PUBLIC AFFAIRS RELATED PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

The following summarizes a representative sample of programming that provided the most significant treatment of community issues during the past quarter. Programming frequently deals with more than one issue.

The Doctor's Office - Tuesdays at 9:32 am (Health)

A 27 minute weekly call-in Program with medical professionals answering questions about a variety of health care topics.

Greenhouse - Wednesdays at 9:32 am (Agriculture)

A 27 minute weekly call-in program with horticulture experts answering questions about plant, tree and lawn care.

Education in Moberly - Thursdays at 8:55 am (Education and Youth Issues/Higher Education)

An interview, about 5 minutes each, with staff and administrators with the Moberly Public Schools and Moberly Area Community College.

Education in Macon - Fridays at 8:55 am (Education and Youth Issues)

An interview, about 5 minutes each, with staff and administrators with the Macon Public Schools.

Adams on Agriculture - Weekdays at 10:06 am (Agriculture)

A 54-minute talk show dedicated to agricultural issues, with various political and agricultural experts.

Outdoor Report - Sundays at 6:10 am (Conservation and Environment)

A weekly 4 to 5 minute interview with an agent from the Missouri Department of Conservation about conservation issues and events.

Legislative Interviews - Various Times (State Government)

We do weekly 5 to 8 minute interviews with area lawmakers that air at various times throughout the weekend, adjacent to newscasts.
