Mondays 6:00 - 7:00 pm

Host Chase Ulicny and guest contributors, many being students or graduates of Duke University’s Fuqua School of Business, discuss the business side of sports talent. They interview guests with substantial experience in the industries of media, entertainment, and sports. The show explores ways to break into these industries and how to make a profession there.

“**Living Planet**” is produced by Deutsche Welle and covers environmental science and

sustainability.

“World in Progress” is produced by Deutsche Welle and covers events occurring in the developing world.
