Responsive Programs: After identifying a collection of significant issues that are important to the local community (listed above), WICB responded with the following programming and treatment:

Newscasts: Monday through Friday, WICB broadcasts a total of seventeen news reports each day. Ten of the seventeen are produced by ABC News and cover world and national stories. The two-minute reports air at the following times:

6:16 AM, 7:16 AM, 8:16 AM, 9:16 AM, 12:16 PM, 2:16 PM, 3:16 PM, 4:16 PM, 5:16 PM and 6:16 PM.

WICB also produces and airs seven two-to-three-minute reports covering world, national, state and local news. During the academic year and when classes are in-session, the newscasts are written and delivered in-studio by Ithaca College student anchors at the following times:

6:46 AM, 7:46 AM, 8:46 AM, 12:46 PM, 3:46 PM, 4:46 PM and 5:46 PM.

Student anchors delivered newscasts Monday through Friday in the WICB studio (during the Second Broadcast Quarter of 2022) through the end of Ithaca College's Spring 2022 Semester.

During the college's academic breaks, afternoon newscasts are written, anchored and produced remotely by members of WICB's news team. They are scheduled and programmed for broadcast remotely. Ithaca College's Spring 2022 semester concluded on Friday, May 13, 2022. Ithaca College's summer session / break started on Saturday, May 14, 2022 (and continued through the Second Broadcast Quarter of 2022). The Fall 2022 semester starts on Monday, August 22, 2022.

The ABC News and WICB produced newscasts followed the air schedule above during the Spring 2022 semester and during academic breaks.

When applicable, newscasts include sound bites and quotes from newsmakers.

Sportscasts: During the academic year, Monday through Friday, WICB broadcasts a total of seven sports updates each day. The two-to-three-minute sportscasts place an emphasis on local and regional sports teams including Ithaca College, Cornell University, Syracuse University and Ithaca High School, while also noting national sports news and scores as well. The updates are written and delivered by Ithaca College student anchors.

During the academic year and when classes are in-session, the sportscasts air at the following times: 6:46 AM, 7:46 AM, 8:46 AM, 12:46 PM, 3:46 PM, 4:46 PM and 5:46 PM

Sportscasts did not air during Ithaca College's summer session / break. Ithaca College's Spring 2022 semester concluded on Friday, May 13, 2022. Ithaca College's summer session / break started on Saturday, May 14, 2022 (and continued through the Second Broadcast Quarter of 2022). The Fall 2022 semester starts on Monday, August 22, 2022.

When applicable, sportscasts include sound bites and quotes from newsmakers.

Weather: During regular programming, with only a few exceptions during specialty and overnight shows, two local weather forecasts are broadcast each hour, 24-hours per day. The forecasts include current weather conditions, temperature and a brief summary of what's expected in the coming days. WICB receives weather information from the National Weather Service (weather.gov).

Note, weather forecasts are also included in the student anchored newscasts Monday through Friday. See above for the weekly air times.

News Programming: During the academic school year (September – December, February – May), WICB's News Department produces a 30-to-60-minute weekly news magazine program called *Ithaca Now*. It covers local news stories and issues through packages, dialogue, discussion and interviews. It airs each Sunday at 7:00 PM.

Each episode of *Ithaca Now* includes the "Community Beat" and "Politics Beat" segments. The two-to-three-minute segments air during the early part of the episode and provide local updates and important information about what's happening in Ithaca, Tompkins County and the surrounding towns. They are produced in an effort to inform local residents and listeners and provide a brief news rundown.

During the academic school year, a weekday version of the show also airs Tuesdays and Thursdays at 7:45 PM. The ten-to-fifteen-minute show features stories and information from the previous weekend's program, as well as updates on local breaking and developing stories.

The final *Ithaca Now* episode of the Spring 2022 semester aired on Sunday, May 15, 2022.

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 3, 2022). Total Airtime: 10-minutes, 46-seconds.

Thursday, April 7, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 3, 2022). Total Airtime: 13-minutes, 50-seconds.

