1) Issue: PUBLIC SAFETY

DESCRIPTION: WXCV FM airs information concerning PUBLIC SAFETY issues during our public service broadcasts that effect the Nature Coast area.

2) Issue: BENEFITS AND FUNDRAISERS

DESCRIPTION: WXCV FM is proud of their continued involvement with local charities that conduct fund raising events on the Nature Coast.
