Clear Channel Television – examples of meeting the public interest through localism

Albany, NY Clear Channel's FOX affiliate **WXXA-TV, FOX23** helps raise millions of dollars each year for two of the largest health organizations in our area serving New York's Capital Region, Western Massachusetts and Southern Vermont as the telethon production partner for both **The Center for Disability Services (CDS)** and **The Children's Hospital at Albany Medical Center**. In its 50th year, The CDS, which is totally locally produced by WXXA-TV without any national program content, raised over 1.7 million dollars allowing The CDS to help 15,000 people and their families with disabilities. In its 26th year, the Children's Miracle Network Telethon to benefit The Children's Hospital at Albany Medical Center relies on its local broadcast TV partner to raise the millions necessary to "make miracles" for our local community. We helped raise 2.5 million dollars this year and it all stays here in the Capital District.

FOX23 also works with dozens of regional charitable organizations through promotion and PSAs: The Food Bank of NE New York, Special Olympics, American Diabetes Association, American Red Cross, Liza's Legacy, Coats For Kids, Circle of Life Camp, Prevent Child Abuse NYS, Project Roadblock, Team in Training – Leukemia Society, Community AIDS Partnership of NENY, Black History Month, The Albany Police and Fire Departments and others.

FOX23 launched a year round program called **Buddy Check 23** designed to educate and build awareness to the importance of monthly self breast examinations as well as annual check ups in the prevention and detection of breast cancer. Hosted by **FOX23** News Anchor Ann Hughes, the program features numerous news stories each month as well as a monthly reminder on the 23rd to perform your monthly self examination and encourage your buddies to do likewise. Additionally information on the program is posted on our website www.fox23news.com.

As a local version of **America's Most Wanted** that airs on the FOX network, **FOX23** News airs a weekly feature Saturdays in our 10pm newscast called **The Capital Region's Most Wanted** where we feature local fugitives wanted by the US Marshall's office in Albany. **FOX23** News viewer leads have led to the successful capture of many of the criminals making our area safer.

WXXA-TV's weekly public affairs program **FOX23 In Focus** airs Sundays at 10am after the **FOX News Sunday** program and deals with all issues local, crime, education, healthcare, employment, diversity, education, fund raising, the arts, culture and the wellbeing of the Capital Region. Also on Sunday mornings is a program produced by **FOX23** called **NanoNow** which educates viewers on the nano-sciences and industry in our area.

WXXA-TV also produces two local sports programs to serve our viewers; the **FOX23 High School Sports Show** and **FOX23 Fast Track**. **The FOX23 High School Sports Show** airs for 30 weeks September from March and airs Friday nights at 11pm and Saturday nights at 10:30pm. We cover all sports local, boys and girls, providing more coverage and exposure for these schools. **FOX23 Fast Track** also airs for 30 weeks from April through October Sunday nights at 10:30pm and is dedicated to serving the local auto racing fans with coverage of the local dirt racing tracks as well as NASCAR. Both programs are award winning broadcasts that serve our community.
