## Community Issues list

### **1. Education**

## 5. Environment

Run down houses in local neighborhoods and the money that the city spends to keep them from becoming hazards. Praise and complaints regarding the upkeep and maintenance of local roads. Complaints against animal shelters. Problems caused by business and residential neighborhoods being vacated and allowed to deteriorate. Cost of sewer services too high. More money for Public Parks.
