Section I. Issues

KZMK, KWCD and KTAN have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Food Insecurity, Community Help.** Several organizations in Cochise County have come together to collect food and non-perishable food items to help replenish the local food banks throughout Cochise County. With the ending of several pandemic-era assistance programs, food insecurity has become and increasing concern throughout the county. The Salvation Army, the Legacy Foundation and other local organizations have come together to mitigate the urgent need with a coordinated collection drive.
- B. **Partnerships, Local Military, Local and National Interest.** Sierra Vista and Cochise County rely heavily on their relationships with Fort Huachuca. Local interest in the changes to Fort Huachuca were discussed. The commander for Fort Huachuca, Lt. General Hale discussed the partnerships with local towns and the Fort, and the strategic plan to maintain the fort and its resources.
- C. **Local History, New Juneteenth Celebrations.** Cochise County participated in several local Juneteenth Celebrations, honoring the day with a flag raising, ceremonies and community education on the purpose behind the now-federally observed holiday.
- D. **Animal Rescue, Fundraising.** Horsen' Around Rescue is a local organization that allows horses with medical issues or those who are aging and can no longer be ridden to live out their lives. They raise funds and work with volunteers to see that horses area able to live their lives out in peace. They held a big fundraiser to assist with veterinarian bills, feed, and upkeep of the organization.
- E. **Public Education on Federal Policies.** Federal issues like the end of the pandemic-era Title 42 restriction on migrants coming to the United States caused a ripple effect, particularly in Cochise County. Experts joined the shows and talked about the consequences and expected fall out for these and other headline events as they affect Cochise County and the state of Arizona.
