SECTION I: Issues Programming

In an effort to promote community awareness and to fulfill its public service commitment and obligation, WXDU broadcasts “**The Endless Frontier,**” and “**WXDU Sports.**” “**The Endless Frontier**” broadcasts the first and third Sundays of every month from 6:30-7:00 pm and is hosted by Ben Cox, who discusses new developments in science research and policy. Ben selects the topics with a particular eye toward current events, medically relevant topics, and research taking place in the Research Triangle region. “**WXDU Sports**” broadcasts the first and third Sunday of every month from 6:00-7:00 pm and covers regional sports events.

SECTION II: Responsive Programs

The issues of importance this quarter include the following:

1. *Community Activism and Involvement* - environmental activism; people of faith in social justice movements; reproductive justice; gentrification and ways to mitigate the damage; protests against THAAD; the connections between Black Lives Matter and the civil rights movement
2. *History* – life of Fannie Lou Hamer; Korean war and the long term impact
3. *Arts and Literature* – the role of art in social movements; Oakland-based artist Fantastic Negrito
4. *Sports* – Duke University men’s and women’s sports and national professional sports
5. *Science and Technology* – role of agriculture in climate change; fossil fuels and changing policy; environmentalism
6. *Diversity and Culture* -- impact of gentrification on neighborhoods
