He was able to 'attend church' for the first time in 30 years. Up to this point, he had not been a person of faith, but the online worship and teaching has caused him to start having conversations about God with his grandson. Consider the incredible international connection - God used a generous church based in Oklahoma to assist a church in Australia to share Jesus with a man in a nursing

					home, who did not have a relationship with Christ. That's just one amazing eternal connection as a result of this free technology!
