4/29/22	6:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Focus on the Family: Connecting with Your Grandchildren</i> – Guest Cheri Fuller offers practical advice for Grandparents hoping to create lasting memories with their grandkids, while also serving as a Godly influence in their lives.
5/11/22	12:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Focus on the Family: Giving God the Reins in your Foster Parenting Journey</i> – Guest Jamie Finn’s desire to protect vulnerable children led her to become a foster mom, but she soon realized her mama-bear tendency could hinder their growth: encouragement to release foster parenting to God.
6/4/22	9:30 am	30 min.	<i>Parenting Today’s Teens: When Parents and Teens Battle Over Control</i> – Host Mark Gregston helps parents avoid the exhaustion of extended tug-o-war with teens by encouraging give-and-take and strategic relinquishing of control.

5/13/22	1:00 pm	30 min.	<i>Sekulow: ACLJ</i> Chief Counsel Jay Sekulow visits with US Senator Marsha Blackburn regarding Biden Administration immigration policies that she expresses are affecting increases in drug trafficking, human trafficking, and illegal entrance of violent criminals into the United States.
5/27/22	1:00 pm	3 min.	<i>Legislative Update: Sex is not Gender – Montana Family Foundation</i> President Jeff Laszloffy analyzes the impact and reasoning for a change in the wording of a Montana law regulating how gender is noted and/or altered on birth certificates.
6/2/22	5:55 pm	5 min.	<i>Breakpoint: Religious Freedom is Good for Everyone for Many Reasons –</i> Host John Stonestreet posits and demonstrates that societies with a high degree of religious freedom (and in particular where Christianity is not suppressed) are less corrupt, exploitative and dangerous for all citizens.
6/15/22	1:00 pm	30 min.	<i>Sekulow: The FED Fights Back --</i> Chief Counsel Jay Sekulow and the <i>ACLJ</i> team analyze the recent announcement of the biggest interest rate hike by the <i>FED</i> since 1994, and the potential effects on inflation, stock market, workforce, and financing.
6/28/22	1: 00 pm	30 min.	<i>Sekulow: Another Major Supreme Court Victory –</i> <i>ACLJ</i> team members analyze the US Supreme Court’s overturn of a Washington State appeal’s court ruling which had defended Bremerton School District’s firing of a high school football coach for his practice of mid-field personal prayer after games. How both free-speech and free-exercise clauses applied.

Host Rob West lists common locations money is left unclaimed, government and non-governmental agencies that can help, and steps to take to ease the financial stress of a loved one’s passing.
5/4/22	6:00 pm	30 min.	<i>Adventures in Odyssey: A Good and Faithful Servant</i> – A tale encouraging kids of all ages to save deliberately, spend thoughtfully, and give generously. Jimmy and Donna Barclay demonstrate that budgeting may not come easy at first but is worth a ledger’s weight in gold and peace of mind.
5/7/22	9:30 am	30 min.	<i>Parenting Today’s Teens: Your Teen Needs a Job</i> – Advice from host Mark Gregston on the best way to help your teen manage money, gain responsibility and hone a real-world skill: a summer job.

5/28/22	9:30 am	30 min.	<i>Parenting Today's Teens: How to Rebuild Communication That's Broken Down</i> – Psychologist and host Mark Gregston offers hope for rebuilding positive communication with teenagers, whether conversation is strained, toxic, or not really happening at all.
6/1/22	12:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Focus on the Family: Giving up People-Pleasing for a Better Way to Live</i> – Host Jim Daly addresses when good intentions of helping others become destructive: exploring what people-pleasing is, what causes it, and how to un-learn this behavior.
