Little waived indictment and pleaded guilty, pursuant to a written plea agreement in January of this year. According to the news release, Little has paid back her personal taxes and \$150,000 of the corporate taxes she owed. She will pay the remaining balance as part of an IRS payment plan. The case was investigated by the Internal Revenue Service.
