



Regular Programs & News Series Descriptions

<u>Farm Reports:</u> WHIO-TV airs this segment during the noon news M-F. The reports are to give the current prices for agricultural and farm products, such as soy beans, corn, pork bellies, as well as other products.

<u>Health News:</u> A news feature addressing day-to-day medical problems, as well as, examining medical breakthroughs and outbreaks of diseases. This segment airs on Saturday mornings on WHIO-TV's News Center 7 Saturday.

<u>Miami Valley's Most Wanted:</u> Hosted by WHIO-TV's Cheryl McHenry, this weekly segment highlights criminals from around the Miami Valley that are wanted by the local sheriff's departments. WHIO-TV invites viewers, if they have seen these criminals, to call their local sheriff. The idea is to get viewer involvement into fighting back against crime by helping law enforcement get more criminals off the street. Thursday at 5PM.

<u>Traffic Reports:</u> This is a segment in WHIO-TV's News Center 7 from 4:30-7 AM. Segments show viewers some of the problem areas on interstate highways and roads around the Miami Valley area that could affect their early morning drive.

<u>I-Team Investigations:</u> This is a look into Government waste, abuse and/or fraud. Viewers are asked to call WHIO-TV's I-Team's Hotline if they are aware of instances of Government Waste and the I-Team reporters will investigate.

<u>Making a Difference</u>: Once a month, on the last Friday of the month, WHIO-TV airs a segment titled, "Making a Difference." James Brown does a feature on local people or organizations that are making a difference in the Miami Valley. Viewers then are given the opportunity to "nominate" someone they know that is making a difference in their community.

