Public Service Report Third Quarter 2016

October 11, 2016

98.7 WEPN-FM, which is owned by and licensed to Emmis Broadcasting, is a "sports-talk" radio station broadcasting in the New York metro area that carries ESPN Radio Network programming as well as local programming furnished by New York AM Radio, LLC pursuant to a time brokerage agreement. ESPN Network News is broadcast at the top of each hour. As a public service to the local community, traffic and weather updates are provided (3) three times an hour during morning drive (6A–10A) and afternoon drive (4P–7P). Additionally, if there is a breaking, non-sports news story of national or local significance, the station will break into its regularly scheduled programming and simulcast ABC News coverage.

The station devotes most of its broadcast day to discussion of current sports events and sports issues, including coverage of all tri-state area teams (professional, collegiate and high school). Listeners from the tri-state area are invited to call-in and offer their perspective on the various issues being discussed. ESPN broadcasts professional, collegiate and high school home games for several local New York teams.

New York Sports and Beyond: Airs Saturdays from 6am-7am and is repeated on Sunday mornings from 6am-7am, Hosted by ESPN's Bill Daughtry.

New York Sports and Beyond is a weekly public affairs program that airs on ESPN New York 98.7FM and ESPNNewYork.com. The show podcast can be downloaded on ESPNNewYork.com and the ESPN Radio phone app. The show focuses on current topics dealing with public safety, community events, and issues affecting people both in and around the sports community. A community calendar is also presented each show making listeners aware of what special events and fundraisers are going on in the New York/New Jersey listening area.

Public Service Announcements:

During **Third Quarter 2016**, the station aired <u>684</u> 30-second public service announcements, free of charge, in varying dayparts, from advertisers, advertising agencies, community groups and various "grass roots" community efforts.

But while much had been stolen. God left some good gifts within him, including the ability to battle back with fierce tenacity, courage and perseverance. Bryson walked at ten years old, and he actually progressed to participate in sports, his absolute passion in life. Today, at 30 years old he speaks just fine, though still struggles in other facets to live a normal life.

Jamie is working to raise awareness to help prevent others from experiencing this disease. Joining Jamie will be Dr. Leonard Friedland, Vice President, Scientific Affairs & Director, Public Health, GSK Vaccines, North America, who is available to educate families about the disease and offer steps parents can take to help protect their children.

Terrified that his wife and four daughters would someday be living with a man who is a mere shell of his former self due to his concussion history, Utecht wrote this book for his family. He chronicles his life as an athlete and how multiple sports-related traumatic brain injuries have resulted in severe memory loss. As a result, he has emerged as a leading advocate for brain health. The book is his journey from his early days throwing a football back and forth with his father to speaking about the long-term effects of concussions before Congress, and how his faith keeps him strong and grounded as he looks toward an uncertain future.

The Denver Broncos talked all last week about being physical. Players said they could tell as the season-opening Super Bowl 50 rematch went on last Thursday night that the hits were adding up on Carolina Panthers star quarterback Cam Newton. According to most analysts, some of the hits the reigning NFL MVP took, including at least four apparent helmet-to-helmet shots, were over the line, even though referees threw only one flag. Given all the recent attention on head injuries and traumatic brain injury, many are outraged that the NFL isn't doing more to protect players. This subject is bigger than just pro football. It's not only athletes who suffer from the disease, but children, military members and even some abuse victims can suffer from concussions and brain injuries. Dr. Esty shares the subtle and sometimes surprising symptoms of traumatic brain injury (TBI), how it affects sufferers and proven ways to treat it and help the brain heal.

In fact the founder of iHalt realized when the law enforcement tensions started last year that she had to find a way to counter the hostility toward police and put an end to the increasing lack of civility between the law and at-risk youth, and vice versa. Founded in 2015 in the wake of events in Ferguson, Baltimore and Cleveland (and perhaps even more relevant today), iHalt is striving to promote understanding, accountability and mutual respect with EMTs, police and firefighters. Founded by a loving mom, Judy Williams, who was angered by events surrounding children and the police, iHalt is already making waves across Virginia and is poised to grow on a national scale.

