According to a news release, this is an add-on service for the department through Axon, the same company that provides the department's body cam services. Within 72-hours of police responding to a call, a survey will be sent to the caller's phone. Survey responses will be anonymous. According to Bloomington Police Chief Jamal Simington, the city is the second agency in the state and first in Central Illinois to pilot the survey service. Simington spoke with our news partner WMBD-TV. Bloomington Police will pilot the survey for 90-days and then assess the results.

Folks allegedly crashed his car into a cornfield just off the Carlock exit. McLean County prosecutors charged Folks with numerous traffic-related offenses, armed robbery, and aggravated robbery. Hundreds of Illinois State University faculty could soon be part of their own union. According to an Illinois Federation of Teachers news release, 650 tenured and tenure-track faculty at ISU filed for authorization cards with the Illinois Educational Labor Relations Board to express their intent to unionize Wednesday. ISU Director of Media Relations Eric Jome released the following statement: "Illinois State University respects the legal right of University tenured and tenure-line faculty members to seek union representation under the processes set forth in the Illinois Educational Labor Relations Act." United Faculty of ISU (UFISU) started its unionization efforts in August, and it is expected to be certified by December, according to our news partner WMBD-TV.

ISP agents gathered evidence regarding the allegations and issued an arrest warrant this week. He was transported to the Livingston County Jail where he is awaiting a judge to set pretrial conditions. According to a news release, Meister has been relieved of his police duties and equipment. It spans more than two stories and can light up with embedded color-changing LEDs. The museum's executive director Beth Whisman spoke with WJBC. The exhibit cost \$894,000 and took over 24 months to complete. The project was funded by a Public Museums Capital Grant from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and philanthropic support from the Children's Discovery Museum Foundation.

Georgia Nugent joined Illinois Wesleyan as interim president in August 2019, and was selected as the University's 20th president in November that year. She is the first woman to serve in the role at Illinois Wesleyan. Nugent helped guide the university through the COVID-19 pandemic, something she won't forget during her five years at the school. Nugent spoke with WJBC's Blake Haas. According to a news release, the search for Illinois Wesleyan's 21st president will begin immediately.

Bloomington police will pay \$200 for handguns, shotguns and rifles - \$400 for ghost guns, and \$500 for assault weapons. BPD public information officer Bryce Janssen says the goal of the event is to promote gun safety, especially proper gun storage.

McLean County Corner Kathy Yoder has released the name of the victim of the Saturday afternoon car crash near Ellsworth. 16-year old Eliza Levandoski, of Arrowsmith, died as a result of multiple blunt injuries to the head during a vehicle collision, according to our news partner WMBD-TV. Levandoski was the driver of the car and was wearing a seatbelt, according to Yoder. A toxicology test is pending and the incident remains under investigation.

The Bloomington police department announced an overwhelming response to its first gun buyback event Sunday morning. Public Information Officer Bryce Janssen said the department collected more than 200 firearms. This includes 70 handguns, 66 Rifles, 56 Shotguns, and, 25 "Assault-style" weapons. Janssen said the event held at the Bloomington Fire Department maintenance and training annex had cars lining up before it even started. The department ended up giving out \$50,000 for the guns. The money came from a grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, according to our news partner WMBD-TV.

District 87 is looking to acquire a building from State Farm to help expand Pre-K and early childhood education services. On Friday, the district announced the initiation of a purchase agreement with State Farm for the Oakland Avenue Building. According to District 87, the \$4.5 million expenditure will also enhance career and technical education programs offered through the Bloomington Area Career Center subject to the Board of Education's vote. The district says State Farm agreed to lease back a portion of the building for training purposes. Our news partner WMBD-TV reports the district this will ensure it secures a mutually beneficial partnership for a minimum of three years and will offset the financial burden of the acquisition. The money will come from current district reserve funds.

TITLE: Normal Town Council approves new Raising Cane's

It was unanimous approval from the Normal Town Council on Monday for a new Raising Cane's Chicken restaurant. Located at 311A S. Veterans Parkway, the chicken finger spot is set to replace Beauty Brands in the Shoppes at College Hills. The proposed plan for Raising Cane's would demolish the current building. Beauty Brands has been in that location for 13 years. Adam Bell, VP of Development for Core Acquisitions, said the lease for Beauty Brands is up in May 2025 with no further extensions and no ability to extend. Raising Cane's was founded in 1996 and specializes in chicken tenders.