Sunday, April 10, 2022

- Hosted by Caroline Grass, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included the start of a mini-series reporting about universities, colleges and institutions of higher learning returning to on-campus instruction and the impact it's had on student stress, motivation and mental health issues (with a focus on Ithaca College). The topic was investigated with episode one airing on April 10, 2022. The episode included conversations with Brian Peterson, the Director of CAPS at Ithaca College and Michelle Goode, IC's new Director of the Center for Health Promotions. The episode started with the weekly Community Beat segment hosted by Bec Legato, plus the Politics Beat hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 47-minutes, 3-seconds.

Tuesday, April 12, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 10, 2022). Total Airtime: 14-minutes, 23-seconds.

Thursday, April 14, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 10, 2022). Total Airtime: 13-minutes, 37-seconds.

Sunday, April 17, 2022

- Hosted by Himadri Seth, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included episode two of a mini-series reporting about universities, colleges and institutions of higher learning returning to on-campus instruction and the impact it's had on student stress, motivation and mental health issues (with a focus on Ithaca College). Episode two included the continued conversation with Brian Peterson, the Director of CAPS at Ithaca College. This episode of *Ithaca Now* also included a story about the history of WICB-FM, Ithaca College's student-run FCC licensed radio station. In addition, the episode started with the weekly Community Beat segment hosted by Caroline Grass and Christian Maitre, plus the Politics Beat hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 39-minutes, 22-seconds.

Thursday, April 21, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 17, 2022). Total Airtime: 11-minutes, 36-seconds.

Sunday, April 24, 2022

- Hosted by Himadri Seth, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included a conversation with the creator of the Ithaca-based comic "Ithaqa," plus stories about Bitcoin mining in New York State, the recent Electric Vehicles for Earth Day event and the history of VIC Radio, Ithaca College's student-run online radio station. The episode started with the weekly Community Beat segment hosted by Bec Legato and Emma Kersting, plus the Politics Beat hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 51-minutes, 52-seconds.

Thursday, April 28, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 24, 2022). Total Airtime: 15-minutes, 8-seconds.

Sunday, May 1, 2022

- Hosted by Caroline Grass, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included a story about the history of Ithaca College Television (ICTV), the college's student-run television station. In addition, the episode included the re-air of a conversation with Former Ithaca College President Peggy Ryan Williams about the history of IC. The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted by Bec Legato, Community Calendar segment hosted by Jordan Broking and the Politics Beat segment hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 27-minutes, 5-seconds.

Tuesday, May 3, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, May 1, 2022). Total Airtime: 9-minutes, 43-seconds.

Thursday, May 5, 2022

- Produced and hosted by Bec Legato, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included new information and updates on developing stories, as well as the re-airing of interviews and packages from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, May 1, 2022). Total Airtime: 11-minutes, 22-seconds.

Sunday, May 8, 2022

- Hosted by Jay Bradley, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included a story about Ithaca College's senior students who contributed to WICB the last few years and a conversation with Lana Kennedy Brol, a Tik Tok influencer and mother who returned to Cornell University to complete their studies. The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted by Christian Maitre and Michael Memis and the Politics Beat segment hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 53-minutes, 35-seconds.

Sunday May 15, 2022

- Hosted by Bec Legato, this special "best of" episode of *Ithaca Now* featured a collection of stories and interviews that were previously produced and aired during Ithaca College's spring semester (February – May 2022). This included stories about incidents of antisemitism that occurred at Ithaca College, accessibility on IC's campus, the unionization of the Ithaca Starbucks locations and a conversation with Dmitry Bykov, the Ithaca City of Asylum's newest writer. Total Airtime: 49-minutes, 33-seconds.

Sports Programming: During the academic school year, WICB's Sports Department produces a 25-to-30-minute weekly sports magazine program called *Ithaca Sports Talk*. It features several long form interviews with athletes and coaches from the following local Tompkins County sports teams: Ithaca College Bombers, Cornell University Big Red, Tompkins Cortland Community College Panthers, Ithaca High Little Red, Trumansburg Blue Raiders and Lansing Bobcats. The show also includes scores, recaps and analysis. *Ithaca Sports Talk* airs each Sunday at 6:30 PM.

- Hosted by Rheanna Decrow, this episode of *Ithaca Sports Talk* included an interview with Ithaca College Women's Track & Field's Katelyn Hutchinson and a look at the upcoming schedule for IC's teams. Total Airtime: 25-minutes, 23-seconds.

