

## Quarterly Report (January - March 2013)

Following is a list of some of the significant issues responded to by KBIA-FM, Columbia, MO., along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period January through March 2013. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which issues appear does not reflect priority or significance. The program is **Global Journalist** and airs weekly on Thursdays at 6:30 except where otherwise noted. Global Journalist is a half-hour weekly discussion of international news by a panel of journalists from throughout the world. The program is produced by KBIA's Rehman Tungekar.

### *Jan 3: An interview with Ken Paulson*

Global Journalist hears from Ken Paulson, President and CEO of the First Amendment Center in Nashville. He spoke about free speech in the U.S. in the digital age.

### *Jan 10: A conversation with director Scott Thurman (rebroadcast)*

Host David Reed speaks with Scott Thurman about his film, *The Revisionaries*. The film chronicles the culture battle fought within the Texas Board of Education over the state's curriculum standards.

### *Jan 17: A conversation with columnist Mona Eltahawy (rebroadcast)*

Last year, the University of Missouri School of Journalism awarded Mona Eltahawy the Missouri Honor Medal for Distinguished Service in Journalism. She's a columnist based in New York and an international public speaker on Arab and Muslim issues. Eltahawy has been named one of Newsweek Magazine's "150 Fearless Women of 2012," one of Time Magazine's "People of the Year" and one of Arabian Business Magazine's "100 Most Powerful Arab Women." She joined Global Journalist to talk about her work, and about the conditions in her home country, Egypt.

### *Jan 24: How US drone strikes impact Pakistan*

The U.S. government has escalated the uses of drone strikes in Pakistan and in Yemen since the start of the year. And now the U.S. appears to be considering the use of drone strikes in Mali, a North African country where French forces are helping the government fight Islamist militants and rebels. To hear more about the global impact of US drones, Global Journalist spoke to Judith Bello. She's a peace activist based in New York state and a member of the Fellowship of Reconciliation's Task Force on the Middle East.

### *Jan 31: Elections in Israel shift focus to political center*

Host David Reed talks to two Middle East experts, Glenys Sugarman, Executive Secretary of the Foreign Press Association in Israel, and Wayne White, Scholar with the Middle East Institute, about the short and long term impact of elections in Israel and Jordan.

### *Feb 7: Why jihadists are taking root in North Africa*

Host David Reed speaks with photojournalist Pete Muller, and Mary Harper, Africa Editor at the BBC World Service, about a recent surge of Islamist violence in North Africa.

### *Feb 14: What the resignation of Pope Benedict XVI means for the Catholic Church*

Host David Reed speaks to David Gibson and Alessandro Speciale -- two journalists from the Religion News Service -- about the surprise announcement that Pope Benedict XVI is resigning at the end of February. Later in the program, David talks to Bill Roggio, Managing Editor of the Long War Journal, about the use of drones in US counter-terror operations.

*Feb 21: Will it become easier to report on China?*

Host David Reed speaks with the New York Times' Andrew Jacobs and the University of Sydney's Kerry Brown about the upcoming change in China's leadership and how it will affect the country for decades to come.

*Feb 28: 'Dirty Wars' exposes US covert operations around the world*

Host David Reed speaks with Jeremy Scahill, writer and producer of the film *Dirty Wars*, and Richard Rowley, the film's director. The movie explores covert US operations around the world, in countries including Afghanistan, Yemen and Somalia. Rowley and Scahill are both scheduled to appear at this year's True/False Film Festival.

*Mar 7: How elections are playing out in Kenya/How the death of Hugo Chavez could affect Cuba*

Host David Reed speaks with Reuters correspondent Marc Frank about how Hugo Chavez's death will impact Cuba. The show also received an update on Kenya's presidential race from Wangui Maina of the Nation Media Group and Missouri School of Journalism professor Randy Smith.

*Mar 14: NPR strategist discusses tweeting the Arab Spring*

Social media pioneer Andy Carvin drew high praise from fellow journalists for his coverage of the revolutions in Tunisia, Egypt, Libya and Syria. The NPR reporter and strategist tracked the Arab Spring events in real time via Twitter, from thousands of miles away in Washington. He spoke to *Global Journalist* host David Reed about his new book *Distant Witness: Social Media, the Arab Spring and a Journalism Revolution*.

*Mar 21: Fear of violence lingers ahead of Pakistani elections*

Host David Reed talks to three Pakistani journalists about the dangers reporting within the country.

*Mar 28: Directors discuss filming in the former Soviet Union*

Host David Reed presents highlights from a panel discussion presented at the 2013 True/False Film Festival. Panelists spoke about the difficulties making films in former Soviet Republics with repressive regimes. Panelists: Tinatin Gurchiani, Maxim Pozdorovkin, Askold Kurov, Madeleine Sackler.
