## Business/Economics

**6/1** – Rock N Roll Marathon Economic impact -- TRT: 1:30

The Rock and Roll Marathon hit the streets today. The event provides a huge boost to the local economy because it features thousands of visitors.

**6/3** – San Diego Salaries – TRT- 0:25

A new government report finds the average San Diego earns more than most Americans. Stats on how much the average worker here makes an hour, along with which local professions earned the most.

**6/7**– Del Mar Fair opens — TRT 1:52

San Diego County Fair opened today. The fair attracts thousands of people every year and gives an economic boost to the surrounding businesses and restaurants.

**6/6** – Minimum Wage Rally TRT 0:20

Today-- San Diego business owners will hold a news conference to explain why they support the proposal to raise the minimum wage.

**6/9** – City Spending – TRT- 1:40

A nearly \$3.5 billion spending plan for the City of San Diego was approved. Break- down where the money will go and how it's supposed to improve the city.

**6/10** – Wildfire Loans– TRT: 20 sec

How homeowners who lost their property can apply for a loan.

**6/13**—SDGE Power Bill Hike -- TRT: 25

SDGE says the average monthly bill will go up 17 percent next year. The company says this is due to extra costs for renewable energy.

**6/17** – Minimum Wage Gloria – TRT: 24

City council president Todd Gloria released a "compromised" minimum wage proposal—with hopes to go on November ballot.

**6/18** – Rady Children's Hospital Data Breach – TRT: 0:20

A data breach at Rady Children's Hospital is affecting more than 20,000 patients after spreadsheets with personal information were accidentally sent to prospective hospital employees.

**6/19** – Foreclosures Down – TRT: 0:20

Banks foreclosed on about 140 properties in San Diego in May, dropping to an eight-year low.

**6/22**– World Cup viewing parties – TRT: 45

Crowds gathered throughout San Diego to watch the game. In North Park, dozens of USA fans cheered on their team as they took on Portugal and as we saw there was no shortage of drama in the matchup. Businesses took advantage of all the people to bring in big profits.

**6/24** – Job Fair – TRT: 18

Fortune 500 companies looking to fill open positions. The free job fair hosted by 'hire-live' is today at the Embassy Suites in La Jolla.

**6/29** – FAB LAB SD -- TRT: 45

FAB LAB SD and The Civic Innovation Lab provide community-led teams to show how citizens can come together to address civic issues by designing solutions. “The Open City Project” features Urban Prototyping and Civic Hacking, part of a global movement exploring how participatory design, art, and technology can improve cities and increase civic engagement.

## **Crime**

**6/2** – SDPD Body Cameras – TRT - 2:30

The San Diego Police Department is quietly rolling out use of body cameras worn by field officers. Our reporter explains how and where the cameras will be used.

**6/3** – Meth Ring – TRT - 2:30

A man is in court, accused of selling huge amounts of meth out of a business that caters to families and kids. More details about the drug ring and what happened in court.

**6/10** – Karate Instructor Sex Accusations – TRT: 1:00

The owner of a Poway karate studio accused of having sex with a minor is facing 500 charges and being held on \$25 million bail.

**6/12** – Chula Vista Shooting– TRT 0:20

This morning, a 27-year-old man is shot and killed in a Chula Vista home with a child sleeping in another room.

**6/15** –Deadly fight in the Gaslamp District -- TRT 1:30

It was a deadly morning in San Diego's popular Gaslamp district. Police say they are investigating a homicide.

**6/18** –National City Shooting– TRT: 22

The search for a gunman after a fight broke out at a bar during the World Cup.

**6/22** – City Heights Robbery – TRT: 45

Police are on the lookout for a gunman who robbed a convenience store in El Cajon last night. Witnesses say the masked robber walked into the "La Villa Hermosa Market" on El Cajon Boulevard just before seven, and pointed a gun at the clerk.

