Section I. Issues

KZMK, KWCD and KTAN have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Youth Services.** The Boys and Girls Club is a well-known organization across the country, including right here in Sierra Vista. Our community is constantly looking for ways to help support the organization and tackle various issues. We used our platform to broadcast weekly updates, help encourage donations to keep community programs afloat, and spoke with several guests regarding the club's impact on our community.
- B. **Women's Issues.** Lori's Place, a non-profit women's shelter was created when a local county nurse realized a cold, clinical hospital setting might deter assaulted and battered women from seeking help. Lori's Place is the only certified shelter with the ability to collected forensic samples from individuals following an attack. The shelter also helps house victims and their children until a more permanent situation can be obtained.
- C. Public Safety. Tim Wachtl, Public Information Officer from the Sierra Vista Police Department appeared on several shows to inform the public of upcoming DUI Task Force details to keep impaired drivers off the road, especially on Superbowl Sunday which falls during the first quarter. We used our platform to also discuss other areas of concern, such as school bus safety and the Good Neighbor Alliance.
- D. **Jail District Vote.** The citizens of Cochise County are going to vote on a proposed half-cent sales tax to support a Jail District. Six town hall meetings are scheduled, which began in the first quarter, where residents will hear arguments from officials on their belief that the county is in need for a new jail.
- E. **Wild Fires.** A wildfire forced evacuations in Elgin, just 30 minutes outside of Sierra Vista. We used our airwaves to share with community members ways to help in the aftermath.
