



Regular Programs & News Series Descriptions

Consumer Reports: WHIO-TV airs this segment in News Center 7 newscasts. Reports are designed to warn consumers about various items of concern. Subjects will include recalls, product safety advice and general consumer advice.

Miami Valley's Most Wanted: Hosted by WHIO-TV's Cheryl McHenry, this weekly segment highlights criminals from around the Miami Valley that are wanted by the local sheriff's departments. WHIO-TV invites viewers, if they have seen these criminals, to call their local sheriff. The idea is to get viewer involvement into fighting back against crime by helping law enforcement get more criminals off the street. Thursday at 5:00PM.

NEW INFORMATION... A PIQUA FATHER ACCUSED OF CRITALLY INJURING HIS INFANT SON IN NOVEMBER IS INDICTED BY A MIAMI COUNTY GRAND JURY 19-YEAR-OLD BRENT HENNON THE SECOND HAS BEEN IN JAIL SINCE HIS ARREST IN NOVEMBER. HE'S ACCUSED OF ASSAULTING HIS TWO-WEEK-OLD SON MARLEY HENNON.. POLICE SAY THE INFANT SUFFERED MULTIPLE SKULL FRACTURES AS WELL AS RIB FRACTURES WHILE IN HIS FATHER'S CARE. HE WAS TAKEN TO DAYTON CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL IN CRITICAL CONDITION. HENNON'S BEING HELD ON HALF A MILLION DOLLARS BOND.

THAT FORMER GERMANTOWN SOCCER COACH WHO HAD A SEXUAL RELATIONONSHIP WITH A TEENAGE PLAYER THEN WENT ON THE RUN IS SCHEDULED TO BE SENTENCED TOMORROW. JUSTIN SMITH WENT ON TRIAL IN OCTOBER.. ACCUSED OF HAVING A RELATIONSHIP WITH A 14-YEAR-OLD GIRL BEFORE THE JUDGE CONVICTED HIM, SMITH CUT OFF HIS ANKLE BRACELET AND FLED. HE WAS CAPTURED LAST MONTH IN FLORIDA WHILE TRYING TO MEET A WOMAN THROUGH A DATING WEBSITE. NEW CHARGES OF CHILD PORN AGAINST SMITH WERE ADDED EARLIER THIS WEEK. HE WILL BE SENTENCED FOR HIS PREVIOUS CONVICTION TOMORROW -- AS WELL AS ARRAIGNED ON THESE NEWEST CHARGES.

A FORMER CENTERVILLE HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER IS FACING AN INDICTMENT THIS MORNING, NEARLY TWO YEARS AFTER HE ALLEGEDLY HAD A SEXUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A STUDENT. A GRAND JURY RETURNED AN INDICTMENT WEDNESDAY FOR 29-YEAR-OLD SAMUEL GLENN. GLENN TAUGHT AND COACHED BASEBALL AND GOLF AT CENTERVILLE HIGH SCHOOL. COURT DOCUMENTS ACCUSE HIM OF HAVING A SEXUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A TEENAGE STUDENT IN JANUARY 20-17. BUT POLICE SAY HE WASN'T CHARGED UNTIL NOW BECAUSE THE VICTIM CHOSE NOT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE INVESTIGATION. RECENTLY, THOUGH, INVESTIGATORS GOT NEW INFORMATION LEADING TO A SEXUAL BATTERY CHARGE. JOHN DAVIS, CENTERVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT: **"AT THE TIME THE VICTIM HAD VARIOUS REASONS WHY THEY DIDN'T WANT TO PURSUE ...BUT THOSE THINGS, THOSE CIRCUMSTANCES CHANGED, SO WE WERE ABLE TO GO AHEAD WITH THE CASE AND MOVE FORWARD."** GLENN IS DUE IN COURT FOR THE FIRST TIME JANUARY 17TH, AT WHICH POINT HE'S SCHEDULED FOR ARRAIGNMENT.

