The Christian County board met on Tuesday evening to discuss business, review committee reports, and announce appointments. The meeting took place at the courthouse and all board members were present except Miranda Langen. A wonderful donation from Jeff and Patricia Webb was presented to the board by Judge Ron Spears concerning a new portrait of Abraham Lincoln taken by George Peter Alexander or GPA Healy. After much discussion, the board recommended the changes concerning how salaries would be given out for year one and subsequent years after. They also agreed to talk about more in the future concerning how salaries were paid out. Sharp also says that they are aware of the Ameren Remediation Site and are working to get answers. The next county board meeting is Tuesday, November 21st, 2023.

County Sheriffs representing the counties in the Illinois Fourth Judicial Circuit have endorsed Associate Judge Douglas Gruenke in his election bid for At-Large Circuit Judge. The Sheriffs gathered at the Fayette County Courthouse to show their support. The vacancy in the position is a result of Justice Michael McHaney's election to the Illinois Appellate Court. Judge Gruenke's legal career has spanned more than 21 years, which includes serving in his current role as Associate Judge, and his former roles as Clinton County State's Attorney and as an attorney in private practice. The Primary Election in March 19, 2024. The Illinois Fourth Judicial Circuit is comprised of Christian, Clay, Clinton, Effingham, Fayette, Jasper, Marion, Montgomery and Shelby Counties. The Christian County Board is set to meet for their regular monthly board meeting this evening at 6:30 PM. After approval of minutes and public comments, the board will recognize the FFA, and hear from the ZBA. There will be a review of a sale of delinquent tax property in Assumption, and an amendment for a special use permit for Skyline Solar. Under new business, there will be an estimate for tuck-pointing, 2024 County Board meeting dates, and any other matters that get properly brought before the board. The Christian County Zoning Board of Appeals is set to meet on Wednesday, November 29th, for a public hearing. All rezoning, variance requests, special use applications, and text amendments to the Christian County Zoning Code are available for inspection upon request in the Christian County Zoning Office located at 214 Market Street, Taylorville.

The County Health Board voted to close the current building on the 15th and the Health Department will move to the old mental health association building which is 730 North Pawnee Street near the Junior High School. Dr. Chad Anderson, Public Health Administrator, says that they will try to keep operations as smooth as possible and are looking to hold a grand opening when things get opened later this month. The Taylorville City Council met on Monday evening to discuss business, approve ordinance, and review committee reports. All Aldermen were present except Jeremy Brown. After approval of minutes, the council tabled a motion limiting the number of liquor licenses with video gaming as Aldermen Chris Skultety asked to hold until all Aldermen were present. City Clerk Julie Lilly announced her resignation. Lilly has been the City Clerk since 2017. Mayor Bruce Barry read the resignation letter. As of this writing, the Council went into closed session to discuss negotiating matters between the city and the respective departments including AFSCME, Fire, and police. Scarecrow Daze took place on Saturday and it started with a parade in the morning that wrapped through the city streets of Shelbyville before commencing with an event downtown with festivities including food vendors, a dance studio production, and artists' Jake Cutler and Evan Matlock. Navigator Heartland Greenway LLC has withdrawn its application for a CO2 pipeline that would have covered parts of Nebraska, South Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa, and Illinois. The pipeline would have stretched more than 1,300 miles across the five states and Navigator CO2, withdrew the motion on Tuesday in front of the Illinois Commerce Commission. They intend to refile at a later date, depending on an evaluation on what the best plan is moving forward. Owen MacBride, is the attorney filing on behalf of Navigator Heartland Greenway. Illinois is not the only setback that Navigator Heartland Greenway has had, after South Dakota rejected their requests for a pipeline. They also withdrew their plans in Iowa. The original plans would have had the pipeline depositing CO2 deep in the earth in sites in Montgomery and Christian County.

Food prices are getting higher and higher, but according to a American Farm Bureau Thanksgiving Cost Survey, the average cost of a traditional Thanksgiving meal is actually down slightly compared to 2022. IFB volunteer shoppers reported to a state-wide average price of \$63.87 for a classic holiday feast for 10, or around \$6.39 per person. This reflects a 2.5% decrease over last year's average of \$65.53. AFBF or American Farm Bureau Federation reported a national average of \$61.17 or less than \$6.20 per person, for a classic holiday feast for 10 which is a 4.5% decrease from last year's record of \$64.05. Thanksgiving meals are still 25% higher than it was in 2019, highlighting how much high supply costs and inflation have touched the market.
