Lincoln College students are largely stunned and scared after the abrupt news that the 157-year-old institution is closing its doors.

Students told our news partner Heart of Illinois ABC college president David Gerlach held a meeting to break the news to them.

Gerlach says the pandemic is the driving factor behind the school's closing, saying total enrollment before the pandemic was around 750 students. By Fall 2020, that dropped to 630.

As of now, Lincoln College is set to close its doors May 13.

Gas prices in Illinois inched down over the week, but still well above four bucks, averaging \$4.42 a gallon.

According to GasBuddy, prices in the state are 26 cents higher than a month ago and \$1.41 higher than a year ago.

GasBuddy price reports show the cheapest station in Illinois is priced at \$3.79 while the most expensive is \$5.39.

The national price of gas dropped about five cents over the week, averaging \$4.17 a gallon.

TITLE: Man arrested in downtown Bloomington on multiple weapons-related charges

Date: 4/5/2022

Bloomington's police chief said the arrest of an armed habitual criminal in Downtown Bloomington may have thwarted a gun crime and possibly saved lives.

Someone called police about 11:45 a.m. Wednesday, claiming to have seen a man hide something in an alleyway, enter the courthouse, then return to pick up the item. It turned out to be a gun, according to police.

Officers used one of the department's public safety video cameras to quickly find the suspect in the 100 block of East Market Street. Police said in a news release that James Mathis Jr., 34, of Bloomington was armed with a gun, but he was arrested without incident.

Mathis faces numerous weapons-related charges. His bond was set at \$250,000, with 10% needed or \$25,000 cash to be released from the McLean County Jail.

Illinois State University's Professor of History Amy Louise Wood is the recipient of double honors with a \$60,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) and a year-long fellowship from the National Humanities Center (NHC).

With the awards, Wood will dedicate the next year and a half to writing a book that examines the cultural and intellectual history of criminal justice in the United States in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

According to a statement, as part of the NHC Residential Fellowship Program, Wood will be invited to join a cohort of scholars with the aim of generating new knowledge in the humanities.

Over the last 40 years, fellows have produced more than 1,700 celebrated books.

One day after the University of South Carolina won the women's college basketball tournament, an Illinois House resolution commemorating the fiftieth anniversary of Title IX ran into some opposition the sponsor likely did not expect.

Title IX paved the way for women and girls to play school sports.

After asking what "LGBTQI+" means, State Rep. Blaine Wilhour (R-Beecher City) asked sponsoring State Rep. Katie Stuart (D-Edwardsville) for the definition of a woman.

"I really am just shocked that there is opposition to supporting something like Title IX," Stuart responded. "Your line of questioning is offensive. Offensive."

"Okay," Wilhour answered. "You still didn't answer the question: What's the definition of a woman?"

This came after Republicans shouted, "NO!" when Stuart made a customary motion for all representatives to be added to the resolution as co-sponsors.

Eleven members voted against it, and forty did not vote at all.

Our news partner HOI ABC reports Rivian also estimated nine local taxing bodies, including the Unit 5 School District, would get a share of almost \$600,000 in new property tax revenue over 25 years.