JANUARY 3, 2019 5PM JUSTIN SMITH SENTENCING

OUR HOPE IS, ONCE YOU HEAR OUR FINAL THOUGHTS, YOU HAVE ZERO HESITATION IMPOSING THE MAXIMUM SENTENCE AVAILABLE FOR THIS PEDOPHILE. JUSTIN SMITH WILL SERVE 12 YEARS IN PRISON FOR SEXUALLY ABUSING A 14-YEAR-OLD GIRL HE COACHED ON A TRAVEL SOCCER TEAM. NEWSCENTER SEVEN'S MIKE CAMPBELL FOLLOWED THIS CASE START TO FINISH. HE IS LIVE AT THE COUNTY COURTHOUSE WITH WHAT ELSE THE VICTIM'S MOTHER SAID IN COURT TODAY. THIS WAS THE FINAL STEP OF AN INVESTIGATION AND TRIAL THAT HAD TWISTS AND TURNS AT ALMOST EVERY MOMENT. EVEN TODAY, THE JUDGE ANNOUNCED THAT SMITH'S LAWYERS TRIED, UNSUCCESSFULLY, TO HAVE HIM REMOVED FROM THE CASE. THAT ALLOWED HIM TO MOVE FORWARD WITH SENTENCING BUT NOT BEFORE EH GAVE THE 14-YEAR-OLD VICTIM'S MOTHER A CHANCE TO EXPRESS HER FEELINGS. WE NEVER THOUGHT A WOLF IN SHEEP'S CLOTHING WOULD BE ABLE TO DISGUISE HIMSELF AS A FRIEND AND COACH.

A FORMER SOCCER COACH BEGGED FOR MERCY DURING HIS SENTENCING FOR SEXUALLY ABUSING A 14-YEAR-OLD GIRL HE COACHED ON A TRAVEL SOCCER TEAM. JUSTIN SMITH ASKED THE JUDGE TO SEE HIS ACTIONS AS ONE MISTAKE IN AN ENTIRE LIFE OF SERVICE TO HIS COMMUNITY. NEWSCENTER SEVEN'S MIKE CAMPBELL HAS FOLLOWED THIS CASE FROM THE START AND WAS THERE DURING SMITH'S SENTENCING. HE JOINS US LIVE WITH DETAILS ABOUT HOW THE JUDGE DISREGARDED SMITH'S PLEAS AND HANDED DOWN CLOSE TO THE MAXIMUM SENTENCE POSSIBLE. MIKE... THE JUDGE GAVE SMITH A TOTAL OF 12 YEARS ON THE THREE COUNTS HE SENTENCED THE RUNAWAY COACH ON. SMITH DID NOT TALK AT ALL ABOUT THE 45 DAYS HE SPENT ON THE RUN AFTER TAKING OFF IN THE MIDDLE OF HIS TRIAL

JOHN FOUST GOT THREE YEARS FOR IMPROPERLY TOUCHING A CHILD EIGHT YEARS AGO. THAT VICTIM.. NOW 17 OFFERED TESTIMONY IN FOUST'S DEFENSE. SHE SAID BECAUSE OF HIS SUPPORT IN THE COMMUNITY, HIS PRISON SENTENCE DID MORE HARM TO HER AND HER FAMILY THAN GOOD. FOUST WILL HAVE A RELEASE HEARING THIS MONTH.

WHEN ELDRIGE GOT TO THE LOCATION HE WAS ARRESTED. HE FACES SEVERAL FELONY CHARGES.

TONIGHT A WISCONSIN MAN FACES HOMICIDE AND KIDNAPPING CHARGES IN CONNECTION WITH THE DISAPPEARANCE OF 13-YEAR-OLD JAYME CLOSS. SHE DISAPPERED IN OCTOBER WHEN HER PARENTS WERE MURDERED. BUT YESTERDAY POLCE SAID SHE ESCAPED FROM THE MAN AND A WOMAN FOUND HER. INVESTIGATORS SAID THEY FOUND A SHOTGUN THEY THINK HE USED TO SHOOT HER PARENTS. 13-YEAR-OLD JAYME CLOSS WAS FOUND ALIVE 88 DAYS AFTER A STRANGER KIDNAPPED HER FROM HER WISCONSIN HOME. AUTHORITIES SAY THE SAME MAN, JAKE PATTERSON, SHOT BOTH HER PARENTS TO DEATH WITH A SHOTGUN. THE SUSPECT HAD SPECIFIC INTENTIONS TO KIDNAP JAYME, AND WENT TO GREAT LENGTHS TO PREPARE TO TAKE HER. AFTER A NEARLY THREE MONTH SEARCH, CLOSS WAS DISCOVERED WANDERING THE SMALL RURAL TOWN OF GORDON, ABOUT SIXTY FIVE MILES AWAY. PATTERSON FACES A FORCIBLE KIDNAPPING CHARGE, AND TWO COUNTS OF INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE. HE IS SCHEDULED TO MAKE HIS FIRST APPEARANCE IN COURT ON MONDAY.

