Section I. Issues

WXDU has identified the following issues to be among the significant issues in our community in this quarter.

1. Local Arts
2. Sports and Athletics
3. Local Roots
4. Community Science Watch
5. Arts Education and Outreach

Section II. Responsive Programs

WXDU has broadcast programming dealing with the above-referenced issues. Examples of programming dealing with each issue are outlined below.

1. Local Arts
  - a. Art Line (Monday-Friday at 11am, duration 5 minutes). A daily listing and description of all arts presenters, gallery exhibits, openings and special presentations in the Durham Community
  - b. Concert calendar (Mon-Fri at 4pm, duration 5 minutes). A daily listing of all local music performances and special events in the Durham community.
  - c. "I Liked You better Before You Sold Out" (every Sunday at 6pm, duration 60 minutes) Co-hosts interview local musicians and purveyors of art in the community. For example (see [www.wxdu.org/blog](http://www.wxdu.org/blog) for full list):
    - i. "I Liked You better Before You Sold Out" (6/12/2011 at 6pm, duration 60 minutes) Co-hosts interview local band Pink Flag about its upcoming album.
    - ii. "I Liked You better Before You Sold Out" (6/12/2011 at 6pm, duration 60 minutes) Co-hosts interview local band Bitter Resolve about its upcoming single release.
2. Sports and Athletics
  - a. "The Sports Show" (4/3/2011 at 7pm, duration 90 minutes). Co-hosts talked about the ramifications of Duke's performance in the NCAA Men's Basketball tournament, an important issue for the

community given the number of fans in the area and the local tournament location.

- b. "The Sports Show" (3/13/2011 at 7pm, duration 90 minutes) Co-hosts discussed the prospects of local players in the NBA draft and their potential. They also talked about the UNC v. Duke rivalry in the Carlyle Cup, which gives points for the performance of all of the Duke and UNC local teams, an issue that has great interest to the community because of the proximity of the two fan-bases among our listeners.
- c. "The Sports Show" (every Sunday at 7pm, duration 90 minutes) Co-hosts highlight Duke's non-revenue sports that listeners might be interested in but aren't always covered by newspapers and sports TV, like soccer and cross country. They also tried to indicate upcoming home competitions for our listeners to be able to attend.

### 3. Local Roots

- a. "Bull City Cosmic Hoedown" (5/3/2011 at 7pm, duration 60 minutes): WXDU hosts local blues legend Bullfrog Willard McGhee to play some tunes and talk about his time playing with Reverend Gary Davis, Blind Boy Fuller, and others.
- b. "Who's Got the Cuckoo?!" (4/24/2011 at 9pm, duration 60 minutes): host interviews Crispy Bess, organizer of local instrumental music festival "Instro Summit." Crispy also previews some of this year's acts.

### 4. Community Science Watch

- a. "Science in the Triangle" (6/19/2011 at 8:30pm, duration 30 minutes): co-hosts interview Laura Z. Powell of the American Council on exercise about her work promoting healthy lifestyles in America and in Afghanistan.
- b. "I liked You Better Before You Sold Out" (5/1/2011 at 6pm, duration 1 hour): Co-hosts interview local musician Shayne Miel about his struggle with cancer and the outreach organization he and his wife founded as a result.
- c. "Science in the Triangle" (4/10/2011 at 8:30pm, duration 30 minutes): co-hosts interview Thomas Vaidhyan, Founder and CEO of Aten, a local technology start-up that focuses on childhood education interfaces.

### 5. Arts Education and Outreach:

- a. "I liked You Better Before You Sold Out" (5/22/2011 at 6pm, duration 1 hour): local arts interview show talks with Ann Woodward, director of the Durham Scrap Exchange, about her role in the Durham arts community.
- b. "Divaville Lounge" (6/19/2011 at 2pm, duration 2 hours): jazz specialty show offers a tribute to the work of Clarence Clemmons in remembrance of his passing.
