2/20-21	A Norway man is facing a number of sex-related charges. 31 year old Nicholas Lee-Alan Noyce is charged with criminal sexual conduct, accosting children for immoral purposes, aggravated indecent exposure, distributing sexually explicit visual or verbal matter to children, and habitual offender, fourth offense.

2/19-20	A Lansing man has plead guilty to a felony tax offense of obstructing the IRS. George Adatsi owned two companies, employing nurses and home health aides who provided health care services in private homes and nursing homes. Adatsi admitted that he did not forward to the IRS over \$121,000 of social security and Medicare taxes withheld from employees. He also hid assets from the IRS to avoid payment. Adatsi further admitted that he filed false quarterly federal tax returns that under reported gross wages paid to its employees and under reported both the income taxes and FICA taxes withheld.
2/11-12, 16-17	Governor Snyder has signed a new law extending the statute of limitations on kidnapping, attempted murder, and manslaughter to ten years from when the suspect has been identified.
2/15-17	New law in Michigan will stiffen penalties for repeat domestic violence offenders. Repeat offenders will face a maximum of five years in prison and a fine of \$5,000. Crimes of strangulation or suffocation with the intent to do great bodily harm less than murder will carry a maximum penalty of up to ten years in prison.
2/11-12	A measure by state senator Tonya Schutmaker will allow prosecution for felony perjury for making a false statement on a document signed under penalty of perjury.
2/10-11	State police from the Negaunee post were dispatched to the Days Inn of Marquette in response to a bomb threat. A subject had called in a bomb threat and had also pulled a fire alarm on the premises. Police determined there was no evidence of a bomb or fire in the vicinity.
2/4-5	Christopher E. Pratt was charged Friday in federal court with defrauding his former employer, village market food centers. From 2004 until 2012 Pratt was village market's comptroller, and stole

	over \$6 million by diverting funds from village market accounts to pay his personal credit card bills.
1/31-2/1	Governor Snyder has signed Erin's law, strengthening protections against the sexual abuse of children. The law allows schools to implement a program to educate and provide resources about the warning signs of sexual abuse, as well as available resources and counseling for children affected.
1/31-2/1	Governor Snyder has signed into law two bills by senator John Prose. The two bills create the "Swift and Sure" sanctions program to ensure immediate sanctions for a probationer who violates his probation.