THEY SAID PARENTS ARE ALLOWED TO CONSENT TO A MINOR GETTING A TATTOO, BUT IT MUST BE DONE IN A SAFE AND SANITARY WAY.

AS WE GET MORE INFORMATION WE WILL HAVE IT FOR YOU HERE ON CHANNEL SEVEN AND OUR WHIO NEWS APP.

WE ARE FOLLOWING REPORTS OUT OF CELINA THAT A TEACHER HAS BEEN ARRESTED FOR AN ALLEGED SEXUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A 15-YEAR-OLD BOY. THE CELINA DAILY STANDARD REPORTS THAT 48-YEAR-OLD HEATHER HENRY IS A TEACHER AT IMMACULATE CONCEPTION- AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY YESTERDAY. THE ALLEGED CONTACT BETWEEN HER AND THE BOY HAPPENED OVER CHRISTMAS BREAK. REPORTS INDICATE THE BOY DOES NOT ATTEND THE SCHOOL WHERE SHE TEACHES. HENRY IS OUT OF JAIL TONIGHT. THE CELINA POLICE CHIEF IS EXPECTED TO RELEASE MORE DEATILS TOMORROW.

COURT DOCUMENTS ACCUSE HIM OF HAVING A SEXUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A TEENAGE STUDENT IN JANUARY OF 20-17. GLENN TAUGHT ENGLISH AND COACHED BASEBALL AND GOLF AT CENTERVILLE HIGH SCHOOL.

OK DO YOU HAVE THAT WARRANT I'LL HAVE AN OFFICER BRING IT DOWN RIGHT NOW."** HEATHER HENRY WORKS AT "IMMACULATE CONCEPTION SCHOOL" IN CELINA. INVESTIGATORS SAID SHE HAD CONTACT WITH THE VICTIM OVER CHRISTMAS BREAK. THE TEEN IS *NOT FROM CELINA AND DOES NOT GO TO THE SCHOOL WHERE HENRY TEACHES. THE SCHOOL HAS PLACED HER ON ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE. SHE IS OUT OF JAIL THIS MORNING ON BOND.

THIS VIDEO WENT VIRAL AND LED TO CRIMINAL CHARGES FOR THE LOGAN COUNTY MOM WHO LET IT HAPPEN. NEWS CENTER 7'S JENNA LAWSON WAS THERE FOR THE *END* OF HER CASE TODAY. TO THE CHARGE OF ENDANGERING CHILDREN, WHAT PLEA DO YOU WISH TO ENTER? GUILTY. NIKKI DICKINSON AVOIDED JAIL TIME. SHE WAS GIVEN TWO YEARS PROBATION AND A \$550 FINE.

A MORAINE MAN, WHO *STRANGLEDAN 8 MONTH OLD BABY, IS TRYING TO GET OUT OF PRISON. THE PAROLE BOARD WILL CONSIDER RUSSELL JOHNSON'S CASE, THIS WEEK. JOHNSON WAS SENTENCED TO 15-YEARS-TO LIFE FOR KILLING THE BABY, IN 19-93. THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE... WANTS TO KEEP HIM BEHIND BARS.

