However, when you factor in more than 20,000</p>

Taking effect in July, the law cuts phone usage during instructional time. For most schools in our area, this is not much of a change. House Bill 379 also prohibits the use of TikTok on district owned devices and no school activities can be promoted on the app. School districts must also prevent students from using social media sites on district owned computers and servers.

					<p>involving a school bus in Ohio is reviving a debate over whether that should change. In 2021, the US Senate introduced the "School Bus Safety Act". It would have required seat belts on buses nationwide, but it went nowhere. In Florida, school buses built after 2000 are required to have seatbelts.</p>

They handle nearly all the money for the state's 4 billion dollar school voucher program. But the Phoenix Learning Academy in Pensacola is one of many schools in the state still waiting for their money. It caters to special needs students and needs the money to operate. The</p>

					Principal tells parents the school hasn't paid its bills since the beginning of August.

					<p>disease. The FDA approval means the drug will now be covered for most Medicare patients with early signs of cognitive problems. The drug costs more than 26 thousand dollars before insurance. Experts say the drug will not benefit people with more advanced forms of Alzheimer's.</p>
Health/Baptist System Grant	Channel 3 News – 10pm	July 18th	10:00pm	:57	<p>Today the James M. Cox Foundation awarded Baptist Hospital a half a million dollar grant to improve patient safety. The money will pay for a virtual patient monitoring system known as Care-View. It uses cameras, infrared technology, and virtual bedrails to prevent a wide range of in-patient risks. The system will be installed in the main hospital and the behavioral health unit. The new Baptist campus on Brent Lane in Pensacola is slated to open this fall.</p>

Health/Water Toxicity	Channel 3 News – 10pm	August 8th	10:00pm	:49	<p>With excessive heat, dehydration is always a concern. Doctors say water is the key to staying hydrated. But too much water in a short time frame can be deadly. The warning comes after an Indiana woman died from drinking too much water. Ashley Summers drank about four water bottles in 20 minutes, passed out, and was taken to the hospital because of water intoxication. The condition is called Hyponatremia. It's when the body's electrolyte balance is thrown off and the sodium levels in the blood are abnormally low.</p>
Health/West Nile cases in NWFL	Channel 3 News – 10pm	August 16th	10:00pm	:27	<p>Escambia County is under Mosquito-borne illness alert after reporting this year's first cases of the West Nile virus. The Florida Department of Health has reported two cases so far. The CDC says the virus is the leading cause of mosquito-borne disease in the US.</p>

					<p>Symptoms include high fever, headache, neck stiffness, coma, convulsions, muscle weakness, and even paralysis. Last year, Escambia and Santa Rosa counties reported just one case each. The state only had 9 reported cases.</p>

On September 23rd, the hospital plans to begin moving up to 200 patients using 16 ambulances on continuous rotations.</p>
Health/Pine Forest Health Clinic	Channel 3 News – 10pm	September 22nd	10:00pm	:48	<p>Pine Forest High School now has a health clinic on its campus. The Escambia County Public School District partnered with Community Health Northwest Florida, the Children’s Home Society and the</p>

					University of West Florida to open the clinic. It provides wellness checks, acute care, vaccines and other healthcare services. The clinic is open to anyone up to the age of 21.

So far, there have been 14 homicides this year in Pensacola and Escambia County. More gun violence over the weekend has sparked more conversations on how to stop it. Chief Eric Randall says the police cannot fix the problem alone. Randall says a number of gun crimes in the area are the result of drugs. Santa Rosa and Okaloosa Counties have a combined four homicides since the beginning of the year.

The judge barred "Rare Breed Triggers" from selling any more of its triggers until further notice.
