Paul Ryan, despite his initial hesitation, was elected the 54th Speaker of the House this week. Ryan called for unity and renewal within the GOP party, the week that outgoing Speaker John Boehner helped pass a bipartisan budget deal. Robert Costa of The Washington Post reports on the experience Ryan brings to the job. President Obama announced this week that circumstances have changed and has authorized Special Forces to Syria to assist rebel fighters battling ISIS. Doyle McManus of The Los Angeles Times says that Obama's decision to enter Syria may be an indirect response to Russia's recent occupation within the country.
