A police officer in Normal is being honored for his service to families of officers who have died in the line-of-duty. Normal Police Chief Steve Petrilli on Thursday presented Officer Chad Bock with the Meritorious Police Service Award.

In the aftermath of a mass shooting in Highland Park, the Governor of Illinois says it could have been much worse if police didn't respond quickly and bravely. Governor JB Pritzker says the Monday shooting will change forever how a community remembers July 4th celebrations. The gunman shot and killed six people while wounding at least 30 others.

A teenager from Bloomington is facing "ghost" gun charges in McLean County. Prosecutors allege 19-year-old Xavier Moreau had a handgun with no serial number in the 9-hundred block of North Roosevelt Avenue last Thursday. Police say detectives contacted Moreau during an investigation and allegedly found the "ghost" gun. Moreau is facing charges of unlawful use of a weapon and no valid FOID card.

McLean County Coroner Kathy Yoder says 50-year-old Michael Simpsen of Normal died from extensive multiple blunt force injuries due to a pickup truck and automobile collision, reportedly sustained as the driver of the pickup truck. Authorities say the crash happened around 8:45 Tuesday morning at the intersection of Route 165 and North 2400 East Road. The crash remains under investigation by the coroner's office and State Police.

According to the release, the governor is experiencing mild symptoms and has been prescribed the anti-viral medication, Paxlovid.

Beginning July 1, 2022, the extension runs until June 30, 2027, and includes a yearly salary of \$242,892 as well as the eligibility of a bonus for academic and athletic success, not to exceed \$20,000 in any contract year. Brennan was named to the position in December of 2020 and begins his third academic year at the helm of the department.

to replace Matt Coates, who resigned his District 4 seat when Gov. JB Pritzker appointed him to serve on the Illinois Prisoner Review Board. Eight Republicans voted no and seven Democrats voted for Able's appointment. Republican Gerald Thompson and Democrats Jim Rogal and Hannah Beer were absent, according to our news partner 25 News.

McLean County's largest school district will be asking voters' permission this fall to raise property taxes to reduce multi-million-dollar structural deficits in the education fund. The Unit 5 School Board voted unanimously Wednesday for a referendum that asks for an increase in the district's tax rate to \$3.60 per \$100 of assessed valuation, from the current tax rate of \$2.72. School officials say the tax rate has risen just 10 cents over 40 years, helping fuel the district's financial troubles. According to our news partner 25 News, if the referendum is approved by voters, property taxes will rise about \$400 per year for the owner of a \$180,000 home.

Officers found the juvenile and administered first aid, before he was taken to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries, according to 25 News. No one else was reportedly injured. There is no suspect information or arrests made at this time. The incident remains under investigation.

The Bloomington City Council Monday night unanimously approved a three-year contract with 107 union employees that will cost taxpayers almost \$800,000 over the life of the deal. The contract covers employees in Public Works, Parks and Recreation, and other departments. They'll receive a 3.5% raise the first year, a 3% pay hike the second year, and a 2.75% increase the third year. Workers will also get a \$750 signing bonus. Total cost to the city including the bonus is just over \$794,000 over the three years, according to city staff. According to our news partner 25 News, the city started negotiating March 10th with leaders from AFSCME Local 699, and members have been working without a contract since the previous deal expired April 30th. It's the city government's largest employees' union.

Park confirms speed was not an issue in the crash which is attributed to the sun in the driver's eyes which prevented seeing the child or the crossing guard. The driver was cited for disregarding a traffic control

device, according to our news partner 25 News. The child was taken to the hospital with minor injuries.

The McLean County Health Department is collaborating with the Illinois Department of Public Health to complete contact tracing for the case to identify any close contacts and provide vaccines to those identified as an exposure risk. In a news release, health department administrator Jessica McKnight says the monkeypox virus does not spread as easily between people as what we've seen with the virus that causes COVID-19. But anyone in close contact with a person with monkeypox virus can get it regardless of gender identity or sexual orientation.

The board agreed with referendum objector Patrick Dullard, who claimed that state law permits only villages, not incorporated communities like Normal, to be divided into districts. Normal is currently governed by at-large council members

who are elected by voters from the entire town. Our news partner 25 News reports residents wanting the referendum on the ballot plan to appeal in McLean County Circuit Court.

The largest gains are seen in minority student enrollment which is up 13 percent over fall of 2021 and 24 percent from fall of 2020. Enrollment in new students is up 6 percent from last year.

The long-time mayor of Normal was on Capitol Hill Wednesday to speak in front of a Senate transportation committee. Mayor Chris Koos was nominated to serve on the Amtrak Board of Directors and spoke about his experience with Uptown Station in Normal. Uptown Station was opened in 1990 and rebuilt in 2012. Since then, Koos said it has become the second biggest Amtrak station in Illinois, second only to Chicago's Union Station. He said around 230,000 passengers go through Uptown in a given year, citing pre-pandemic statistics.

Illinois State University welcomed its largest freshman class in 35 years for the 2022 school year. Over 3,900 freshman students moved to campus this fall, bringing the total enrollment to just over 20,000.
