Section 1 - Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Aging With Your Home** This segment covered changes you can make to your home that make it more accessible to those who are older. As Maine has one of the oldest (median) populations in the country, this resonates with our audience.
- B. Air Travel For People With Disabilities This segment of the show covers the difficulties that people with disabilities face when traveling on planes. As Central Maine is home to one of the best (and oldest) VA hospitals in the country, we tend to have a higher than normal population of disable service men and women.
- C. **Is COVID-19 The New Flu** This segment of the show discussed how the COVID-19 pandemic has become endemic. Like nearly everywhere else in the world. Central Maine has had to deal with the pandemic.
- D. **Combined COVID-19 / Flue Testing Kit** This episode of the show talked about how there is now a combine COVID-19 / flu testing kit. As stated above, COVID-19 (and the flu) affect us here in Central Maine as much as they affect other parts of the world.
- E. **Tie Blindness** There is a new theory that some people (particularly those with ADHD) suffer from time blindness. They just do not have a good sense how time management. This is something that we have witnessed in several Central Maine workplaces including our own offices.
