The website adds the status means the organization's registration is revoked, any rooms they have scheduled are cancelled, and they are restricted from functioning as a registered student organization under their current name without the authorization of the Dean of Students' office. According to our news partner 25 News, Kappa Sigma violated five parts of the school's code of conduct.

State Farm Insurance is notifying the state it will lay off 451 Information Technology employees working at the company's Corporate South offices in Bloomington starting at the end of March. However, a State Farm spokesperson said many of those laid off are being offered similar jobs with the outside firm taking over IT-related services. The Illinois Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act, known as the WARN Act, requires companies with 75 or more full-time employees to provide 60-days' notice of mass layoffs or plant closures. On Jan. 12, State Farm announced it hired India-based HCLTech to run the insurer's IT help desk, plus manage hardware, infrastructure software and network connections. According to our news partner 25 News, State Farm filed the layoff notice six days later on Jan. 18. A State Farm spokesperson says the 451 employees include many people who received offers to work for HCLTech with similar work arrangements at their current work locations. State Farm did not say how many employees received those offers.

Infinity Pointe will be at the northwest corner of Parkside Road and West Hovey Avenue, adding approximately 400 new units with a mixture of single-family and medium-density multifamily homes. The annexation agreement includes developers providing electric vehicle charging stations for each multifamily building, building a multiuse trail along Parkside and Hovey, and installing a wet-bottomed detention basin where residents can go fishing. Our news partner 25 News reports development fees will also be paid to the town as part of the annexation agreement.

The university's Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs Aondover arhule will serve as interim president through June 30, 2024, pending approval from the governing board on Friday. Kinzy was selected as the 20th president of ISU back in May of 2021, the first woman to hold the position. In a news release, Kinzy says she appreciated the opportunity to engage with Illinois State students, faculty, staff, alumni, and friends. At this time, she intends to pursue other opportunities. A presidential search announcement will be made at a later time.

ISU expects its insurer will pay for the entire project with the exception of a \$100,000 deductible, according to the staff's report. The Nov. 18 fire destroyed about 66%, or about 31,000 square feet, of the beef barn, including the calf birthing room. The university did not lose any cattle, thanks to the efforts of Farm Manager Jason Lindboom who responded to the middle-of-the-night call and moved all of the animals out of the barn. According to our news partner, 25 news, the 116 cows were temporarily moved to

neighboring farms. The university said it's working toward having the farm fully operational again in time for the fall semester.

According to our news partner WMBD-TV at last Thursday's school board meeting, the board accepted a separation agreement with a district employee. One parent, who asked to remain anonymous, said that the public outrage has nothing to do with homophobia, but the contents of the book were concerning. Parents claim the teacher also put out a Google Drive assignment with a link directing students to a graphic documentary.
