10/2/23: RAPIDES BURN BAN UPDATE (4PM) - :30 CHECKING IN ON LOUISIANA WILDFIRES -- AS CREWS HAVE NOW BEEN WORKING FOR OVER FIVE WEEKS TO STOP THE FLAMES IN BEAUREGARD -- VERNON -- AND RAPIDES PARISHES.

10/2/23: FIRE IN WOODWORTH (10PM) – :31 THE FIRE STARTED OUT AS A 20 ACRE FIRE AND IS NOW UNDER CONTROL AFTER BURNING AROUND 16 THOUSAND ACRES. THE U-S FOREST SERVICE IS WORKING ON THE FIRE AND AS OF 7-45 THIS EVENING THE FIRE IS CONSIDERED UNDER CONTROL. RESPONSE TEAMS ARE STILL ON THE GROUND, AND A WATER

11/17/23: BURN BAN AND DROUGHT (6PM) – 2:06 THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ANNOUNCED THAT DUE TO RECENT RAINS, FIRE DANGER IS NOW CONSIDERED "BELOW NORMAL" IN OUR AREA. SINCE THEN, SEVERAL CENLA PARISHES HAVE OPTED OUT OF THE STATEWIDE BURN BAN, INCLUDING AVOYELLES, NATCHITOCHES, GRANT, AND NOW VERNON

11/21/23: RAPIDES STORM DAMAGE (4PM) – 1:00 AND WE HEADED OUT TO HINESTON IN RAPIDES PARISH WHERE WE MET DAVID HARPER. HARPER SHOWED US AROUND HIS PROPERTY -- WHERE LIMBS HAD FALLEN IN MULTIPLE SPOTS -- BLOCKING HIS DRIVEWAY. THE WIND TOSSED AROUND MULTIPLE FEED TROUGHS FROM HIS FIELD, SCATTERING THEM

11/21/23: COTTONPORT DAMAGE (6PM) – 1:24 MANY RESIDENTS IN THE COTTONPORT AREA SAY THAT THE STORM DAMAGE WAS A SCARY EXPERIENCE, BUT ACCORDING TO THOSE RESIDENTS, THANKFULLY NO ONE WAS INJURED.