48 HOURS: LIVE TO TELL: "Soul Survivor" - a report about Robin Doan, who as a young girl in 01/03/15 2005, played dead to live through the murders of her entire family as they slept in their beds. Before that night, the now 20-year-old Doan was a typical 10-year-old girl in a hardworking family of farmers in Pampa, Texas. They became the targets of an intruder who enjoyed killing just for the thrill of it. The immediate investigation yielded few clues. Doan, however, had a remarkable ability to recall the details of that traumatic night. Investigators would later learn that the gunman who killed Doan's family had killed before, hundreds of miles away in Missouri. A day before the Pampa shootings, Orlie McCool and his daughter-in-law Dawn were killed and the family pickup stolen. Levi King was later found behind the wheel of the stolen vehicle in El Paso, Texas. He also told law enforcement that there were four more bodies in Texas. King told law enforcement officers that the feeling he got from killing the McCools was better than any drug he had ever done. This was the lead needed to solve the Pampa murders. Robin Doan was willing to help by testifying about the night her family was gunned down while they slept. King took a plea deal in Missouri -- to avoid execution he agreed to two consecutive life sentences without the possibility of parole. In Texas, he also took a guilty plea, but the DA refused to take the death penalty off the table. Robin testified at the trial. There was one holdout for the death penalty; King received a life sentence. He will serve his time in Missouri. Robin Doan is satisfied. On-screen text graphic: Robin has decided to leave Pampa. She plans to visit often. 01/10/15 **48 HOURS: "The Ultimatum"** - a report on the investigation into the murder of Vanessa Mintz, who was gunned down at the family-owned Saluda Mountain Lodge, in Saluda, North Carolina on Saturday, February 19, 2011. Mintz, whose family had long-standing ties to the area, had married early in life, divorced and raised two daughters, Jessica Freeman and Andrea Little Gray, as well as becoming a respected businesswoman, realtor and mentor to young girls. Police investigation at the lodge found a crucial piece of evidence only the killer could have left, but questions remained: did Mintz know her killer or was it a random robbery that went bad? The investigation took the case in another direction when police found out that her husband, Travis McGraw, was secretly dating Mary Beth Fisher. His cell phone records revealed he was sending intimate text messages to Fisher. Fisher claims McGraw had told her he wasn't married, and the relationship, though intimate, was not sexual. Fisher found out the truth and gave him an ultimatum -- make up your mind by Sunday. Mintz was shot dead on Saturday. Travis McGraw willingly turned over his cache of guns to police. One of his guns matched the cartridge found at the scene and he was arrested for murder. Mintz's daughters emerged as powerful advocates for their mother, and prosecutors, after consulting with them, offered a plea deal to McGraw: second-degree murder with a sentence of 16-20 years. He accepted, but at the last moment changed his mind about pleading guilty. Three years after the murder the trial began. McGraw was found guilty of first-degree murder. On-screen text graphic: Mary Beth Fisher and Vanessa's daughter Andrea work at the same hospital. They occasionally cross each other's paths. Andrea and Jessica are creating a local family justice center and a trauma intervention program in honor of their mother. 01/17/15 48 HOURS: "Death in the Parsonage" (8:00-9:00p) - an updated rebroadcast on the suicide of Joseph Musante; the eventual discovery of his wife, Cindy's secret affair with A.B. Schirmer, the pastor of the Reeders United Methodist Church in Reeders, Pennsylvania; and the eventual investigation to determine if the deaths of the pastor's previous wives were really accidental. Musante's sister, Rose Cobb, knew something wasn't right and pressed authorities to keep looking. Musante's daughter, Samantha, told police that she had discovered the affair between her mother and Schirmer and had told her father. Further investigation revealed Musante's death was truly a suicide. This led to questions regarding the death of the pastor's second wife, Betty Schirmer, just three months earlier in an auto accident. Her death was determined to be suspicious and police suspected Schirmer. Questions then arose about the death of Schirmer's first wife, Jewel. The cause of her death, from a fall, was initially classified as undetermined, but was now ruled a homicide. A.B. Schirmer was arrested and charged with the murder of his second wife, Betty. At trial, A.B. Schirmer was found guilty of murder. Cindy Musante continues to stand by him. Original on-screen text graphic: Schirmer is awaiting trial for the murder of his first wife, Jewel. Sam's mother, Cindy told the court she believes "one hundred per cent" in Schirmer's innocence. Epilogue (for the 01/17/15 rebroadcast): a year and a half after his conviction for the murder of his second wife, Betty, A.B. Schirmer struck an unexpected deal with prosecutors. He pled no contest to the charge that he murdered his first wife, Jewel, saying he only took the plea to spare his family the trauma of going through another murder trial. Schirmer was sentenced to twenty to forty years in prison, the maximum allowed, on top of his life sentence. In 2006, in Pinyon Pines, California, Friedli and her boyfriend where shot dead and their house set on fire. Outside the home, investigators found the charred remains of Becky Friedli, in a wheelbarrow. She was burned so badly, they could not determine how she died. Retired policeman Ron Friedli, Vicki's ex-husband and Becky's father, had a theory about what happened: Becky was deathly afraid of fire and he suspected she knew her killer. Police searched for clues but the case went cold. Years later, Luis Bolanos, a private investigator and a former colleague of Ron's, asked if he could get involved; he said he could get the case back in the news. He did just that. Seven years after the murders, police arrested Becky's