dead, but remains on life support.

5/23 Miami Dade police are investigating a shooting at Club Climaxx: NW 27th Avenue and 119th Street. Club goes not allowed to leave while authorities investigate.

5/23 Broward Commission holds so called, "Ban the Box" meeting. It would prevent potential employees with convictions from having to check yes, by delaying the background check inquiry until later in the hiring process.

6/1 Two of the four Braddock Senior High School students accused of sexually assaulting an incapacitated 21 year old woman on prom night, Luis Rozell and Julio Fernandez, are free on bond.

6/3 Nouman Raja, the former Palm Beach Gardens cop who shot and killed Corey Jones in October, is scheduled to bond out of jail today. He's charged with manslaughter and attempted murder.

6/6 Miami Gardens police searching for the suspect who shot and killed a recent Nova Southeastern University grad, Alexandra Dean.

6/8 Homicide detectives are working a triple shooting overnight in South Miami, SW 68th Street, near 58th place. One person, Larry Edwards, a father of two killed, two other victims are being treated.

6/13 This morning there will be a hearing to determine if a BSO Deputy, Peter Parazza can use Florida's "Stand Your Ground Law" as a defense. He is charged with first degree manslaughter for Germaine McBean's death three years ago.

6/21 The judge and attorneys in Deputy Parazza's case will visit the scene of the crime today – to get a better idea of what happened when Parazza shot and killed McBean three years ago.

6/21 Attorney General Loretta Lynch will be in Orlando for an FBI briefing about the FBI investigation into the mass shooting last week.

6/21 The West Palm Beach teen accused of practicing medicine without a license, Malachi Love Robinson has until Thursday to find a new attorney. His trial is scheduled to begin next month.

5/11 The United States Postal Inspection Service is offering a \$25,000 dollar reward for information that leads to the arrest and conviction of two men who robbed a letter carrier in Pompano Beach: Powerline Road and Atlantic Boulevard.

6/8 The Children's Services Council of Broward County sharing updates and new requirements for Child Care Regulations and Criminal Background Screening for Child Care Personnel.

DISCRIMINATION-RACE MATTERS/NEWSCASTS

4/4 HUD expected to announce new guidelines today. People can’t
be denied housing solely based on arrest records. Under the new
rules criminal history can still be taken into account, but other
factors would be taken into consideration.

4/6 For the first time there will be rainbow street sign toppers on
Miami Beach for Gay Pride events this weekend. It’s Friday
through Sunday. Events include beach parties, concerts, a showcase
for drag queens and the Sunday Gay Pride Parade.

4/7 John U. Lloyd State Park in Dania Beach has a new name: Von Mizell-Eula Johnson State Park renamed in honor of two civil rights activists who led wade ins and helped put an end to segregation on South Florida beaches. The new name replaces that of John Lloyd, the then Broward Attorney, who did everything he could to keep the beaches segregated.

4/14 Miami Beach Mayor, Phillip Levine one of the latest people to add his voice to those demanding North Carolina and Mississippi get rid of new laws that discriminate against the gay, lesbian and transgender community. Levine calling for a ban that would prevent city officials to travel to either state on city business until the laws are changed.

5/11 Miami Herald poll found whites in Miami Dade think traffic is the biggest problem. Blacks site shootings involving young people. Respondents also thought parents of accused shooters should bear the brunt of the responsibility.

5/12 George Zimmerman is auctioning the weapon he used to kill Trayvon Martin; starting bid \$5,000. The pistol was just returned by the justice department.

5/18 George Zimmerman is attacking Trayvon Martin's parents. During an explosive interview with "The Daily Beast" Zimmerman said Sybrina Fulton and Tracy Martin did a poor job of raising their son and "have done everything they could to capitalize on his death."

5/18 New government data shows American schools are becoming more segregated by race and income. Researchers found segregation more than doubled over a 13 year period ending in 2014.

5/18 A driver for an NFL player says he was thrown out of Neiman Marcus in Bal Harbour because he made a white employee nervous. The Miami Herald reporting Sniders Jean-Jacques was dressed in a Prada suit and watch. He says he was offered lunch, a \$500 dollar gift card and an apology for his unpleasant experience.

5/23 The University of Miami set to get a chairman to head up a department devoted to atheism; a first. The donor says religious studies are common at most schools and he is hoping to help eliminate discrimination against atheists.

5/25 A Fort Lauderdale cop, James Wells, fired for sending racist videos and text messages won't get his job back. An arbitrator ruled the city was right when it fired him in March of 2015. Two other Fort Lauderdale cops, Jason Holding and Christopher Sousa are also trying to get their jobs back. A fourth, Alex Alvarez resigned in 2015 before the investigation wrapped up.

6/10 After four decades in politics, State Senator Gwen Margolis announcing she's getting out of politics and will not run for re-election. Margolis making the announcement after making offensive and racist comments about her competitors.

6/17 June 17th marks one year to the day since a young white supremacist, Dylan Roof, shot and killed 9 people during bible study at Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, South Carolina.

