TITLE: Miller Park Zoo to increase admission prices in 2024

The Miller Park Zoo in Bloomington is upping its admission fees in 2024. According to a zoo news release, admission prices, programs, and memberships will increase in the new year. Jay Pratte, Zoo Director at the Miller Park Zoo, has the rundown of updated admission costs. He spoke with WJBC's Scott Miller. This is the first increase in prices since 2015 when admissions were raised by one dollar, and the second since 2008.

TITLE: Jury selection to begin Monday for Bloomington murder trial

Jury selection begins Monday in a trial involving the murder of a Bloomington man in 2021. 21-year-old Kentrell Brown of Minnesota stands accused of three counts of first-degree murder. McLean County Prosecutors allege Brown played a role in the death of 26-year-old Natwan Nash. According to court documents, Nash was found dead at his apartment in the 2400 block of Clearwater Avenue in Bloomington. Judge Jason Chambers is presiding over the case.

TITLE: McLean County Clerk addresses concerns about election security

Date: 1/8/24

Duration: 30 second story, ran between 6am and 3pm

McLean County Clerk Kathy Michael held a press conference last week to address concerns about election security and emergency evacuation plans of the McLean County Government Building. Early elections start on February 8, and Michael brought concerns to the McLean County Financial Committee that were provided by the Statewide Terrorism and Intellect Act (STIC), about what happens around the world, country, and in some surrounding areas. Michael would not indulge information on those concerns. Michael also brought forth concerns about security at the Eastland Mall due to a break-in that occurred last year. Michael presented a request for \$25,000 of the American Rescue Plan Act funds to ensure better election security. The request received one motion, but not a second, failing the request. Michael says there will be extra police presence at the voting booths in the Eastland Mall during voting hours. They will also be carefully setting up security cameras to ensure the safety of the booths after voting hours.

Meteorologist Chris Yates spoke with WJBC's Blake Haas. Another two to five inches of snow is expected overnight, with rain chances expected Wednesday. A parking ban remains in effect for the Town of Normal until 6 p.m.

Fewer donors than needed gave over the holidays, drawing down the national blood supply and reducing distributions of some of the most needed blood types to hospitals. An abundance of McLean County residents and groups spoke out against the migrant resolution that was voted on at Thursday night's McLean County Board meeting. The board voted against the resolution 13-7, which was proposed by District 10 county board member Chuck Erickson. The resolution would have prohibited the use of taxpayer-funded services for migrants sent to McLean County from another state. According to our news partner WMBD-TV, public comment lasted around two hours as many residents voiced their opposition, but there were some who encouraged the board to vote yes. TITLE: Connect Transit will temporarily remove peak service on several bus routes

Bloomington-Normal's public transit authority has announced they will temporarily remove peak service frequency from several of its routes. In a news release, Connect Transit says they've chosen to make these reductions preemptively to avoid inconsistent service on a day-to-day basis, allowing greater stability for riders. Connect Transit says the Yellow Route will begin running on 30-minute frequency.

The following routes will begin running on a 60-minute frequency: the Aqua, Blue, Orange, Purple and Silver routes. Connect encourages riders to periodically check its website for the most up-to-date timetables for each route.

Cold temperatures are to blame for flooding at one local nonprofit. On Sunday, Major Dan Leisher at the Salvation Army in Bloomington found a broken pipe in the attic of the building. That led to the flooding of several restrooms and half of the nonprofit's gymnasium. Deborah Cole, the Director of Development, spoke with WJBC's Scott Miller. The Salvation Army does not have a damage estimate or how long the repairs could take.

A Bloomington teen has been identified as the victim of a shooting that occurred in Peoria on Martin Luther King Jr. Day. Peoria Police were responding to an alert of 5 rounds fired in the 2100 block of West Lincoln Avenue. 18 year-old Marcus Whitehead was found on the scene with a gunshot wound, and despite officers attempts at life saving measures, Whitehead was pronounced dead on the scene. According to the Peoria County coroner's office, an examination revealed Whitehead had several gunshot wounds and died instantly due to internal bleeding. The case remains under investigation by the Peoria Police Department.