## ISSUE: Business HOW ISSUE WAS TREATED: News story TITLE: Rivian ends exclusive agreement with Amazon Date: 11/9/2023 Duration: 30 second story, ran between 6am and 3pm

Electric vehicle maker Rivian said Tuesday that it will allow other companies to purchase its fleet of delivery vans, ending an exclusive agreement with Amazon. In an announcement made alongside its third-quarter earnings, the Irvine, California-based car maker said the decision provides other companies more opportunity to electrify their delivery fleets and reduce carbon emissions. The agreement with Amazon, made in 2019, included provisions that barred Rivian from selling commercial vans to other customers and provided Amazon exclusive access to the vans for four years from when it began receiving the EVs. According to our news partner WMBD-TV, Rivian reiterated its pledge to help Amazon put 100,000 electric vehicles on the road by 2030. Amazon says it's rolled out more than 10,000 so far. More sales of Rivian vans also helps Amazon, which owns a 17% stake in the electric car company.

On Friday, students and community members were protesting at Illinois State University in the Bone Student Center. In a press release ahead of the protest, the group said Democrats are showing a lack of support for Palestine. Participants of the protest showed their opposition via a die-in by lying down on the floor holding signs. One demonstrator also continuously read a speech and read the names of some deceased children. The protest was outside the McLean County Democrats Obama Legacy Dinner which was also in the student center. U.S. Representative Eric Sorensen attended the dinner after taking a tour of ISU. He said he appreciates that young people are taking an interest in what's going on overseas.

A Bloomington garbage company wants to set the record straight on a possible new transfer station off Bunn Street. Lakeshore Recycling Systems, a Chicago-based company, owns Henson Disposal. Earlier this year, Henson applied to build a new transfer station that could handle up to 400 tons of solid waste daily. But now, the company faces feedback from community members on the possible uptick in traffic. Rob Fazzini, a business consultant for Henson Disposal, spoke with WJBC's Scott Miller. If approved, the transfer center, which compacts solid waste, would be the only solid waste landfill in McLean County. It could take several months before Henson's disposal could receive a green light to begin constructing the center.

The system that is currently in place, which is original to the decks, will no longer be manufactured after 2023. This has caused all three parking decks to start implementing a new system which will be a gateless entry that now has license plate scanners. Drivers will download the "Passport Parking" app to pay for the time they park. Town officials say there is still an option to pay with cash at Uptown Station, but that can occasionally cause a longer wait time, especially when trains and buses are unloading. Signage with QR codes for the "Passport Parking" app will be put up in all three parking decks, but the change won't officially start until January 2.

Illinois High School Association member schools approved 12 of 14 amendment proposals that appeared on the all-school ballot, but a proposal that would have significantly changed football scheduling in the state failed to pass. The proposal would have established eight football districts in each class with eight schools in each district with the Top 4 schools in each district qualifying for the IHSA playoffs. The only other proposal that did not pass sought to decrease the number of allowable summer contact days between coaches and student-athletes. The 2023 legislative process brought out the highest voting total in over a decade, as 89% of the membership participated in the vote, according to the IHSA.

A spike in COVID-19 hospitalizations and increased virus activity have state public health officials urging caution this holiday season. Capitol News Illinois reports the state Department of Public Health sent an alert to hospitals and long-term care facilities last week recommending facility-wide masking and other precautions to prevent the spread of illness. In addition to COVID-19, I-D-P-H is also tracking influenza and R-S-V hospitalizations, both of which have been trending upwards in recent weeks. COVID-19 hospitalizations are highest in west-central Illinois and the Kankakee area. IDPH also encourages those traveling or hosting events for the holidays to practice good hand hygiene and to stay home if they feel any symptoms such as coughing, sneezing or a sore throat. Vaccinations for COVID-19 and the flu are available at most pharmacies. A vaccination for RSV is recommended for people who are pregnant and for those age 60 and older.

The final Illinoisan serving a life sentence for drug offenses under the state's so-called three-strikes law has been released from prison. Capitol News Illinois reports the Prisoner Review Board voted to release Charles Collins, of Chicago, last week after Governor JB Pritzker commuted his life sentence to allow for the possibility of parole. Collins was sentenced to life for intending to sell cocaine in 2010 after two previous drug offenses in 1998 and 2007. In prison, he took part in rehabilitation programs and the parole board unanimously granted his release. The state's habitual criminal law is still on the books but has been narrowed to exclude certain offenses.

A southern Illinois federal judge officially declined to issue an injunction to delay the January 1st registration requirement under the state's assault weapons ban. Capitol News Illinois reports U.S. District Judge Stephen McGlynn issued the 34-page order this past Friday. Several challenges to the law are still making their way through the courts, but McGlynn's decision means the law is not likely to face a temporary injunction while those cases progress. Owners of weapons, ammunition and accessories banned under the act must register them with the Illinois State Police by January 1 in order to legally keep them.

A McLean County man was sent to the hospital after a two-vehicle crash near County Roads 1900 North and 2300 East near Towanda last Friday.