**6/23** – North Park Attacks – TRT: 25

This morning-- police need your help identifying two men who attacked several people in North Park.

**6/24** – El Cajon Shooting Walter Live shot – TRT: 1:30

This morning, the search is on for the gunman who shot and killed a man in El Cajon.

## **Environment**

**6/2** – EPA Announcement – TRT 0:22

Today the environmental protection agency will propose major cuts to power plant air pollution.

**6/2** – EPA Carbon Emissions -- TRT: 45

The Obama administration announces new rules on carbon emissions. Both sides of political isle react.

**6/4** – Bernardo Fire Cleanup – TRT 2:00

**6/17** – La Jolla Fireworks Lawsuit – TRT: 1:20

The City Council is expected to approve a settlement over permits for La Jolla cove's July fourth fireworks show. Several lawsuits were filed saying environmental reviews needed to happen before the show could go on.

**6/17** – Point Loma Sewage Spill – 0:25

Warning signs are posted at the stairway of a popular beach spot after more than 1,200 gallons of raw sewage overflowed onto the street and into a storm

**6/18** – Fireworks Dispute – TRT: 20 sec

The new environmental guidelines for the La Jolla Cove fireworks show.

**6/18** – Cost of Wildfires – TRT: 0:20

The wildfires that ravaged San Diego in May cost \$60 million to fight, including about \$28 million in property damage.

**6/21**– Linda Vista riverbed fire – TRT- :45

Firefighters battled a fire in Old Town that started late this afternoon. Reports of smoke around Morena Boulevard and Napa Street came in shortly after 3:00 pm. Fire crews arrived to discover some brush burning in a nearby riverbed.

**6/21**– Fire cleanup - TRT: 45

Volunteers from all over the county came to Escondido today to clean up debris leftover from the Cocos fire. Firefighters from the Escondido, harmony grove and San Diego fire departments all showed up top help. Three homes near Country Club drove in Escondido were heavily damaged by the fire.

**6/22** – Fire Training Animal Rescue Demonstration -- TRT: 45

Today the San Diego Humane Society partnered with the SPCA to help pet owners prepare for fire season. They expect this year to be one of the most active on record, and say everyone should have a plan.

## **Government**

**6/1** – Voting Preview -- TRT: 1:30

Voter turnout for Tuesday's primary election here in San Diego County is expected to be rather average. Between 35 and 40 percent are expected.

**6/2** – Yes on Props B & C – 0:40

Supporters and opponents of 2 San Diego city ballots make a final push before Election Day. The props are zoning measures for Barrio Logan, home to a huge shipyard and much of San Diego's working class.

**6/2** – NSA Facial Recognition – TRT 0:25

The National Security Agency is reportedly capturing millions of images per day to enhance facial recognition software.

**6/2** – Tuesday Election Preview – TRT 1:43

Candidates made a last minute push ahead of the June Primary. A preview of all the races.

**6/4** – Ric Epps on June Primary – TRT 4:00

Political Professor, Ric Epps provides a recap of the June Primary.

**6/11** – Minimum Wage Debate – TRT: 2:00

The San Diego city council is debating whether to raise the minimum wage to \$13 over the next three years.

**6/12** – GOP House Majority Leader Vote – TRT 0:21

House majority leader, Eric Cantor is stepping down after losing the primary. This is the first time a majority leader lost the election.

**6/21**– Iraqi peaceful demonstration — TRT 1:22

With so much unrest and violence going on in Iraq, local Iraqis here in San Diego stand united protesting from thousands of miles away. Fox 5 is live in El Cajon where people gathered and prayed for peace.

**6/21**– Peter’s congress kick off – TRT: 45

Scott Peters kicked off his bid for a 2<sup>nd</sup> term in Congress with over 100 supporters today. City Council President Todd Gloria and councilmember Ed Harris were there, along with other city leaders. Peters currently represents California’s 52<sup>nd</sup> district, a spot he won in 2011.

