### Quarterly Issues Programs List for Station–KCYN

#### Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as local issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Local High School Sports:** Many residents in the area have great interest in the local high school football and basketball teams – but many cannot attend the games in person so we provide a community service where we broadcast many of the football and basketball games live.

#### **Dates of Broadcast Games:**

**Football:** Broadcast Local High School Football games on the following dates:

October 15 7-9 p.m.

October 22 7-9 p.m.

**Basketball:** Broadcast Local High School Basketball Games on the following dates:

November 30, December 2, December 3, December 15, December 29 and December 30<sup>th</sup>

- B. Moab Christmas Light Parade:** In conjunction with the local Chamber of Commerce that works to engage members of the community and create awareness of the many businesses struggling to survive during the Covid outbreak, we broadcast a parade put on by the Chamber to draw attention to the many businesses still open and operating. The businesses each had a float in the parade.

- C. Education and Entertainment:** To recognize the fact that Moab has a thriving live music community that locals may not be aware of, and to emphasize the importance of music education, which is being more and more neglected in our public education offerings, Bubba Bartosh invited local musicians to be interviewed on the station and give updates on the state of live entertainment and music education in Grand County.

Tamara Frita – Local musician and music teacher - interviewed live on the air on November 19<sup>th</sup> from 4 p.m. to 4:15 p.m.

Allan and Vallory Brown – Local performers and musicians – interviewed live on the air on December 3<sup>rd</sup> from 4 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- D. Local Employment:** In response to requests from the Manti-La Sal National forest service who was having a hard time filling positions using conventional sources, and there is high fire risk in the area. We aired information about openings for its secure school resource advisory committee. This committee improves collaborative relationships among people who use and care for national forests, of which several are within our listening area. These on air announcements were free to the Forest Service and aired on October 4<sup>th</sup> through October 8<sup>th</sup> during Bubba Bartosh's 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. live show.

- E. Local National Parks:** On December 13<sup>th</sup>, KCYN aired PSA's at the request of Arches National Park informing the public of the pilot program for the timed reservations system for the National Park Service. This was of critical importance since the line into the park was overloaded and causing public safety issues.
