Overview of News Operations

Local News

The news department of BAS Broadcasting Inc. provides full service local news coverage. The staff attends Sandusky County Commissioner and Fremont City council meetings as well as others as needed, in addition to attending numerous other events and activities each year. All the local news is written and produced by News Director Tom Fullen.

WFRO provides approximately one and a half minute long newscasts at the top and bottom of the hour on weekdays between 6 and 9a.m. and also at noon and 5p.m. Plus breaking news is provided on an as needed basis.

State News

BAS Broadcasting also utilizes the Ohio News Network to provide state news that affects local residents as a part of its regular newscasts.

National News

WFRO airs one minute ABC newscasts at the top of the hour on weekdays between 6 and 9a.m. as well as noon and 5p.m. Top of the hour ABC newscast are also aired on the weekends.

Sandusky County

WFRO news continued to provide coverage regarding county commissioners and other county offices for listeners. WFRO talked with the county health commissioner on two separate Community Focus programs regarding need for COVID, flu and other vaccinations, as well as the conducting of a countywide community health assessment study. Ongoing coverage was given to the grand opening of the newly renovated Birchard Library in Fremont as well as the search for a new library director. The county emergency management agency director was interviewed regarding preparation plans for the April 8 total eclipse. Ongoing coverage was provided with the county sheriff regarding the installation of a new 9-1-1 dispatching system. Coverage was also done for a special state election held on August 8.

Fremont

WFRO news continued to provide coverage of Fremont city council meetings and other city related news including the construction of a new industrial park and a new downtown amphitheater. Residents were also provided coverage of ongoing street improvement projects and their impact on traffic.

Schools

WFRO news continued to provide local coverage regarding area schools and school board meetings. Community Focus program interviews were done with both the Fremont and Clyde school superintendents discussing preparations and changes for the new school year, including security improvements.

Other Communities

WFRO News continued to cover news regarding other communities including Bellevue, Clyde, Woodville and Gibsonburg, including their council meetings. Special coverage was given to the preparations for and the visit of the Wall that Heals Vietnam Memorial which visited Gibsonburg in September. Extra news coverage was also given to public hearings and plans to expand a grain elevator facility in Clyde, as well as a request to change to industrial a parcel of land in Clyde.