6/23 The founder of Bethune Cookman University, Mary McCleod Bethune's name is on a short list of candidates to replace the confederate general's statue that currently represents Florida in the United States Capitol. The founder of Publix and environmentalist Marjory Stoneman Douglas are the other two. If Bethune is selected her statue would be the first of an African American woman to represent a state at the capitol.

ECONOMY/NEWSCASTS

4/8 Sun Life Stadium has a new name, for now. The Sun Life naming rights deal expired last month, so until a new sponsor is named the facility will be known as "The New Miami Stadium".

4/13 A coalition of pastors protesting plans to tear down and rebuild the Liberty Square Housing project. They allege Miami Dade Mayor, Carlos Gimenez was not up front about the bidding process.

5/2 Florida Governor Rick Scott is in California, visiting three cities: Los Angeles, San Francisco and San Jose. He is trying to lure business owners to leave California now that it's instituted a 15 dollar a hour minimum wage.

5/6 Miami Dade Mayor, Carlos Gimenez telling Governor Rick Scott the city is on the verge of financial collapse. Opa Locka's Mayor and some commissioners are the target of a federal probe for allegedly using city money for personal gain.

5/18 The Obama administration expected to announce a new rule on overtime pay. It would make millions more Americans eligible for overtime pay.

5/24 The City's Finance Director says the city is so broke it can't pay its bills and that Opa Locka's recovery plan is not enough to get it back on track.

6/3 When Miami Dade teachers head back to school next year, they'll do so with a new contract. In addition to a raise, there will be no increase in the cost of insurance and prescription medications.

6/22 FEMA denying Governor Scott's request to declare a state of emergency in Florida as a result of the mass shooting in Orlando. Had a state of emergency been declared, Florida would have received \$5 million dollars in federal funding, money the governor says would have been used for, among other things, preventing future terrorist attacks.

4/14 Federal Housing Finance Agency announces a new loan modification program that will help potentially hundreds of thousands of borrowers stay in their homes.

5/5 The Miami Beach Mayor wants to increase the city's minimum wage to \$13.31 an hour. The increase would be phased in over the next four years. The proposed increase is a challenge to current state laws.

5/6 Small Business Saturday in NW Fort Lauderdale events include: a health fair, food trucks, professional services and art spaces 200 Sistrunk Boulevard

5/11 The Staples/Office Depot merger called off. The companies making the announcement after a Federal judge blocked the \$6 billion dollar deal. The judge said it would create a monopoly and hurt competition. Office Depot's corporate headquarters are located in Boca Raton.

5/12 Miami Beach Commissioners take next step toward setting a city-wide minimum wage. It would start at \$10.31 per hour next year, increase a dollar every year until it's \$13.31 by June of 2020. A final vote scheduled for June 8th.

HEALTH/NEWSCASTS

4/4 The FDA slapped with a lawsuit, the government agency accused of ignoring safety warnings about genetically engineered salmon.

4/5 The Lennar corporate building in West Miami Dade will remain shut down while a second round of tests is conducted to make sure it's carbon monoxide free. More than 400 employees were evacuated yesterday.

4/15 Health experts are divided on whether women should be warned that the only way to prevent having a baby with potential brain damage is to wait to get pregnant until concerns about the Zika Virus are over.

5/4 Three new Zika cases have been confirmed in Florida. Health experts fear the U.S. is not ready for an outbreak. Florida Senator Bill Nelson working with a panel of experts looking for possible solutions, including a genetically modified mosquito.

5/11 Governor Rick Scott is going to Washington to try to get close to \$2 billion dollars in federal funding to fight the Zika virus. Florida has the most cases in the country. Two new cases reported in Miami Dade bring the state total to 109.

5/18 Plantation General Hospital is relocating to Davie. The state has approved the move to a new facility that would be built at Nova Southeastern University. The \$220 million dollar complex will be part of an academic village that includes a teaching hospital and a research facility. Construction could start next summer and it could open the following year.

5/22 Experts say it is not if, but when the Zika virus arrives in the United States. More than 500 Americans have it. Most cases were acquired while traveling out of the country.

5/24 Parents and caregivers are encouraged to take extra measures to make sure they're not leaving children in the car – this after an 11 month old was found dead in the family car in front of her parent's Hialeah home.

6/3 Three more Zika cases reported in South Florida, one in Miami Dade and 2 in Broward. The total in the state: 165: all contracted while traveling outside the U.S.

6/6The FDA approves the first implant created to help people "beat" an addiction to opioids. It was developed at a Miami research institute.

6/10 Women who live in areas affected by the Zika virus should not get pregnant to avoid having babies with birth defects. That warning coming from the World Health Organization. More than 100 cases have been confirmed in Florida.

6/17 Walt Disney World is adding alligator warning signs near all bodies of water on the property. The change coming after an alligator drowned two year old Lance Graves Tuesday night.

6/23 The CDC now says the nasal version of the flu shot, Flu Mist, is not effective and basically hasn't worked for the past three years. There was no clear explanation on why the CDC now says it doesn't work. The mist was especially popular with kids. The CDC now says the best way to fight the flu is to take the shot.
