Background: Ft. Logan National Cemetery will host a public wreath laying ceremony as part of

the World War II 70th Anniversary Commemorative Weekend sponsored by Military Order of Purple Heart and in coordination with the “Keep the Spirit of ’45 Alive” organization. A Wreath will be laid to honor those members of the Greatest Generation who are interred at the cemetery. “Keep the Spirit of ’45 Alive” is an initiative that recognizes the achievements of the men and women who endured the Great Depression, fought and won World War II and then laid the foundations for a better world. Aug. 14, 1945 is recognized as the official end of WWII.

VA operates 131 national cemeteries, one national Veterans burial ground and 33 soldiers’ lots and monument sites in 40 states and Puerto Rico. More than 4 million Americans, including Veterans of every war and conflict, are buried in VA’s national cemeteries. VA also provides funding to establish, expand, improve, and maintain 95 Veterans cemeteries in 45 states and territories including tribal trust lands, Guam, and Saipan. For Veterans not buried in a VA national cemetery, VA provides headstones, markers or medallions to commemorate their service. In 2014, VA honored more than 356,000 Veterans and their loved ones with memorial benefits in national, state, tribal and private cemeteries.

NATIONAL POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY SUPPORTED BY
SOUTH METRO DENVER CHAPTER 1106 OF
VIETNAM VETERANS OF AMERICA

- More than 83,000 Americans remain missing from WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Cold War, and the Gulf Wars/other conflicts*
- 75% of the losses are located in the Asia-Pacific, and over 41,000 of the missing are presumed lost at sea (i.e. ship losses, known aircraft water losses, etc.).*
- More than 1,600 Vietnam veterans remain unaccounted*

Centennial, CO—Sept. 8, 2015—Chapter 1106, the South Metro Denver chapter of the non-profit Vietnam Veterans of America, at its monthly meeting on Sept. 3, reaffirmed its support for our country's prisoners of war (POW) and those missing in action (MIA). This remembrance under the banner "National POW/MIA Recognition Day", is celebrated on Sept. 18, 2015.

Observances of National POW/MIA Recognition Day are held across the country on military installations, ships at sea, state capitols, schools and veterans' facilities. It is traditionally observed on the third Friday in September each year. This observance is one of six days throughout the year that Congress has mandated the flying of the National League of Families' POW/MIA flag. The others are Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day.

The flag is to be flown at major military installations, national cemeteries, all post offices, VA medical facilities, the World War II Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the official offices of the secretaries of state, defense and veterans affairs, the director of the selective service system and the White House.

A Pentagon ceremony for National POW/MIA Recognition Day will be held Friday, Sept. 18, 2015. This ceremony featured troops from each of the military services.

Lee White, president of Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 1106, South Metro Denver said "Our core mission is always to remember our brothers and sisters, whether that be in assisting in rehabilitation, medical, Agent Orange and PTSD issues, or supporting those who never returned."

“Since 1973, the remains of more than 1,000 Americans killed in the Vietnam War have been identified and returned to their families for burial with full military honors” White added.

For more than two decades the U.S. has conducted joint field activities with the governments of Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia to recover the remains of missing Americans. Throughout these countries, field teams continue to investigate crash and burial sites, as well as interview locals to gain additional knowledge. The U.S. also continues to obtain access to historical wartime records and archives that provide information relevant to the fates of missing Americans.

Today, more than 1,600 Americans remain unaccounted for from the conflict.