exboyfriend Robert Pape and his best friend Christian Smith and charged them with murder. Their families say they are innocent. But an unexpected courtroom twist turned the case upside down. The District Attorney said there was an "issue" in the grand jury proceedings against Pape, and dropped the charges against them both. Hayes, a successful, wealthy, married Santa Cruz, California technology genius was found dead from a heroin overdose aboard his 46-foot yacht. The yacht had been outfitted with a sophisticated security system, which eventually led investigators to Alix Tichelman, a young woman with whom he had a secret liaison aboard the yacht. Hayes and Tichelman met on an online dating service known for connecting wealthy men with women looking to be spoiled. The video footage recorded Tichelman injecting Hayes, cleaning up the scene and stepping over him to leave. At issue is whether Tichelman knew Hayes was in distress when she left, as police maintain, or if his death was accidental, as public defenders representing Tichelman claim. Tichelman led a troubled life which included eating disorders, drugs, and specialized schools. Investigators learned that just months before Hayes' death, Tichelman's thenboyfriend. Dean Riopelle, an Atlanta night club owner, also died from a heroin overdose. After an elaborate sting, Tichelman was arrested for the death of Forrest Hayes. Riopelle's death, originally classified as accidental, is being given a second look by Georgia authorities. Instead of murdering Olsen, he went to the authorities in Los Angeles, California, and agreed to wear a wire. In October 2013, Fuhrmann got Guglielmelli to repeat that he would pay \$80,000 to have Olsen killed. To the authorities, it was a clear-cut case of murder for hire; Guglielmelli was arrested. Guglielmelli, in a telephone interview from jail, claims he is the victim; he was conned by Richard Fuhrmann. Authorities agree that Fuhrmann is a con man, but the conspiracy to kill Olsen was very real. In a surprise move, they offered Guglielmelli a plea deal: plead guilty to attempted murder in the second degree and serve only nine years in jail. He accepted. In a telephone interview from prison, Guglielmelli discusses his decision. Olsen is proceeding with the divorce and worries about the future. Within forty-eight hours, Castellano then told police a much different version of events. Warner had been living in Houston, Texas with Castellano, her on-again/off-again boyfriend. Castellano claimed Warner stormed out of the house after a fight and vanished without a trace, leaving her child behind. Warner's family did not believe it and filed a missing persons report. Houston homicide detectives later received the case. Castellano agreed to appear on "The Dr. Phil Show". Dr. Phil interviewed Castellano at his parents' home in West Texas; he wasn't buying Castellano's version of events and had serious doubts about his story. The police investigation continued, but there were few if any clues. Two days after the interview with Dr. Phil, Castellano voluntarily went in for an interview with the police. During the interrogation, Castellano finally cracked and admitted that he had killed Warner, put her body in his car, and buried it in a shallow grave outside of Midland, Texas. Local police and the FBI tried to locate her body but were unsuccessful. Eventually, using Apple's Face Time app and an iPhone, and with help from Castellano, police were able to scan the area and locate Warner's body. Castellano was arrested and charged with murder. Eight days later, "The Dr. Phil Show" aired its episode about the case. At his trial, attorneys presented a new version of what he now says is the truth. After more than a week of testimony, Castellano was found guilty in the strangling death of Michelle Warner. Marriott accepted an invitation from McDonough to hang out with her and her boyfriend and watch a movie – and she never returned home. Mazzaglia used McDonough to bring other women into their relationship for his pleasure -- and that, for him, involved ropes and bondage gear, a fantasy brought into the mainstream by the book series and current motion picture, "Fifty Shades of Grey". Police investigation led to Mazzaglia and McDonough. During interrogation, Mazzaglia said Marriott died accidentally during a BDSM encounter. McDonough told police Marriott was never there, but later, in a plea deal, changed her story. She said Mazzaglia killed Marriott when, after playing strip poker, she twice turned down his requests to initiate sex. After Marriott's death, they disposed of her body in the ocean. At Mazzaglia's 2014 trial, McDonough's testimony was critical. Ultimately, Mazzaglia was found quilty of first degree murder and sentenced to life without parole. Bethany Deaton was a young wife and nurse, whose lifeless body was found in the backseat of a minivan, in Grandview, Missouri -- a plastic bag over her head, a suicide note, and an empty pill bottle nearby. Deaton's mother believed it was not a suicide and that someone else had a hand in her daughter's death; possibly someone involved in the fundamentalist Christian religious group to which she belonged, and which some people likened to a cult. While in college, and devoted to religion, Bethany was drawn to Tyler Deaton, the leader of the group called "The Community", which was associated with the International House of Prayer (IHOP). Deaton told members what to wear, when to eat and even controlled their romantic relationships. One member says the group had become a full-blown cult. Bethany eventually married Tyler, but the marriage wasn't perfect. There were questions about Tyler's own sexuality; Bethany fell into a deep depression. Police did not believe Bethany killed herself. After the Medical Examiner ruled it a suicide, Micah Moore, another member of "The Community", told police that he had killed Bethany, and was subsequently charged with murder. The case was upended when he recanted his confession. Investigators were unable to substantiate his confession and just weeks before the trial was to begin, charges were dropped against Micah. Questions remained. Was Micah manipulated? Did Tyler have something