**6/24** – Roberts Aerial Tram Proposal – TRT: 40

Today-- County Supervisor Ron Roberts will propose building an aerial tram linking Balboa Park to downtown San Diego.

**6/24** – Mayor Budget Video – TRT: 24

San Diego mayor Kevin Faulconer has released a five- minute- long on-line video, about the city’s nearly 3-billion dollar budget.

## **Health**

6/3 – County Tattoo Infections Warning – TRT - 2:00

County health officials issued a warning about getting tattoos after 2 San Diegans got sick from a rare bacterial infection after getting a tattoo. It’s so serious, the CDC, FDA and even our District Attorney’s office are investigating.

**6/5** – Working Hard Not Worth It – TRT: 27

UC San Diego did a study on working hard, and whether it’s worth the extra effort.

**6/5** – CPR Training – TRT: 21

There was free CPR training at various sites throughout the county, as part of National CPR Awareness Week.

**6/9** – Local VA Audit – TRT - 2:00

A new audit on national veterans' hospitals flagged two San Diego clinics for review. Our reporter gives more detail about the report, why the clinics were flagged and the quality of medical care given to our local veteran community.

**6/10** – Pregnant Women More Fish – TRT: 25

Health experts say pregnant women should eat more fish – just making sure not high in mercury.

**6/17** – Whooping Cough Outbreak – TRT: 0:25

Health officials in California have declared a whooping cough epidemic in the state; more than 600 cases have already been reported in San Diego in 2014.

**6/18** – Large Waist Lifespan – TRT: 30

A large waist may shave years off your life. The Mayo clinic people with larger waistlines die younger.

**6/19** – E-Cig Regulations – TRT 21

The City Council will consider proposed regulations on e-cigarettes. The ordinance would restrict use and control sales of the devices, like regular tobacco products.

The President has announced a plan to help save America's honey bees and other pollinators. Pesticides and mites, along with other factors, have caused the honey bee population to drop off in recent years, including here in San Diego.

There are new reports out about the dangers of binge drinking. According to a nationwide study, heavy alcohol use kills almost 88-thousand people a year.

## **Military**

**6/2** – Marine Dog – TRT 2:30

MCRD San Diego has a new mascot, Smedley Butler.

**6/3** – Miramar Air Show – TRT 3:30

The Miramar Air Show is back this year. Colonel John Farnam is in studio with what is new this year.

**6/3** – Blue Angels Guilty – TRT: 30

The former commanding officer of the Navy's Blue Angels was found guilty today of allowing sexual harassment in the workplace.

**6/6** – Wings Over Gillespie Preview – TRT 1:30

One Coronado couple is trying to change that by organizing PTSD awareness day. They lost their son Daniel, an Iraq war vet, when he took his own life last June.

**6/08** – Coast Guard rescue off the coast -- TRT: 35

Nine people were saved by the Coast Guard after their boat overturned off shore near the US, Mexico border. A helicopter and one patrol boat were sent out and a few hours later, they were found.

**6/17** – USS Peleliu Deployment – TRT 0:20

The USS Peleliu is scheduled to leave San Diego today for the largest naval exercise in the world. The assault ship and it's nearly 11-hundred sailors will deploy to the western Pacific and Indian oceans.

**6/20** – Veterans Clothing Drive – TRT: 0:25

The Veterans Village of San Diego is holding a clothing drive to collect underwear, shoes, socks, towels, toothbrushes, and deodorant for next month's stand down event.

**6/22** – Medal of Honor Recipient honored at Petco Park -- TRT 1:45

The first pitch today at Petco Park was a very special one. It was from the hands of a national hero, Medal of Honor recipient, Kyle Carpenter.

**6/24** – Jailed Marine New Lawyer – TRT: 1:50

Pressure is mounting on the Mexican government to release Marine Andrew Tahmooressi, who's been held in a Mexican jail for nearly three months.

**6/24** – Kerry in Iraq -- TRT 1:45
