This week on In Focus with IRSC Public Media we welcome Rick Kaiser, the Chief Operating Officer of the Navy SEAL Museum here in Fort Pierce. He is a former SEAL who served his country for 34 years. The Museum is about to benefit from the launch of a series about Navy SEALs that starts tonight, July 1, on Amazon Prime. The series is based on the book 'Terminal List', written by Jack Carr, a former SEAL who served with Kaiser. Carr is donating 100% of the proceeds from the limited edition 'Terminal List' hoodies being sold by retailer '5.11', a military and outdoor gear supplier. Then we'll hear from Kathy Sarmiento, with the Alliance for Aging. She's based in Miami and she's going to talk about the impact of inflation on Florida's elderly population. The Alliance for Aging is a private, not-for-profit agency, with 11 offices in Florida. They serve the needs of older people and those with disabilities. The current high rate of Inflation is taking a huge bite out of the limited, and often fixed, incomes of Florida's elderly population, and Kathy has some tips for seniors struggling to make ends meet.

Then we speak with Elise Mahovlich, the Administrative Manager of the Cultural Council of Indian River County. The arts play a major role in Indian River County. <p>This week we welcome Mark Friedlander, a spokesman for the Insurance Information Institute, a nonpartisan group in New York that is focused on insurance research. He says the home insurance crisis in Florida has gotten worse, not better since lawmakers passed bills to try and address the problem in special session this past May and the state is now facing the largest mass failure of home insurers in U.S. history. Then we'll talk with Karen Marcil, the President of the Vero Beach Preservation Alliance and Leslie Tilley the Secretary Treasurer of the organization. The group just formed in April of this year with the goal of stopping what they call "the massive expansion" of the Vero Beach Marina which they fear will have a negative impact on the Indian River Lagoon and the surrounding residential neighborhood. <p>This week on In Focus with IRSC Public Media a conversation about Saharan Dust with Dr. Jason Dunion, a University of Miami hurricane researcher working with NOAA's Atlantic Meteorological Laboratory. He's an expert on what's called the Saharan Air Layer. He tracks the Saharan Dust clouds that blow our way every year. He explains some of the science behind these dust waves and how they help to dampen the formation of tropical cyclones. Then we'll talk with Tracy Hernandez, the newly appointed Director of Development for Suncoast Mental Health Center. The Center provides an alternative to traditional therapy and psychiatric services, and the need along the Treasure Coast in the wake of Covid is great. Great as well is the need to support the services that Suncoast Mental Health provides to students and adults in our region. This week we'll take a look at some of the candidates in the August 23 Primary Election. Russell Conn is the President of the Democratic Environmental Caucus of Florida, no secret where they stand. Maintaining the environment of Florida is critical to the state's economy says Conn, and the caucus has researched the candidates vying for state and federal office and named the ones they believe are committed to protecting Florida's land and water resources. The caucus looked at the voting records, spoke with the candidates about their positions, and asked each to respond to a detailed questionnaire on the most important environmental problems facing Florida today, and what they plan to do about those issues. Conn will tell us about some of the candidates they recommended. Then we'll speak with Debbie Wuthnow the President of iVoterGuide, a non-profit organization that is dedicated to conservative principles. iVoterGuide rates candidates around the nation and WQCS asked them to take a look at some of those candidates here on the Treasure Coast. The ratings, Wuthnow says, are not based so much on what the candidates says, but on what they have done. iVoterGuide has researched their backgrounds, their voting records, their websites and asked them to fill out questionnaires as well. Their candidate recommendations for the primary election along the Treasure Coast are all republicans, but after the primary is over, Wuthnow says they'll be rating both democrats and republicans, and any other party candidates that are running in the general election.

This week on In Focus with IRSC Public Media, a conversation with the Dean of IRSC's School of Public Service Education, Raimundo Socorro. Socorro designed a training program for a group of visiting Columbian police officers. His program was chosen by the U.S. State Department to conduct the kind of urban police training sought by the Columbian Government. He'll tell us about the type of jungle policing the Columbians are used to, and the new urban policing techniques they're learning at IRSC. We'll also hear from the team leader of the Columbian Officers, Colonel Jorge Pinzon. Then an interview with Matthew Mawby, the Co-Founder of StaffHealth.com – a national, full-service healthcare staffing & recruitment agency that's working with the State of Florida's nursing shortage council to fill the gap and help provide short term nursing staff to health care providers in the state. Mawby talks about some of the causes of the nursing shortage here in Florida and elsewhere, and what StaffHealth is doing to help relieve the shortage.

TRIM notices went out to all County residents a few weeks ago, that's your property tax notice. TRIM stands for "Truth in Millage". In 1980, the Florida Legislature passed the TRIM Act. The law was designed to inform taxpayers which governmental entity is responsible for the taxes levied and the amount of tax liability taxpayers owe to each taxing authority. Michelle will help us understand those TRIM notices and explain what you can and cannot do to challenge the amount you owe. Then we hear from Gary Porter, the Director of Community Relations for the Treasure Coast. September is Hunger Action Month nationwide. Gary tells us about all the events the Food Bank has lined up for this month to raise funds to help feed the need throughout the Treasure Coast, and the need remains great.

Reif is working with Indian River State College on a plan to recruit a small group of IRSC students and take them up to a ranch on the Lance Formation outside Lusk Wyoming to dig for dinosaurs, and bring some of them back to IRSC for display. Then we'll talk with Jimmy Lee Jackson, a veteran of the War on Terror whose been through some tough times since returning from the battlefield. As a result, he founded an organization to help veterans, as well as the growing homeless and impoverished community, many of whom are also veterans. The name of his organization is "Do You Give a Ruck?" Jimmy will explain how he came up with that name and what their goals are.

<p>This week on In Focus with IRSC Public Media we begin with COSA, the Council of Social Agencies of St. Lucie County. We spoke with Stefanie Myers, one of COSA's Directors, and Yvette Cruz, COSA's Community Relations person. It's a unique non-profit formed to improve the collaboration between the County's social service agencies. There are 71 members of COSA, each one a different health and human service agency in the County. What makes them special is a key communication tool they call a 'list serve'. When one member service agency has a need, COSA can send out an email to all members seeking help and invariably someone can provide the help that is needed. Then we speak with two St. Lucie County Fire District firefighters who are members of the Ladies Firefighter Challenge Team. Lt. Alexia French and Dana Oliver, an EMT Firefighter. They are both members of the team and this year the National Firefighter Challenge Championship takes place here in Fort Pierce from Thursday September 22, through Saturday September 24.
