TITLE: ISU administrator dies after being hit by bicycle on campus

An administrator at Illinois State University died Friday morning after being struck by a bicycle last week. 49-year-old Adam Peck, an Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs at ISU, was the pedestrian hit by the bicycle last Monday. The crash happened on the ISU campus near South University Street, according to a joint press release from McLean County Coroner Kathy Yoder and Illinois State University Police Chief Aaron Woodruff.

On September 15, Normal Police officers responded to a vehicle versus pedestrian accident outside of Pub II in Uptown Normal, which left two ISU students hospitalized and in critical condition. Monday, NPD announced the arrest of 20-year-old Aidan McCain in connection with the incident. NPD immediately began an investigation into the cause of the accident and due to the severe injuries sustained by the two pedestrians, called in their accident reconstruction team. It was determined McCain was travelling northbound on Linden Street at an extremely high rate of speed and lost control of the vehicle.

The two major political parties in McLean County have now weighed in on a tax referendum for the county's largest school district. McLean County Democrats meeting Tuesday night voted to accept the party's executive committee recommendation urging voters to vote yes on the proposal, conflicting with the McLean County Republican Party's recommendation to reject the referendum. Voters will decide in the November election whether to approve raising the Unit 5 school district's education fund tax rate 88 cents to \$3.60 per \$100 of a property's value. Our news partner 25 News reports the "Yes for Unit 5" committee claims the referendum, if approved, will actually reduce the overall tax rate because working cash bonds previously used to fill budget holes will be allowed to expire.

The Normal Town Council narrowly agreed Monday night to favor hometown Rivian Automotive by purchasing two electric vehicles without going through the formal bidding process. Our news partner 25 News reports the town won't advertise for bids, which typically enable taxpayers to get the lowest possible price for major government purchases. The council's vote was 4-3 not to seek bids. Instead, the elected officials authorized City Manager Pam Reece to buy an electric pickup truck and sport utility vehicle from Rivian, which has invested more than \$500 million in the local plant and hired more than 6,000 people.

TITLE: Unit 5 tax referendum doesn't pass

The Unit 5 school district faces the prospect of severe budget cuts after voters on Tuesday rejected a tax referendum to offset growing deficits in the district's education fund. The referendum asked for an 88-cent increase in the education fund's tax rate to \$3.60 per \$100 of assessed property values. School leaders said that rate has risen only 10 cents in the last 40 years. No organized groups surfaced to campaign against the referendum, but the issue became political when the McLean County Republican Party urged voters to vote no. McLean County Democrats responded with a statement urging voters to approve the referendum. Unit 5 School Board President Barry Hitchins and Superintendent Kristen Weikle each expressed disappointment in statements released Tuesday night.

Democrat Tammy Duckworth won her re-election bid to the U.S. Senate over Republican Kathy Salvi. In Illinois' U.S House District 16 - incumbent Republican Darin LaHood was elected to another term. In the Congressional 17th District, Democrat Eric Sorensen declared victory over Republican Esther Joy King. And in the state's 91st House District, Democrat Sharon Chung came out on top after Republican Scott Preston conceded late Tuesday night.

Rivian Automotive has added a second shift of workers making electric vehicles, and despite supply chain challenges, the company said it still expects to meet its goal of producing 25,000 vehicles this year. Rivian, with more than 6,000 employees working at its plant in Normal, released third quarter results Wednesday afternoon. According to our news partner 25 News, the company said it produced 7,363 pickup trucks and sport utility vehicles from July through September, up 67% from the second quarter.

The McLean County State's Attorney's Office has filed a felony charge alleging worker's compensation fraud against a county correctional officer. 48-year-old Ryan Hitch is alleged to have intentionally made false or fraudulent material statements for the purpose of obtaining a

worker's comp benefit by falsely stating and misrepresenting the severity of an injury. That's according to a news release from McLean County Sheriff Jon Sandage. The allegation goes further to say that he obtained or attempted to obtain more than \$10,000 as part of his claim. According to our news partner 25 News, with the filing of charges, Hitch is now on administrative leave without pay. Sandage says he has filed a complaint with the McLean County Sheriff's Office Merit Commission to seek the termination of Hitch.

No injuries were reported and the cause of the fire is still under investigation.

Autopsy indicates that Johnson died of multiple blunt injuries, reportedly sustained as the driver of an SUV. Toxicology testing is pending. No one else was hurt. The board has previously been controlled by Republicans, however, there is now an even 10 to 10 split on the board. All 20 members were sworn in Monday right before the chair and vice chair were officially chosen, according to our news partner 25 News.

TITLE: Stanford Police arrest juvenile for suspected vehicle theft

Stanford Police have arrested a 17-year-old juvenile suspected of stealing a sport utility vehicle that was later found wrecked and abandoned in Urbana. Police Chief Dustin Carter said in a Facebook post that the SUV was stolen October 31. Police entered the report in a database that can be seen by all law enforcement agencies. Five days later, on November 4, Urbana Police said they recovered the vehicle, according to our news partner 25 News. Last week, Carter said police arrested the 17-year-old for theft and criminal trespassing to a motor vehicle and resisting arrest.

The new hosting agreement will place the event at Hancock Stadium on Thanksgiving weekend for the years of 2023 to 2027. Hancock Stadium hosted the inaugural IHSA Football State Finals in 1974 and hosted over 100 IHSA Football State Championship games from 1974 to 1998. According to the Bloomington-Normal Area Convention and Visitors Bureau, approximately 25,000 fans are expected to fill Hancock Stadium and the Twin-Cities community for these events each year, with an annual estimated direct economic impact of over \$2.1 million.