INVESTIGATORS SAID THEY FOUND HER AND HER 15-YEAR-OLD SON HIDING IN THE BASEMENT. LATER HER SON PLEADED NO CONTEST TO DRUG CHARGES AND SPENT A MONTH BEHIND BARS. PROSECUTORS SAID HE SOLD DRUGS INCLUDING L-S-D AT SPRINGBORO HIGH SCHOOL.. AFTER HE BOUGHT IT WITH BITCOIN. INVESTIGAOTRS SAID PANZECA BOUGHT THE ONLINE CURENCY. PROSECUTORS WANT TO QUESTION HER SON ABOUT TEXT MESSAGES WITH HIS MOTHER. INVESTIGATORS SAID THOSE INVOLVED DRUG USE AND TRAFFICKING IN THEIR HOME. THE DEFENSE ASKED THE JUDGE TO KEEP PROSECUTORS FROM REFERRING TO PANZECA AS A TEACHER. SHE RECENTLY RESIGNED FROM HER JOB.

 LORI SUE SHOOTING NOT GUILTY

A WOMAN WHO SHOT AND KILLED HER SIX AND EIGHT YEAR OLD CHILDREN-- WILL SOON BE LEAVING JAIL. A JUDGE FOUND CLADENA HELTON NOT GUILTY BY REASON OF INSANITY YESTERDAY. HELTON SHOT AND KILLED THE KIDS AT THE LORI SUE AVENUE HOME IN DAYTON 20-17. A THIRD CHILD SURVIVED. WE SPOKE WITH A NEIGHBOR SHORTLY AFTER THE SHOOTING HAPPENED. **"I REALIZE THAT YOU KNOW WE FAILED THOSE BABIES AS A COMMUNITY. BECAUSE MENTAL ILLNESS IS SOMETHING... WE SHOULD HAVE ALL SEEN THIS."**

THE COURT ORDERED THREE PSYCHOLOGICAL EVALUATIONS ON HELTON BEFORE HER TRIAL. TWO OF THEM SHOWED SHE WAS LEGALLY NOT GUILTY BY REASON OF INSANITY. THE THIRD SAID SHE WAS LEGALLY INSANE. HELTON NOW HEADS TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH FACILTY IN CINCINNATI. HER CASE WILL BE REVIEWED IN SIX MONTHS.

