This two-hour program block features three half-hour educational series in combination with several short-form educational elements. The latter includes "Great Minds...Think For Themselves" (American history segments) and "Where'd It Go?" (short segments describing animal behavior).

Disney's Doug -- Narrated via the spoken journal entries of aspiring writer/cartoonist Doug Funnie, this series uses humor and fantasy in depicting the struggles of a twelve-year-old boy to define identity, develop self-confidence, resolve family and school problems and maintain friendships strained by preadolescent physical and emotional change. Series episodes promote values such as honesty, loyalty, fairness and respect for individual differences.

The Polish Constitution Day Parade, airing live on Saturday, 5/1, at 12-1pm and the Puerto Rican Parade, airing live on Saturday, 6/19, at 12-1pm, educate children and their parents about the heritage of Chicago's Polish and Puerto Rican communities, respectively.

On Sunday, 6/20, at 1-2pm, we aired What About Your Friends?, which received the NAACP Image Award for Outstanding Live-Action Dramatic Youth or Children's Series/Special as well as two Daytime Emmy nominations. This special sheds light on the many pressures that face high school juniors and seniors as they experience the transition from high school to college.

We aired Success Through Education: A Salute to Black Achievement, on Saturday, 6/12, at 1-2pm, which produces a solid message of empowerment through education.

We also aired Runaway on Sunday, 6/13, at 11am-12 noon, which is a story of survival and hope for a young boy who goes underground after blaming himself for a friend's accident and is befriended by a disabled Vietnam Vet.

And Puzzle Club Easter Adventure, airing on Saturday, 4/3, at 6-6:30am, is filled with adventure, suspense, and hope.

We also aired public service announcements during the 2nd quarter throughout the children's schedule which further the educational interests of children. These include PSA's from the Partnership for a Drug-Free America, the Partnership for a Drug-Free Illinois, the President's Council on Physical Fitness, the Chicago Public Library, the National PTA, the Anti-Cruelty Society, the American Library Association, Boys & Girls Clubs of America, Ad Council/US Department of Transportation, 4-H, Center for Substance Abuse Preventation, the Kohl-McCormick Foundation, Save the Children USA, the US Department of Justice, and the National Committee to Prevent Child Abuse.

WLS-TV also enhances the instructional content of its on-air educational children's programming by sending out to 80 schools in the Chicago area copies of ABC's Classroom Connection, which contains lesson plans and suggested discussion topics connected to ABC's educational children's programs.

In addition, WLS-TV's on-air talent regularly speak at area schools about careers in the television industry.
