The following summarizes a representative sample of programming that provided the most significant treatment of community issues during the past quarter. Programming frequently deals with more than one issue.

**The Doctor's Office - Tuesdays at 9:32 am (Health)**

A 27 minute weekly call-in Program with medical professionals answering questions about a variety of health care topics.

**Greenhouse - Wednesdays at 9:32 am (Agriculture)**

A 27 minute weekly call-in program with horticulture experts answering questions about plant, tree and lawn care.

**Education in Moberly - Thursdays at 8:55 am (Education and Youth Issues/Higher Education)**

An interview, about 5 minutes each, with staff and administrators with the Moberly Public Schools and Moberly Area Community College.

**Education in Macon - Fridays at 8:55 am (Education and Youth Issues)**

An interview, about 5 minutes each, with staff and administrators with the Macon Public Schools.

**Adams on Agriculture - Weekdays at 10:06 am (Agriculture)**

A 54-minute talk show dedicated to agricultural issues, with various political and agricultural experts.

**University of Missouri Extension Report with Dhruba Dhakal - Saturdays at 6:25 am (Agriculture and Conservation)**

A weekly feature on research and events featured by University of Missouri Extension.

**Outdoor Report - Sundays at 6:10 am (Conservation and Environment)**

A weekly 4 to 5 minute interview with an agent from the Missouri Department of Conservation about conservation issues and events.

**Legislative Interviews - Various Times (State Government)**

We do weekly 5 to 8 minute interviews with area lawmakers that air at various times throughout the weekend, adjacent to newscasts.