to do with it? Tyler is ready to admit he played a role in her death, but to what end? DeMocker's girlfriend, Renee Girard, then revealed critical information about DeMocker's activities after Kennedy's death: he lived in fear of being arrested for a crime and revealed information about an insurance policy. His large family, including his two daughters Charlotte and Katherine, believe he is innocent. Prosecutors believe he killed Kennedy to avoid paying alimony and to gain access to an estimated \$750,000 life insurance payout. After five years, and nearly \$2 million in taxpayer money, the trial commences. Steven DeMocker is found quilty of first-degree murder; he is sentenced to life in prison without parole. Also examined are police interrogations, what happens after a confession, and what can happen when a key player in the investigation admits he made a lifealtering mistake. Two days after Ben Kingan's death, Calusinski was brought in for questioning; police told her Ben died from a blunt-force trauma to the head and that she was the last adult to have seen him alive. She was interrogated for nine hours, never asked for a lawyer, and eventually confessed to dropping the child in a way that may have led to a head injury. She was convicted of murder, largely on the fact that she had confessed and that the Medical Examiner's report said that the child suffered from fresh injuries to his head. Her family persuaded a newlyelected coroner, Dr. Thomas Rudd, to re-examine the evidence. His findings revealed an older head injury -- a significant discovery. Eventually, state pathologist Dr. Eupil Choi, admitted to missing the old injury in his report. With this information, attorney Kathleen Zellner, who specializes in cases pertaining to false confessions, says that Melissa Calusinski did not receive a fair trial. Advocates say that, under extreme conditions, 60% of people confess to crimes they did not commit. The police say they played by the rules. Two courts have allowed the conviction to stand. Attorney Zellner believes the medical evidence needs to be re-examined, but the State Attorney will not pass it on. Family and friends vow not to give up. Meanwhile, China took over the industry since they have less environmental constraints around mining and lower labor costs, which translates into lower pricing. Molycorp Inc.'s Mountain Pass mine reopened in 2010. However this helped guide doctors to lower the dosage for another featured patient, Nancy Justice, who appears to be on the same track to remission as Lipscomb and Andersen, as her tumor continues to shrink with each MRI. Pfister came from a family of high achievers, but was also known for a demanding demeanor; even her friends were treated with disrespect, as friend Kathy Carpenter had personally experienced. Nancy Pfister was found dead from blunt force trauma, in the bedroom closet of her home by Kathy Carpenter. She had been alerted that something was amiss by Nancy Styler, who had recently rented the place with her husband Trey Styler, and was in the process of moving out. Police focused on the Stylers because they were involved in a public dispute with Pfister involving the rental home. Pfister came back three months earlier than expected, saying the couple had owed her a large amount of money. Police believed Nancy Styler harbored anger over the way Pfister treated the couple. They also believed Trey Styler, who suffered from a neurological disorder, was incapable of killing anyone. Days after the murder, both were arrested and charged with murder. Soon after, Kathy Carpenter was also arrested, and charged with murder. Police believed the women had bonded over Pfister's seeming indifference to them. Three months later, a bombshell: Trey Styler confessed and said that he and he alone had killed Nancy Pfister. He agreed to tell the details of the crime in exchange for a 20-year sentence and his wife's unconditional freedom. The charges were dropped against both women, but they claim that the prosecution's continued insistence that they were somehow involved in the murder has convicted them in the court of public opinion. Kathy Carpenter still faces the threat of prosecution should more evidence be found. Nancy Styler can never be charged. At the time of Berman's death, Durst was hiding out in Galveston, Texas, masquerading as a woman and trying to avoid authorities who wanted to talk to him about his wife's disappearance. Berman, the daughter of a well-known Las Vegas mobster, was shot dead in her Los Angeles home; police suspected a mob hit. Durst was not considered a suspect until he became involved with the death of Morris Black in Galveston, claiming he accidentally killed Black in self-defense, then cut up his body. A jury eventually acquitted him of murder. Now, the HBO documentary has raised questions regarding Berman's death, and police now believe that a destitute Berman was possibly blackmailing Durst because she knew details about Durst's disappearance, and that comments made by Durst during the program will lead to a conviction. At the time, Finkel, who admitted to fabricating a portion of a story on child slavery in Africa, was fired by the newspaper and had retreated to Montana in disgrace. Christian Longo, a married father of three, was living in Oregon where he moved for a fresh start, after committing a series of crimes in Michigan. In reality, Longo was a pathological liar and con man. Soon after, Longo was on the run, charged with killing his wife MaryJane and his three children. It was then that Finkel and the police learned that Longo had assumed Finkel's identity. Finkel, curious to learn why someone would want to steal his identity, met with Longo and, based on conversations, a series of letters and phone calls, put together an account of events leading up to the murders and Longo's apprehension, which he used as a way to resurrect his ruined writing career. Christian Longo was tried, found guilty of the murders and sentenced to death. He has since changed is story and is working on an appeal. Finkel authored a book, "True Story: Murder, Memoir, Mea Culpa", which is the basis for the theatrical release starring Jonah Hill and James Franco.
