PART 1 – INTRODUCTION

KQIZ (FM) is licensed to Amarillo, TX and serves the Amarillo area. October 1st, 2019 through December 31st, 2019, KQIZ (FM) aired 30 minutes of public affairs programming bi-weekly. This includes a locally produced weekly program “West Texas Community Issues” that focuses on issues affecting our local community and includes guests who have knowledge of these topics.

Weekend Programming: “West Texas Community Issues” – every other Sunday morning from 7 – 7:30a. Details about individual West Texas Community Issues segments are included in Part 2 of this report.

KQIZ is a participant in “The Amber Plan”, in which area radio stations alert the public of confirmed child abductions. In the Fourth Quarter of 2019, KQIZ activated “The Amber Plan” when necessary, to provide information about child abductions to the general public.

In addition, KQIZ is the primary FM station in the Amarillo area for the Emergency Alert System. As such, KQIZ accepts responsibility for alerting other FM stations as well as our own listeners in the event of a local or national emergency. KQIZ suspended normal broadcasting on several occasions to activate the EAS system during periods of severe weather.