Hoops in the Sun" (or HitS) is a community based basketball program dealing primarily in the street ball industry. Joe "Pops" Cruz came up with the idea after seeing a tournament at Venice Beach on the West Coast many years ago. Since starting in 2000, Hoops in the Sun has already earned its spot as one of the premiere Pro-Am runs on the entire East Coast. With the \$5 million in improvements made to Orchard Beach in 1999, Hoops in the Sun has served as a complement to the rebuilding efforts and activity expansion within this New York City summer "hot spot".

The report, "The Expanding Transportation Network Company (TNC) Equity Gap: Adverse Impacts on Passengers with Disabilities, Underserved Communities, the Environment & the On-Demand Workforce," will appear in an upcoming book published by the New York University School of Law's Labor and Employment Law Center. The report emphasizes the TNC business model is one of privileged access. Using concrete data and evidence, it asserts the TNC business model halts progress in achieving accessibility for those with disabilities, deprives service to low-income, minority, rural and unbanked communities, harms the environment and increases congestion through unchecked vehicle proliferation and surge pricing, deprives city, state and federal governments of revenue, and marginalizes the on-demand workforce. The report was authored by Matthew Daus, former Commissioner of the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC).

7-9-16 NY Sports and Beyond - Segment 3, 6:30a: A video autobiography was recently released on former 4x national champion and 2x Golden Gloves champ Eric Kelly documenting his rise from NY gyms to the US Olympic Education Program to celebrity trainer at Brooklyn's renowned Gleason's Gym. Eric started boxing around the age of eight after his mother moved him from Florida to New York to live with his father and keep him out of trouble. At the New Bed-Stuy Boxing Center, he trained under legendary trainer George Washington, Harry Keitt & Dylan "Blimp" Parsley Sr. Eric left

Bed-Stuy to go to Gleason's, where under the tutelage of Hector Rocca, he won his 1st national title at 16. Ranked #1 in US, and #4 in the world. In 1998 at 156 pounds, he won the Daily News Golden Gloves, bronze in National Golden Gloves and u-19 Nationals Gold, solidifying his claim to 1998 Fighter of the Year. In 1999, Eric graduated High School and with a 2nd consecutive Golden Gloves title under his belt at 156, won a full scholarship to US Olympic Education Center. That same year he defeated Jerson Ravelo (#1 in county at 165) and won the 1999 American Boxing Classic. Eric would go on to win the 2000 Bronze at the US Championships (165), the 2000 National Golden Gloves, and be named a 2000 USA Olympic Alternate allowing him to train & travel with the US boxing team. At the 2001 US Nationals, Eric lost to 2004 Olympic gold medalist, Andre Ward, in the Finals, bumping him to #2 in US.

7-23-16 NY Sports and Beyond - Segment 4, 6:45a: Bill is joined by David Niu, President of AFL Global, the parent company to the new CAFL. Having received the official approval from the Chinese government, the new China American Football League (CAFL) will have its league debut in the fall of 2016. Many of the rosters will feature Chinese players who have been training for the arena game at select Chinese Universities. It's been three years in the making for the CAFL and organizers have been determined to build a strong foundation. The historic league is the brainchild of a very successful businessman, Marty Judge, owner of the Philadelphia Soul of the Arena Football League. Judge has teamed up with partners and NFL greats, Ron Jaworksi and Dick Vermeil. Other team executives include former NFL lineman, Ed Wang (VP of League Development), former rugby player, coach and developer, David Niu (President, AFL Global), and the head of football operations, Ken Bozarth. Chief Executive Officer of the CAFL is Gary R. Morris, who is president of the Judge Group.

8-6-16 NY Sports and Beyond - Segment 3, 6:30a: It was 1936. Hitler was coming to power and the Third Reich was hosting the Summer Olympics in Berlin. In America, the racial divide was prominent and African Americans were treated like second class citizens. Ironically, 18 black Olympic athletes traveled to Germany for the Summer Games. That country rolled out the red carpet in spite of an undercurrent of Aryan superiority and anti-Semitism. Those young men & women carried the weight of a race and a nation on their shoulders and did the unexpected with grace and dignity. "Olympic Pride, American Prejudice" is their story. This independent documentary and labor of love was directed, written, and executive produced by **Deborah Riley Draper**. Draper, Underwood and their partners are also working closely with several cultural & academic institutions to help celebrate the 80th Anniversary of those games, so that the story, which goes far beyond Jesse Owens, can be shared with a broader audience. They also just returned from a screening in Brazil, hosts of the 2016 Games.
