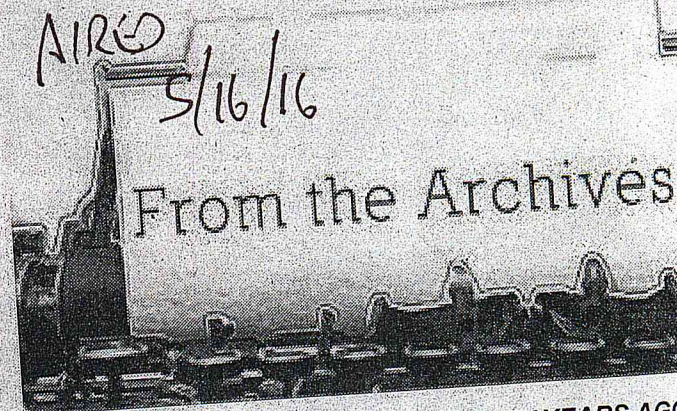

The Georgia Power Company filed application with the Federal Power Commission for the development of a \$46 million hydroelectric project at Laurens Shoals on the Oconee River. The Laurens Shoals dam would be located 13 miles east of Eatonton and 2 miles north of the Ga. Route 16 crossing of the Oconee. The power station would have a generating capacity of 324,000 kilowatts and would be the first hydroelectric installation on the company's system to use pumped storage.

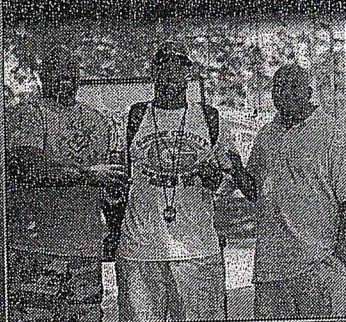

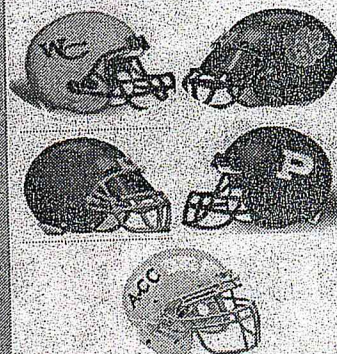

Should your organization **not** wish to participate in the College and Career Expo Hunt activity, please send your request in writing to the same address on the registration form.

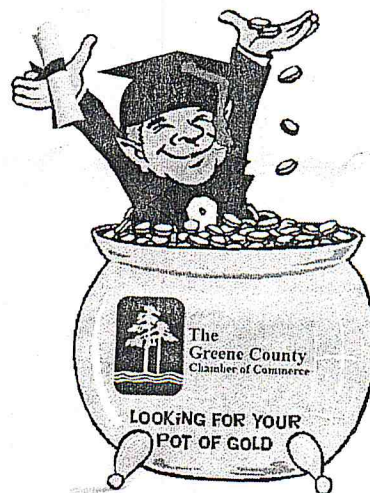

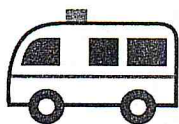

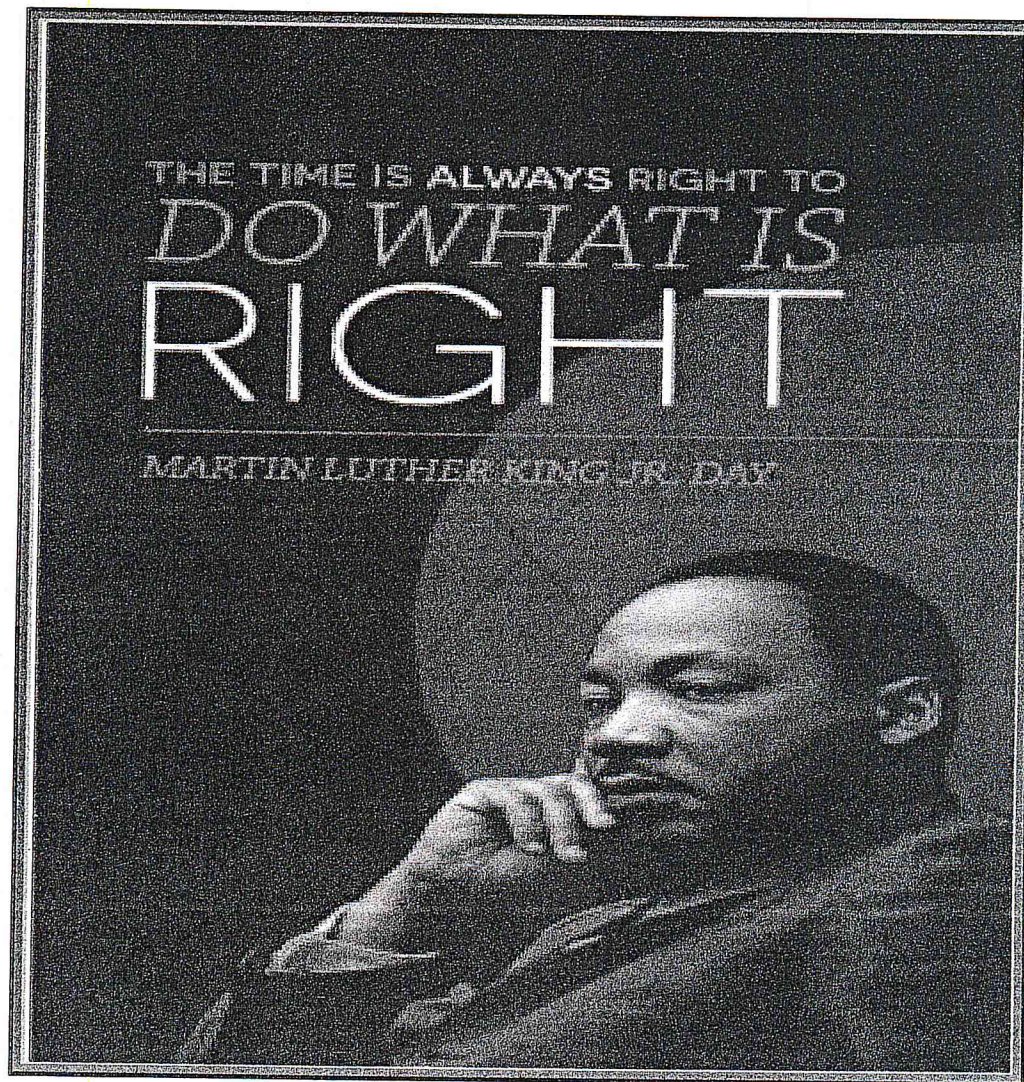