Tricia Whitaker and her 19-year-old son Kevin died from their injuries. Police investigation revealed Bart Whitaker was behind the intricate plot to kill his family. To cover up the crime, he also sustained injuries. Bart Whitaker enlisted the help of friends Steven Champagne and Chris Brasher to carry out the plot. Bart eventually fled to Mexico, assumed the name "Rudy Rios" and started a new life. The real Rudy Rios turned him in to Mexican authorities; they dumped him at the border. He was charged with the murders of his mother and brother. Prosecutors sought the death penalty. Bart Whitaker was convicted and sentenced to death. Incredibly, his father Kent Whitaker has forgiven his son. Over the next decade, Kent Whitaker lobbied tirelessly to have his son's sentence commuted to life. In 2018, Bart's appeals were exhausted and his execution was scheduled for February 22, 2018. Kent Whitaker made one last desperate plea for mercy to the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles. Just days before the execution, the board made a recommendation for clemency. The final decision came from the governor. Less than one hour before the scheduled execution, Governor Abbot spared his life. Bart released a statement saying, "I'm thankful for the decision not for me, but for my dad." The caller also told police about Sheila Keen, an employee of Mike's. Police learned Keen fit the description of a woman who bought a costume, flowers and balloons. There were also rumors that Mike Warren and Sheila Keen were lovers. No arrest was ever made. Keen guit her job and moved away. Mike Warren battled with Marlene's son Joe Ahrens over her estate. Warren was investigated, convicted and sentenced on fraud charges and served four years in prison. In 2012, Warren and Keen were married. They settled in Tennessee, operating a business there. Rumors about Keen's past persisted among their employees. They sold their business and retired to their vacation home in Virginia. In 2017, investigators say they finally developed DNA evidence to make their case and Sheila Keen Warren was subsequently arrested and charged with Marlene Warren's murder. The intruder forced his way into the house and immediately killed Betty. He then raped Kathryn, who died months later of complications from her injuries. The leads went nowhere and current lead Detective Bill Lott struggled for years to solve it. Jason B. Jones, a Nashville album designer and step-grandson of Betty, wanted to know what happened. He knew little about the case, but in 2005, a chance meeting between Jason's mother and Kathryn's granddaughter Juky Holt led to his renewed interest. In 2017, he launched a podcast as a way to work through his own questions about the incident and perhaps uncover new information. Jason subsequently learned that Betty had sponsored a family who escaped the Khmer Rouge regime in Cambodia and the family named their daughter after Betty. In 2018, as his podcast was coming to an end, there was no finality, because no one know who killed Betty and Kathryn. However, Detective Lott's quest led him to Parabon NanoLabs in Reston, Virginia. Parabon NanoLabs has developed technology called genetic genealogy, which can predict what someone looks like through their DNA. The results led to a name, Michael Wayne DeVaughn, and his DNA was a match to the DNA taken from Crigler the night of the attack. Twenty-eight years after the crime, the suspected attacker was charged with Betty's murder and the rape and sexual battery of Katheryn Crigler. All may now know who knocked on the door that night, but the storyteller in Jones still needs to know how this tale ends. (1) "Letter from San Quentin" - On June 4, 1983, the Ryen family and young friend Christopher Hughes were brutally murdered in their Chino Hills home. Eight-year-old Josh Ryen, though seriously wounded, survived the attack. He initially indicated three white people were the attackers. Police eventually concluded Josh was wrong with his identification. Prison escapee Kevin Cooper seemed to fit the bill -- he had escaped from prison and had hidden near the Ryen home. Cooper was paraded before cameras and the trial became racially charged because Cooper is black. There were many troubling clues at the time – blood, but none of Cooper's fingerprints, were found at the scene. The trial was moved to San Diego. Josh Ryen video testified but his memory was hazy and he no longer remembered the attackers. Cooper, who always denied the murders, was convicted and sentenced to death. Josh's grandmother Dr. Mary Howell was not convinced that Cooper was guilty and feared the real killers were still at large. By 2000, some seventeen years after the murders, Cooper was still on death row. Questions still linger, especially about the number of attackers. Eighteen-year-old Josh Ryen is not sure Cooper was there. Private Investigator Paul Ingels felt the case deserved a second look. An investigation led to a number of new leads including potential suspect Lee Furrow, who the police initially discounted. He claims to have nothing to do with the crime. In 2001, an agreement was made to do additional DNA testing. In 2002, the post-conviction DNA testing did not exonerate Cooper, but raised significant issues with the process. He claimed foul play. Dr. Mary Howell and Paul Ingels still had doubts. (2) "Was Kevin Cooper Framed?" – In 2008, Dr. Mary Howell died. After the state agreed to the DNA testing, the lab results all pointed to Cooper. Many are convinced the evidence was tampered with. After nineteen years on death row, the 9th Circuit federal appellate court stepped in and