Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Crime/Scams.** As the Western New York area hits the dead of winter, snow begins to fall more often, which can lead to scams surrounding snow removal companies. Kat Schmieder, Communications Dir BBB of Upstate NY discussed Snow Removal and Contractors scams, Gift Cards, Romance/Online Dating/Valentines Day, Income Tax related scams and Pet Scams. Kat mentioned what to look out for and how to avoid such scams.
- B. **Mental Health.** Erie County Health Department data shows that 2023 was one of the deadliest years for opioid deaths in Buffalo with nearly 400 deaths. Brigid Keane Outreach Coordinator for MATTERS discussed the services offered by MATTERS, common barriers to treatment, resources available, and what listeners can do to help.
- C. **Children's Health.** Variety the Children's Charity of Buffalo & WNY has been serving the needs of WNY's sick, disabled, and disadvantaged children for over 80 years. This is the 62nd year for the Variety Kids Telethon in WNY, the longest running local telethon in the nation. Bill Simon discussed Oshei Children's Hospital, one of the beneficiaries of the funds raised on the Telethon.
- D. **Adult Care.** Over 13% of Buffalo's population is 65+ years old. Kelley Clem VP Clinical Education Hospice Buffalo, discussed differences between Hospice and Palliative Care, how care is not only patient focused but family focused as well, who should be investigating care and why do people resist Hospice and Palliative care.
- E. **Faith Based Initiatives.** Deacon Steve Schumer discussed the 100th Appeal in support of Catholic Charities and Fund the Faith to reach their goal of 9.5 million dollars. The mission of Catholic Charities is to provide hope for all faiths with the WNY Community. Last year the appeal helped 145,000 individuals and families and supported more than 50 programs and ministries