Sunday, April 17, 2022

- Hosted by Rocco DiMaiolo, this episode of *Ithaca Sports Talk* included interviews with Ithaca College Tennis Player Zoe Davis and Caroline Wise of the IC Women's Lacrosse Team. Total Airtime: 26-minutes, 59-seconds.

Sunday, April 24, 2022

- Hosted by Michael Memis, this episode of *Ithaca Sports Talk* included an interview with Ryan Medeiros of the postseason bound Ithaca College Track & Field Team. In addition, WICB reporters Matt Sosler and Tommy Mumau previewed their story about IC Baseball alum Tim Locastro playing for the New York Yankees. Total Airtime: 20-minutes, 50-seconds.

Sunday, May 1, 2022

- Hosted by Tobiah Zboray, this episode of *Ithaca Sports Talk* included an interview with Ithaca College Softball's Julia Loffredo. Matthew Sosler also profiled Ithaca College Baseball alum Tim Locastro. He is currently an outfielder for the NY Yankees. Total Airtime: 29-minutes, 55-seconds.

Sunday, May 8, 2022

- Hosted by Matt Sosler, this special "best of" episode of *Ithaca Sports Talk* included a collection of stories and interviews that were previously produced and aired during Ithaca College's spring semester (February – May 2022). The interviews included conversations with Ithaca College Track & Field's Katelyn Hutchison and Newfield High School Basketball Coach Michael Nembhard. Total Airtime: 30-minutes.

Special Programming – VIC's 50 Hour Marathon

Friday, April 22nd – Sunday, April 24th, VIC Radio hosted its 35th annual 50 Hour Marathon. VIC ("The Voice of Ithaca College") is Ithaca College's student-run online radio station. Its programming streams live at VICRadio.org. Four student DJ's stayed awake and on-the-air to raise money for Southside Community Center in Ithaca. Since its incorporation in 1934, the Southside Community Center, Inc. continues to affirm, empower and foster the development of self-pride among the African American citizens of greater Ithaca.

The Marathon included music, live in-studio performances from local musicians, interviews and other special programming. In total, the Marathon raised \$5,104 with donations coming from local businesses and listeners.

The Marathon was simulcast on WICB – 91.7 FM and wicb.org. It started at 4:00 PM on Friday 4/22 and concluded at 6:00 PM on Sunday 4/24. More information about VIC Radio and the annual 50 Hour Marathon can be found at vicradio.org/50-hour-marathon.

Public Service Announcements – “Produced”: A collection of produced (pre-recorded) public service announcements broadcast each day of the week, airing once per hour. They are generally between 30-and-40 seconds in length and broadcast about 16-minutes past the top of the hour.

SWIFT 9-1-1

Encourages listeners to sign up for SWIFT 9-1-1 alerts, a service for local Ithaca citizens to help them stay informed about winter snow removal policies, along with other updates. The announcement was produced by WICB in conjunction with the City of Ithaca.

Ithaca Health Alliance

Informs listeners of the services provided by the Ithaca Health Alliance and the Ithaca Free Clinic. The IFC is known to many as the first free clinic in the U.S. to offer both primary care and holistic care through an integrated model. Produced and voiced by WICB.

Finger Lakes Independence Center (FLIC)

Provides information about Finger Lakes Independence Center (FLIC) and the community services offered. The announcement includes FLIC’s address and lists the website featuring more information. The PSA was produced by WICB in conjunction with FLIC and put into on-air rotation on July 12, 2020.

The Elderly Animal Organization

Encourages listeners to adopt older animals instead of younger ones due to a high euthanasia rate in older unadopted animals. The PSA was produced by WICB in conjunction with The Elderly Animal Organization and put into on-air rotation on September 16, 2021.

Matching Donors

Educates listeners about MatchingDonors.com, an organization that helps find organ donor matches. Produced by MatchingDonors.com and put into on-air rotation on September 20, 2021.

Adoptive and Foster Family Coalition of New York

Educates and informs listeners about child adoption and adoption options in the Central New York region. Produced by Adoptive and Foster Family Coalition of New York and put into on-air rotation on October 13, 2021.

Doctors Without Borders

Educates listeners about Doctors Without Borders, an organization that provided medical care internationally during the COVID-19 pandemic. Their care included medical training and the distribution of vaccines. Produced by Doctors Without Borders and added to on-air rotation on November 11, 2021.
