Discussed the NC Supplemental Retirement Board's recognition by the National Association of Government Defined Contribution Administrators for its leadership. Talked about the current state of the NC State pension and the economic growth of North Carolina. **EC, PA**

Discussed NCCash.com which houses millions of dollars of NC resident's money that for one reason or another was unable to be delivered. Discussed the millions of dollars that have already been claimed by residents, non profits, bussinesses, and local and city governments. **EC, PA, EH**

The backpack program is 100% funded by donations on nonperishable foods that can be sent home with over 30 students to insure they have food over the weekend and during holidays. Many of these students rely on free or reduced lunches at school for their only nutrition and the program makes sure they are able to eat when school isn't in session. **HN**

12/14/23 8:40a-9:15a Carson Johnson, Tom Britt, and Leanne Petty talked with Kelly Hunter, PIO for the City Of Mebane about the retirment of Fire Chief Bob Louis and his role in developing the Mebane Fire Department during his 30 years of service. He was Mebane's first Fire Chief. Discussed the new Fire Chief, John Wellons, who was previously the Interm Chief Of Operations and Training for the Chapel Hill Fire Department but was already a Mebane resident. Discussed his qualifications and his goals for the Mebane Fire Department. Discussed the closing of Huey's Oyster Bar in Mebane. Huey's has been in business for 66 years and has been a Mebane staple. Discussed the aproval by the Mebane City Council for the WRRF expansion which should keep residents from paying higher sewer and water rates. Discussed a request for a Special Use Permit for a Water Resouce Recovery Facility around 23 acres. The area was rezoned previously. Upon approval the facility will improve capacity from the current two and a half million gallons per day to four million, and eventualy, six million gallons per day. Expansion comes from an influx of commercial businesses, jobs, and residential growth. Population projects show the need to expand and prepar infrastructure. Discussed an upcoming Clorine Burnout which is done annually to optmize water quality for the city. Further discussed the possability of a Buckees in Mebane and an upcoming Planning Board meeting on the subject. Discussed upcoming events for the City of Mebane as well of government offices holiday schedule and dates of closure, as well as changes in trash pickup during Christmas and New Year's. PA, GR, IN, EC