stayed Cooper's execution. New York Times journalist Nicholas Kristof wrote an Op-Ed article about the case. Former FBI agent Tom Parker has been hired by Cooper's defense attorney Norman Hile to re-investigate. Private investigator Paul Ingels believes the evidence was tampered with, or contaminated. Lee Furrow is drawing further attention following information that witnesses saw three white men splattered with blood, in a nearby bar on the night of the crime. At the end of 2018, Governor Jerry Brown ordered new DNA testing and a retired judge was appointed to make sure the tests are done properly. Cooper hopes that someday he will be exonerated. The man, Jason Richards, tried to turn his crime into a love story, but he eventually pleaded guilty to child rape and luring charges. Also featured in the broadcast is an interview with an online predator who details how easy it is to lure children using social apps. Ted Livingston, CEO of the billion dollar social app Kik, was asked questions regarding the safety of children using the app during a recent conference and claimed his app is as safe as the competition. In an interview with police, Marsh told them what happened. Experts diagnosed him as a psychopath and said he killed for pleasure. Marsh was tried as an adult - convicted and sentenced to 52 years to life. Four years after the conviction, a new California law, Proposition 57, has thrown his sentence into jeopardy. His lawyers are arguing that he should be re-sentenced as a juvenile. If successful, Marsh, now 21, might be able to be released from prison on his 25th birthday. At a hearing, a judge listened to the evidence to determine if Marsh should be re-tried as a juvenile and receive a lighter sentence. The prosecution continued to maintain he is a psychopath. In a surprise move, Daniel Marsh took the stand. In the decision, the judge found the evidence and Marsh's testimony to be credible, but determined it was not a chance worth taking. Marsh will remain in prison. In 2018, a new law was signed into effect, saying that anyone younger than 15-years-old would never be tried as an adult. His lawyers want Marsh included retroactively. Major was found along railroad tracks; River Lynn was found in a nearby pond in Moncks Corner, South Carolina. Rick Ollic, of the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office, was the original investigator in charge. Ollic believed it was a murder-suicide and said a note found in Major's pocket was evidence of her delusion. Major's family never believed she was delusional or that she would take her own life; Major was five months pregnant. Husband Aaron Major reacted oddly to her death and was at one point a suspect. Kadie Major's mother, Vicky Hall, vowed to get to the bottom of what happened and pressured investigators; Hall started her own investigation. In 2015, a 48 HOURS producer asked about the stalled investigation. Hall hired private investigator Jessica Sanders to help prove the case was not a murder-suicide; she believes there were plenty of clues missed in the original investigation. 48 HOURS approached the new Berkeley County Sheriff Duane Lewis. He asked his newly formed cold case squad to investigate. A decade after her daughter's death, Hall finally got her chance to talk with detectives about her case. 03/09/19 48 HOURS: LIVE TO TELL: "Trafficked" (9:00 – 10:00p) - a revised examination of sex trafficking through the eyes of survivor Alyssa Beck and the vast array of people who tried to help her – from law enforcement and her family, to the legal system and child advocates. In 2010, Beck was a 15-year-old Jacksonville, Florida runaway, who ran right into the hands of a violent sex trafficking group. She was living in a juvenile detention home when another young woman convinced her to run away with her. She ended up trapped in a hotel room, being beaten and having men pay money to do whatever they wanted to do to her. She recounts her battle to survive, how she escaped, her struggle to stay away from that life and her world today. The details Beck provided led to the arrest of seven people and the mastermind behind the ring, Ian Seth Gordon, who was given one of the first life sentences ever handed down in the case of a sex trafficker in this country. A loophole in American laws may have allowed the prime suspect in her murder to avoid punishment. In 1988, Abel, an English teacher, was found murdered in her apartment in what looked like a robbery gone bad. John Boatwright, a chief of detectives from the Army's Criminal Investigation Division was asked to help the South Korean investigators. He received a tip to interview the two Americans who found the body: Sandra Ames and Kathy Patrick. Ames told him Patrick had confessed to killing Abel, as there may have been an unreciprocated romantic angle, and that the two of them returned to the crime scene to make it look like a robbery. Ames pleaded guilty to several crimes tied to the cover-up. Patrick left South Korea before investigators could question her. Investigators in the two countries are certain Patrick murdered Carolyn Abel. South Korean officials issued a warrant for Patrick's arrest, but U.S. officials were powerless to enforce it because the two countries lacked an extradition treaty at the time. Kathy Patrick now works as a student advisor at Western Washington University. When approached, she denied any wrongdoing. Thanks to the Abel family's lobbing efforts, in 1994, Congress passed a law which allows the U.S. prosecution of U.S. nationals who kill other Americans in foreign countries. But in the Abel case, a trial seems highly