# WCHG Most Significant Issues 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter – July Through September 2013

We aired national news broadcasts from NPR News at the top of each hour during our Morning Drive (6-10 a.m.) and Evening Drive (3-6 p.m.) as well as at the beginning and end of our Noon Hour Magazine (12 and 1 p.m.). At the bottom of each hour during the Morning and Evening Drive-times, we alternated airing state news reports from the Virginia News Network (VNN) and WV Metro News. VNN news also aired at 12:30, during Noon Hour Magazine, and WV Metro News aired at 12:55. These programs run Monday through Friday. We also carried NPR National News at Noon on Saturday and Sunday. Our local news stories aired after NPR News at the beginning of Noon Hour Magazine. They would then repeat at the top and bottom of each hour during the Evening Drive and the following day's Morning Drive. Here is a summary of the most significant issues covered in our local news this quarter.

#### **County Government**

We aired reports from each Bath County Board of Supervisors meeting, and we aired an agenda for each meeting the day before. Board of Supervisors reports this quarter aired on 7/10 (courthouse renovation), 7/11, 8/9, 8/15, and 8/28.

We air periodic updates from Bruce McWilliams, the Chairman of the Bath Board of Supervisors. This quarter, these reports aired on 7-1.

On 7/15, we aired a story about the 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Division of Motor Vehicles office in Bath county.

On 8/14, we aired a story about the new Bath County administrator.

#### **Court /Crime**

On 7/31, we aired an interview with Bath county sheriff Robert Plecker speaking about his views on gun control.

On 8/9, we aired a story about a foiled bank robbery in the county. We ran a follow up story about this event on 8/14.

#### **Election Stories**

On 7/22 thru 7/26 we aired a series of excerpts from a gubernatorial debate held in Bath county between candidates Terry McAuliffe and Ken Cuccinelli.

#### **Education and Children**

We cover the meetings of the Bath Co School Board. During this quarter, these reports ran on 8/8, 9/5, and 9/6 (new sports rule).

On 8/19, we aired a story about the new principal at Valley Elementary school in Hot Springs.

On 8/20, we aired a story about a new Bath county resource officer at the high school.

#### **Agriculture and Environment**

Each day, during Noon Hour Magazine, we aired a regionally-produced three-minute news magazine feature about topics related to agriculture. Agriculture is a major industry in our listening area, and being produced in the Shenandoah Valley, On the Farm Radio, is relevant to our listeners.

We air periodic reports from Patrick Sheridan, District Ranger for the Warm Springs District of the George Washington and Jefferson National Forest. This quarter, these stories aired on 7/18, 8/5, 9/3, and 9/25.

On 7/5, we aired a story on the Great Eastern trail, part of which traverses part of Bath County.

On 7/23, we aired an update on the Cowpasture River project.

On 7/25, we aired a story about new Nature Conservancy interns and the projects they are working on.

#### Community

On 7/2, we aired a story about upcoming workshops to teach people how to live with and take care of those with chronic disease conditions.

On 7/24, we aired a story about new hunting regulations passed in Bath county

On 7/30, we aired a story about the Wings and Wheels festival which brins a number of visitors to the county.