unlikely; in South Korea the statute of limitations has expired and there is no evidence. A neighbor who happened to be walking on Kathy's street, testing out a thermal imaging scope, recorded the nighttime movements of a stranger and informed the police. Nine days later, retired elderly couple Billie and Sidney Shelton were found dead in their home under similar circumstances. The victims did not know each other, but police eventually found a connection between them. Tim Parlin, a career ex-con, pawned jewelry belonging to Kathy and also knew the Shelton's from church. The car he was using tested positive for Kathy Blair's blood. He denied murdering anyone, but led the police to Shawn Gant-Benalcazar from Galveston. He agreed to an interview. One of the detectives matched the gait to Gant-Benalcazar to the person on the recording. Gant-Benalcazar admitted to the murders. After a mistrial, Gant-Benalcazar was convicted of the capital murder of Kathy Blair and is serving life in prison without parole. In a separate trial, Palin was also convicted of capital murder, and is serving the same sentence. In 2017 Michele Neurauter was found hanging in her home in Corning, New York in what appeared to be a suicide. Police were troubled because a rope mark was found on her chin. Michele's mother, Jeanne Laundy, pointed the finger at Michele's ex-husband, Lloyd Neurauter, though he was in California at the time. Police later learned he stopped less than 100 miles away from the crime scene before he flew to California, helping his daughter Karrie move into a new apartment in Rochester, New York. Police began listening in to their conversations, which led to the father and daughter being charged with murder months later. The investigation revealed Michele had accused Lloyd of trying to turn Karrie against her. Police believed Karrie was manipulated and brainwashed. Karrie pleaded guilty to second-degree murder charges. Weeks before the trial, Lloyd plead guilty and was sentenced to life without parole. The District Attorney had Karrie's charges reduced to second-degree manslaughter and she was sentenced to 1-3 years in prison. Though his death was ruled a suicide, his wife Kim Stahlman and her daughter MacKenna were suspicious about the findings and believed authorities rushed to judgement. In the course of her investigation, she made several important alliances: Cilla McCain, an author and advocate for bereaved military families; Stuart Bowen, who had been George W. Bush's special inspector general for Iraq reconstruction; and Michael Maloney, a forensics expert who prepared a report on the case. Kim Stahlman believes investigators never did a full forensic analysis. More than three years after the shooting, authorities brought in blood stain analysis expert Mark Reynolds to examine the case, including Michael Maloney's report. He saw no evidence of homicide in the material provided to him, though Maloney stands by his conclusions. In a statement to 48 HOURS, authorities maintained they thoroughly investigated the case and stand by the military medical examiner's suicide finding. McCain and Stahlman are writing a book. Jim De Rogatis, author of a book about Kelly, learned about so-called sex tapes with a minor and turned the evidence over to the police. Questions about why Special Counsel Robert Mueller's inability exonerate the President on obstruction of justice is examined, as well as what is ahead in Washington, and the ongoing investigation by the Southern District of New York. (1) A summary of the report by Attorney General William Barr details there is confirmation Russia did meddle in the 2016 election, but there was no collusion. The special counsel was not able to exonerate the President on obstruction of justice, leaving the decision to Attorney General Barr, who concluded the President did not. (2) Mr. Trump encouraged a foreign adversarial leader to meddle during the campaign; Clinton and Podesta emails were dumped; the Democratic Party was hacked; the Trump/Billy Bush interview resurfaced; and WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange controlled the news cycle, shifting the course of the election. (3) Vladimir Putin has a deep dislike for American democracy and Hillary Clinton. The 2016 election was a catalyst for thousands of fake social media posts and the so-called "Troll Factory," there was much interference and thirteen people were charged by Mueller. (4) The famous June 2016 meeting at Trump Tower with Natalia Veselnitskaya to gather dirt on Hillary Clinton was to many a classic spy maneuver designed to cause havoc, gain intelligence and serve as a reminder of the Kremlin's reach. (5) After the election, Trump was warned by President Obama about Michael Flynn, but appointed him as his National Security Advisor. Flynn admitted to negotiating with Russia before Trump took office. A meeting with FBI Director James Comey about Flynn ultimately led to Comey being fired and new acting FBI Director Andrew McCabe to open two investigations: Trump's possible obstruction of the Russian investigation and whether he was acting as an agent of Russia. (6) An interview with one of the many lawyers on Trump's legal team: Ty Cobb, who counseled his client about restraint. (7) Michael Cohen, Trump's personal attorney and self-admitted "fixer", became an informant. His knowledge of the inner workings of the Trump organization and cooperation after pleading guilty to making illegal donations supplied the Southern District of New York with information. It could take several years to investigate. Critics of Cohen say he is trying to get his sentence reduced.
